Washington—The Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service announced today that representatives of the Stewart-Warner Corp. and Local 4911, United Steelworkers of America, have reached complete agreement subject to membership ratification to end a six-week strike at the Corporation's Lebanon, Indiana, plant.

The plant, employing approximately 400, produces mortarshells for the Armed Forces. Details of the agreement were withheld pending membership consideration at a meeting scheduled for 2:00 P.M. next Sunday afternoon at Odd Fellows Hall at Lebanon.

Negotiators for the Corporation and the union joined the Federal mediators in announcing the agreement. The mediators are Gilbert Seldin and Daniel Edwards, National Representatives of the Mediation Service, and Commissioner Jack E. Preston of Indianapolis.
