

PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARYPERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATION1. PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATION

a. During the month of July, 191 officers and 2,109 enlisted personnel joined the Division. Personnel transferred by normal rotation included 103 officers and 743 enlisted. Personnel transferred by service records due to MedEvacs were 130 officers and 507 enlisted. Other personnel transferred by service records included 4 enlisted.

b. Award recommendations to FMFPac: 2 Navy Crosses, 32 Silver Stars, 11 Legion Of Merit Medals, 2 Distinguished Flying Crosses, 2 Navy and Marine Corps Medals, 131 Bronze Star Medals, 13 Air Medals, 61 Navy Commendation Medals and 1 Secretary of the Navy Commendation for Achievement Medal. Approved by FMFPac: 24 Silver Stars, 3 Legion of Merit Medals, 91 Bronze Star Medals, 2 Air Medals, and 84 Navy Commendation Medals. In addition, 1714 Purple Hearts were presented.

c. Casualties sustained during the month included: 237 KIA, 1346 WIA, 15 DOW, 3 NHD, 76 NHI and 0 MIA.

d. Congressional Interest Cases: 188 cases processed, 141 cases completed, 20 cases pending and 27 cases readdressed to other commands.

e. Discharges: 0 Hardship Discharges approved, 10 Hardship Discharges to CMC for decision, 1 Unsuitable Discharge Disapproved and 3 Unsuitable Discharges approved. Pending: 1 Hardship Discharge and 1 Unsuitable Discharge.

2. EXCHANGE SERVICE

a. Sales for Branch 1010 for the month ending 10 July 1967 were \$687,262.57 with an ending inventory value of \$1,181,000.00.

b. The new exchange facility at the 3d Engineer Battalion, Gia Le, was officially opened by LtCol J. H. REID, Jr., on Sunday, 16 July 1967.

c. 1,050 pallets of merchandise were received during July 1967.

d. The Kong Yong Enterprises, Ltd. started construction of their commercial laundry at the Gia Le site.

5. INFORMATIONAL SERVICES

a. The section continued press coverage of the 3d Marine Division activities, releasing 104 news, feature articles and photographs through the Force Information Officer, III Marine Amphibious Force. Also, a total of 1828 home town news released were sent to the Fleet Home Town News Center, Great Lakes, Illinois.

b. A total of 42 civilian news correspondents visited the Phu Bai area during the month, including Mr. Theodore White, author of the book "Making of a President." 234 newsmen visited the Dong Ha area. A new distribution method of the III MAF newspaper, Sea Tiger, has been effected to insure complete distribution of the paper to the maximum number of Marines in the Division.

c. The Radio/TV section turned out a total of 1,119 minutes and 30 seconds of tape recorded for the month. This breaks down to a total of 980 minutes of Fleet Home Town News interviews and 139 minutes and 30 seconds of special features of 3d Marine Division combat actions.

6. SPECIAL SERVICES

a. Recreation Fund Activity

(1) The following items were issued under the "Critipak" Program: Critipaks - 54; Paperback books - 3,600; Writing kits - 2,941.

(2) Sub-Area Coordinator Instruction 1710.1 was published, re-establishing instructions for Col Co Beach.

(3) 460 cases of soda and 290 cases of beer were provided units of the Division under the "Free Beer and Soda Program." In addition, 2 cans of soda and 2 cans of beer per man were issued to every man in the Division on 4 July.

b. Division Education Program. During the month 125 High School GED tests and 72 College (CCG-GE) tests were administered. Testing was conducted in Phu Bai and Camp Evans.

a. During the month of July the band played for several Awards and Change of Command ceremonies, as well as at routine colors functions.

8. PROVOST MARSHAL

- a. The U. S. Army Sergeant assigned from the 29th Civil Affairs Company has been utilized as a liaison NCO with public safety and police officials throughout the area. Currently he is engaged in assisting in preparing a pistol and small arms range for use of all law enforcement agencies in Thua Thien Province.
- b. During the month 4 Military Policemen were medevaced from Dong Ha for wounds received. Two additional Military Policemen received wounds without being evacuated.
- c. 20 special escorts for Distinguished Guests and USO entertainers were conducted in the Hue/Phu Bai Area.
- d. A total of 9 convoy escort details were provided by the Military Police Sub-Station in Hue for convoys passing through that City. No incidents occurred during the period involving the passage of convoys.
- e. A total of 73 cases were opened by CID and 76 were closed. 22 cases are pending. Of the total cases there were 62 felonies; 2 black-market; 15 narcotics; 5 sex crimes and 11 misdemeanors.
- f. The total reported value of property stolen or otherwise missing was \$17,531.90. Total value of property recovered was \$21,791.75.
- g. A total of 23 vehicular accidents were reported in the Division Area, resulting in 1 death, 1 serious injury, and 7 minor injuries. Total property damages are estimated at \$1,089.00. Traffic citations issued during the month totalled 158.
- h. During July, 97 persons were detained and processed as possible Prisoners of War.
- i. In excess of 900 Vietnamese civilian employees are processed through the Phu Bai Pass Office daily. Civilian personnel are no longer permitted entrance to the Dong Ha Combat Base.
- j. The City of Hue was inspected for Blackmarket activities on 2 separate occasions during July. The volume of the blackmarket appears to be at it's lowest point since the Division moved north. Prices dropped somewhat but then remained stable during this month. No new or unique items have appeared on the blackmarket during this period. U.S. made TV sets have never been noted.
- k. A special U.S./ARVN security and honors detail was posted at the Hue/Phu Bai Airport on 9-10 July to provide security for the Secretary of Defense and the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

l. One civilian store was permanently closed for continued infractions and violations.

m. The III MAF traffic regulations and a bi-lingual accident card were distributed to all units of the 3d Marine Division for further distribution to all drivers. The use of these handouts should serve to emphasize the traffic laws as well as to provide assistance in the event of an accident.

n. Throughout the month several conferences have been held with the Thua Thien National Police concerning the effectiveness of their men assigned to Resources Control. As a result, a new Check Point will be established in the Phu Bai Vital Area and will be staffed by a completely new and trained force of National Policemen. In addition, members of the uniform police will be assigned to work as Base Security replacing the present crew and still another police crew will be assigned to provide security for the airport. The completed reorganization should be fully in effect no later than 15 August 1967.

o. Vehicular checks by the National Police continue on both the North and South Check Points to the Vital Area. U. S. Military Police distribute PsyOps literature to all incoming vehicles, when available.

p. During the month numerous conferences were held with Chief LAP, National Police, Hue concerning security of the Phu Bai Vital Area and Viet Cong activity. Through these conferences Chief LAP has continued to supply intelligence information on the surrounding area. Such information is immediately passed to the G-2 for evaluation.

q. The Director of the Vietnamese National Police paid a courtesy call to Phu Bai during the month. The working relationships were reviewed for him and he appeared pleased at all aspects. With the director was an inspection detail. The results of the inspection were highly satisfactory in all regards.

r. The Provost Marshal General of the Vietnamese Military Police conducted an inspection of their organization during the month. The Provost Marshal, 3d Marine Division, serves as the advisor to this organization at the request of the Vietnamese Provost Marshal General. The results of this inspection were highly satisfactory and the advisory relationship will continue again at the request of the Vietnamese Provost Marshal General.

2. The 1st Counterintelligence Team screened 104 persons during the month of July 1967. Ninety-two persons were released as innocent civilians; two were classified as PW, and seven as civilian defendants. The team also interrogated two ralliers for information on VC infrastructure. Sub-teams were provided for all Marine operations in Thua Thien Province, these being Operations CHOCTAW, FREMONT and BEACON GUIDE. Close liaison was maintained with Vietnamese intelligence and security agencies at hamlet, village and district level, along with providing a Staff Sergeant at Special Branch, National Police in Hue for liaison with province officials and U.S. civilian agencies. Sub-teams were also assigned to support Combined Action Companies Alpha and Hotel.

3. The 15th Counterintelligence Team continued to provide general support to Marine Units operating in Quang Tri Province. Sub-teams were provided to 3d Marine and 9th Marine Regiments on a regular basis for direct support in Operations CIMARRON, BUFFALO, WICKORY II and KINGFISHER. Separate detachments also provided support and liaison with GVN and U.S. civilian agencies at Cam Lo District and Quang Tri Provincial Headquarters. Close liaison was also maintained with 1st and 2d ARVN Regiments. The Team processed and interrogated 12 detainees along with preparing and disseminating 17 counter-intelligence reports and 23 spot reports. Black lists of Viet Cong infrastructures continued to be compiled, revised and issued to Marine Units involved in pacification duties.

4. The 7th Interrogation Translation Team provided support for all division operations in the month of July. A sub-team was located at Dong Ha throughout the month for support of 9th and 3d Marines. A sub-team supported 26th Marines at Khe Sanh from 1-17 July. During the month, 141 detainees were screened and classified as follows:

Also, close liaison was maintained with GVN and ARVN agencies in both provinces so that follow-up interrogations could be carried out on detainees obtained by Vietnamese sources.

5. The 15th Interrogation Translation Team arrived in country on 24 July and was assigned to the 3d Marine Division. For the remainder of the month, the Team performed on the job training with the 7th ITT and accompanied MEDCAP operations in Hue for language training.

6. The 3d Interpreter Team provided general support to all operations run by the 3d Marine Division in the month of July as well as operating the Document Translation Center for the Division Headquarters. The

Team processed 50 batches of captured documents, resulting in 55 pages of translation. A total of 146 friendly official documents were translated resulting in 370 pages of translation as well as processing 14 other friendly documents. Finally, the Team worked a total of 169.0 hours in support of Claims, G-1, Legal, PsyOps and 11th Engineers.

7. The 9th Interpreter Team arrived in country on 20 July 1967. Activities for the last 11 days of the month consisted of on the job training with the 3d Interpreter Team, MEDCAP and PSYOPS.

8. The Aerial Observation Section flew a total of 425 sorties for a total of 1,157.3 hours during the month of July. One hundred twelve sorties were flown in Marine aircraft for a total of 293.9 hours. The Army provided aircraft for 241 sorties amounting to 608.8 hours and the USAF flew 72 sorties for a total of 254.6 hours. The section provided general support for all operations of the division by flying missions from Phu Bai, Dong Ha and Khe Sanh airfields. In the 425 sorties flown the following missions were accomplished:

OPERATIONS

1. General. The 3d Marine Division continued operations in Thua Thien and Quang Tri Province of South Vietnam in accordance with assigned missions. Division operations during the month were characterized by increased enemy artillery fire and increased enemy contact in the DMZ area. Major search and destroy operations were conducted throughout the AOR, in conjunction with extensive reconnaissance activity. Enemy forces reacted strongly, in battalion strength, to a USMC battalion size penetration in the southern half of the DMZ. Enemy forces failed to accept combat in significant strength in any other area, except along Route 9 west of Ca Lu in an elaborate ambush position.

SLF A landed in an amphibious assault in Phu Loc area on 21 July 1967. Operations ashore continued with no significant contact until 30 July 67 when backloading commenced.

SLF B landed in an amphibious assault in the Phong Dien area on 31 July 67. There were no significant contacts and operations ashore were continuing at the end of the month.

2. CHOCTAW. Operation CHOCTAW continued with minor enemy contacts, sniper incidents, mine and booby trap incidents until termination on 9 July. Cumulative friendly casualties: 18 KIA and 153 WIA.

3. FREMONT. Operation FREMONT commenced on 10 July upon termination of CHOCTAW. 2/4 continued to provide security for Camp Evans, Hill 51, Phong Dien District Headquarters and radio transmission site on Hill 67. Ambushes and LP's were employed throughout AO. Seismic intrusion devices, TPS-21's, and scout dogs were employed on the perimeter. An active H and I program was conducted. All 2/4 units were engaged in extensive patrol and small unit S&D operations throughout the month. Operations were characterized by continued minor enemy contacts, sniper, mine and booby trap incidents. On 16 July the northern end of Hai Lang pontoon bridge was destroyed by an enemy ground force. The bridge was repaired and returned to normal use by ARVN and USMC engineers the following day. On 20 July, elements of 2/4 participated in a combined USMC/ARVN operation in the My Chanh area with SLF Bravo. 2/4 units initially acted as blocking force and followed up with S&D operations in conjunction with SLF Bravo. These units encountered continuing minor resistance from the same enemy harassing tactics previously encountered. Operation FREMONT continued through the end of the month with minor contact. Cumulative friendly casualties: 5 KIA and 26 WIA.

4. CUMBERLAND. Operation CUMBERLAND continued with minor contact. On 7 July 1/4 displaced to Dong Ha leaving A/1/4 to provide security for the CP complex, construction of Route 547 and the ferry site. Operation CUMBERLAND was temporarily suspended until adequate forces again became available. CUMBERLAND resumed on 17 July upon return of other elements of 1/4. Route 547 and the forward artillery position continued to be improved.

The ferry was replaced by a floating bridge during the month. 1/4 continues to provide security for the CP complex, road construction, bridge site and forward artillery position. Operations were characterized by very minor contacts with some sniper harassment and mortar fire. Cumulative friendly casualties are: 4 KIA and 20 WIA.

5. CROCKETT. Operation CROCKETT continued through the early part of the month with minor contact. Two infantry battalions with normal supporting arms remained assigned to the operation. Operations consisted of defense of the Khe Sanh Combat Base, facilities and combat outposts; extensive patrolling to the maximum range of supporting artillery; and frequent company-sized search and destroy operations. Numerous indications of enemy activity were found. These included the discovery of harbor sites, bunker complexes, rocket launching sites and abandoned clothing and personal equipment. Lights were often seen at night. Reconnaissance teams made minor sightings by day and heard enemy movement at night. Operation CROCKETT terminated on 16 July 1967. Total friendly cumulative casualties are: 52 KIA and 252 WIA.

6. ARDMORE. Operation ARDMORE commenced at 0001, 17 July, and continued until the end of the month with significant contacts. Operation ARDMORE was a continuation of Operation CROCKETT and involved the same mission and the same forces. On 21 July elements of M/3/26 and B/1/26 made heavy contacts to the east of the Khe Sanh Combat Base. M/3/26 was withdrawn from its contact with light casualties but the development of the B/1/26 contact indicated that the enemy forces intended to ambush the Rough Rider convoy that was then proceeding along Route 9. Other contacts during the period were with small size enemy units. Two large enemy defensive positions were found and destroyed during the period. There were numerous incidents of lights being observed during the period and there were isolated contacts by reconnaissance teams operating in the area. The operation was continuing at the end of the month. Cumulative friendly casualties are: 8 KIA, 20 WIA (MEDEVAC) and 8 WIA (MINOR).

7. CIMARRON. This multi-regimental search and destroy operation in northern Quang Tri Province commenced 010001H June and terminated 021000H July 1967. During the last days of this operation the units were in continuous contact and receiving enemy mortar and artillery fire. Cumulative friendly casualties: 38 KIA and 465 WIA.

8. BUFFALO. This operation commenced 021001H July 67 as the successor to Operation CIMARRON, initially utilizing the same forces. The commencement of this operation found 1st Bn, 9th Mar heavily engaged with an estimated 2 NVA Bns. 1/9 units received an estimated 500 rounds of 82mm mortar fire. During the early period of this operation the enemy also showed a marked increase in employment of artillery fires. Friendly forces made extensive use of supporting arms during the entire engagement. On 3 July 67, BLT 1/3 was helilifted into the 9th Mar area of operation. 3/9 (-) and 1/3 commenced a two battalion search and destroy operation in assigned AOR. On 4 July 67, 2/3 was helilifted into the area north of Cam Lo.

On 7 July 67, 1st Bn, 4th Marines minus one company, was moved to Dong

Ha Combat Base as security, relieving 9th Marines of this mission. 3D Marines (-) maintained the defense of Ca Lu, Camp Carroll and Thon Son Lam, conducting patrols in assigned AOR.

During the operation all units located enemy defensive complexes composed of reinforced bunkers and fighting holes. The magnitude of the enemy thrust was indicated by almost continuous engagement with large numbers of NVA and extensive employment of enemy artillery and mortars. The combined action of Marine infantry battalions and supporting arms accounted for 1281 enemy KIA confirmed. Operation BUFFALO terminated 140859H July 67. Cumulative friendly casualties: 159 KIA and 885 WIA.

9. HICKORY II. This operation commenced 140900H July 67 as the successor to Operation BUFFALO. The composition of forces was the same as in Operation BUFFALO with the addition of 1st Bn 4th Mar (-), opcon to 9th Marines. The operations were conducted in a northerly direction from the main combat base areas, Thon Son Lam, Camp Carroll, Cam Lo and Con Thien. The axis of advance carried the units through the same areas the enemy defended during Operation BUFFALO. The enemy employed a proliferation of explosive in the area which accounted for the preponderance of friendly casualties in the 3d and 9th Marines AOR. These units continued to discover extensive bunker and trenchline complexes indicating the extent of NVA infiltration in northern Quang Tri Province. There were no significant contacts with NVA forces in this area. As part of this operation 1st Amtrac Bn, adopting an infantry role, conducted a search and destroy operation in the northern portion of their TAOR. This unit had the heaviest contact with NVA/VC forces, encountering heavy small arms, mortar and artillery fires. During this action 1st Amtrac Bn linked up with flanking units of 1st ARVN Division to sweep through a village complex. 1st Amtrac Bn accounted for 54 of the 57 confirmed NVA/VC killed during Operation HICKORY II. On 16 July BLT 2/3 commenced back-loading to resume SLF mission. HICKORY II terminated 161600H July. Cumulative friendly casualties: 4 KIA and 97 WIA.

10. KINGFISHER. This successor operation to HICKORY II commenced 161601H July 1967. The regiments resumed their tactical positions within their respective TAOR's. BLT's 1/3 and 2/3 resumed their missions as SLF's. There were 2 significant contacts during this period. A unit of 3/3, while on a road sweep, made contact with an estimated enemy battalion along Route 9 west of Ca Lu. The enemy had established an elaborate ambush position along Route 9 in order to ambush a truck convoy enroute to Khe Sanh. The ambush site extended into the 26th Marines TAOR. The contact was violent and continuous with the enemy holding in position.

A battalion size sweep was conducted west from Ca Lu along Route 9 dislodging the enemy from dominant terrain. This was in conjunction with a battalion (-) sweep conducted east along Route 9 from Khe Sanh by the

26th Marines.

On 28 July, within 9th Marines TAOR, a battalion (rein) conducted a spoiling attack into the southern portion of the DMZ. The attack moved north from Con Thien into the DMZ. On movement north, although meeting only light, sporadic contact, numerous unmanned enemy positions were discovered and destroyed. On reaching the Ben Hai River the battalion moved south along the same axis as the movement north. On leaving the southern boundary of the DMZ elements of the battalion came under intense attack. The enemy was deployed in defensive positions employing artillery and mortar fires. Upon reinforcement of friendly elements under attack the enemy broke contact. There was extensive use of supporting arms to suppress enemy artillery fires and destroy defensive positions. Operation KINGFISHER was continuing at the end of the month. Cumulative friendly casualties: 41 KIA and 355 WIA.

11. PHU BAI TAOR. The 2d Battalion, 26th Marines was the Phu Bai Defense Battalion throughout the month of July. One two-company search and destroy operation was conducted in Phu Thu on 18 July. Numerous company and platoon size operations were conducted in the TAOR. There were a total of 12 small unit contacts in the Phu Bai area and the Sparrow Hawk was launched once during the period.

COMBAT AIR SUPPORT1. SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

a. In the Dong Ha area Operations BUFFALO, CIMMARON, and then KING-FISHER were supported by FMAW fixed wing aircraft flying 2,112 sorties and expending 4,270 tons of ordnance. For the same period FMAW rotary wing aircraft flew 4,888 sorties, lifted 3,380 passengers, and transported 487 tons of cargo.

b. In the Khe Sanh area Operation CROCKETT, followed by Operation ARDMORE, was supported with fixed wing aircraft flying 399 sorties and expending 816 tons of ordnance. Helicopters in support of the operations flew 279 sorties, lifted 74 passengers, and carried 56 tons of cargo.

c. In the 4th Marines area fixed wing aircraft flying in support of Operation FREMONT flew 93 fixed wing sorties and expended 169 tons of ordnance. Helicopters flew 590 sorties, lifted 529 passengers, and 33 tons of cargo.

d. Fixed wing aircraft flew 56 sorties and expended 120 tons of ordnance in support of Operation CUMBERLAND. Helicopters flew 236 sorties, lifted 233 passengers, and carried 1.4 tons of cargo.

e. There were 4 Arc Light strikes in the province of Quang Tri and 23 strikes in the province of Thua Thien.

COMMUNICATION-ELECTRONICS1. SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

a. Communication Support Company (-), 7th Communication Battalion, completed the following communication improvements in the Dong Ha Combat Base Area during July.

- (1) Hardening of all communication facilities in the Dong Ha area.
- (2) Installation of air conditioners in the MTC-1 Area Toll switch-board van.
- (3) Completion of underground cable installation.
- (4) On July 25th, a meeting of all Marine, Army and Air Force units in the Dong Ha area was called to explain responsibility of the Area Cable Coordinator. All units were informed that any wire construction outside of CP's was subject to prior approval of Area Communication Coordinator.

2. 3D MARDIV MARS. A total of 623 messages and 3,209 telephone calls were processed by Division MARS stations at Phu Bai and Dong Ha. Of the 3,209 telephone calls processed, 57 were priority/emergencies.

3. Cutover of all 3d Marine Division voice circuits south to the Integrated Wideband Communication System have been completed. Teletype circuits will be switched upon installation of a Tone Pack. Completion is expected by 15 August 1967. Upon completion, the TRC-97 will be available for other use.

4. Cutover of 3d Marine Division circuits north to the TRC-66 between Phu Bai and Dong Ha is now being accomplished. After all 3d Marine Division circuits to Dong Ha area are switched, the TRC-97 will be secured and placed on back-up status.

5. Conferences were held with Division Engineer and Division CEO personnel to finalize plans for the new Division Communication Center Bunker, Radio Transmitter Bunker and COC. Alteration to the original Communication Bunker plans was required to allow for future installation of AUTODIN.

6. A 3d Marine Division representative attended the FLC Electronics Maintenance conference at Danang during 24-25 July 1967. The primary purpose of the conference was to improve Electronic Maintenance support for the First and Third Marine Divisions in the Republic of Vietnam.

7. A MRC-62 radio relay link has been established between 3d Marine Division CP and 12th Marine Regiment.

8. During the 9th Marines displacement to Cam Lo, a MRC-62 link was established between Cam Lo and Dong Ha.

9. BEACON GUIDE. To support SLF "A" during Operation BEACON GUIDE, a MRC-62 Radio relay Link was installed from the Phu Loc area to Division CP.

10. Representatives from III MAF, FLC, 3d Marine Division, 1st Marine Division and 1st Marine Aircraft Wing held a conference to coordinate use of the TRC-97 within MAF.

11. To provide additional/alternate communications channels to Gia Le combat base area and Hill 180, an additional 25 pair buried cable has been run from the Division CP to Hill 180.

12. A limited technical inspection (LTI) of the 1st Amphibious Tractor Battalion was conducted on 4-5 July 1967 by 3d Marine Division and FLSG "A" inspectors to determine the status of Communication-Electronics equipment in the Battalion.

13. PROBLEM AREAS. Accessories for the AN/PRC-25 continue to be a critical item with no immediate receipts anticipated. As a partial solution, accessories for the PRC-10 are being modified and adapted for use with the PRC-25.

PSYCHOLOGICAL OPERATIONS

1. During the month of July the Psychological Operations objectives were:

- a. Support Chieu Hoi program.
- b. Exploit VC/NVA battlefield losses.
- c. Lower VC/NVA morale.
- d. Show strength of free world forces.
- e. Reduce mining and booby trap incidents.
- f. Discredit VC/NVA.
- g. Induce reporting VC activity.
- h. Explain presence of U.S. Forces in Vietnam.
- i. Instill good health habits in the people.
- j. Encourage support of the GVN.

2. Psychological Operations supported all named operations and Regimental TAOR's. The Phu Bai TAOR, the DMZ, Recon Zones and the A Shau Valley were also targeted regularly.

3. The following leaflets by type were delivered by aerial leaflet drops:

5. A total of 195 hours and 35 minutes of surface broadcast was conducted. Waterborne operations accounted for 86 hours and 30 minutes of this total. PsyOps speaker teams working with Coastal Groups 11, 12 and 13 and with the

Thu An Island Naval Support Detachment covered most of the waterways and coast from Phu Loc to the DMZ and along rivers from Thu An Island to Hue and from the mouth of the Cua Viet River to Dong Ha. The remaining 109 hours and 15 minutes were broadcast mainly on the 4th Marines perimeter, at MEDCAP's in the Phong Dien area and at CAP units throughout the Phu Bai area. General themes were music, MEDCAP instructions, Chieu Hoi, GVN helps the people, support GVN, good health, vote in coming elections and what to do when the VC enter your village.

6. A total of 18 hours and 30 minutes of movies were shown throughout the Phu Bai area at the CAP units and secure areas. General movie themes were cartoons, good health, cleanliness, support GVN and films designed to generally instill a feeling of nationalism among the people.

7. Approximately 200,393 leaflets, posters, newspapers and pamphlets were hand distributed during the month. The largest portion of these were the Free South Newspapers passed out by the Military Police at check points and by CAC units.

8. Several special leaflets and tapes were utilized this month. Most significant were a leaflet offering 25,000\$VN for information leading to the location and/or destruction of enemy artillery shelling Dong Ha Combat Base and a classic rallier leaflet with a picture of the rallier and his wife and a hand written message appealing to the remaining members of his VC guerilla squad to rally also. No results have been obtained as of yet from the artillery leaflet. Feedback indicates that several people in the area where the rallier leaflet was dropped would also like to rally but do not know what to do. Arrangements have been made to furnish this information by special tapes and leaflet drops.

9. The Kit Carson Scout Program is operating satisfactorily. Some attrition has been experienced but overall the scouts are being used more effectively and the reporting of their activities is more accurate and detailed. Due to lack of Hoi Chanhs, the Thua Thien Scout Class was not held in July but ten prospects from Thua Thien will attend the August course in Quang Tri. All arrangements have been made in Quang Tri and no problems are anticipated.

LOGISTICS1. SIGNIFICANT EVENTSa. General

(1) Shortage of 81mm HE ammunition necessitated establishment of an ASR (available supply rate) of 17 rounds per weapon per day early in July.

(2) An H-16 maintenance instruction team from III MAF continued to work in the Division area, contacting ordnance personnel at all levels to assist in the inspection and repair of weapons.

(3) 18 M-76 Otters for the 3d Division were received at FLSG-A.

(4) CG FMFPac was advised of the increasing concern of the Division over the shortage of accessories for the AN/PRC-25 radio.

(5) CG III MAF approved a table of equipment for the Combined Action Group Headquarters and directed 3d MarDiv to requisition all required items.

(6) A continuing shortage of sandbags was brought to the attention of ALCON as a significant problem area requiring assistance from higher headquarters.

(7) A special allowance of 4 60mm and 2 81mm mortars was approved for the 1st AMTRAC Bn to assist the battalion in accomplishing its security mission at the mouth of the Cua Viet River.

(8) 5,500 disposable cardboard water containers were received for use in "hot" areas. Their use keeps helicopter time in landing zones to a minimum by eliminating the need to backload empty water cans.

(9) Significant quantities of Class II supplies were moved on a special basis to FLSU-1 to meet urgent requirements of units in the northern area prior to Operation HICKORY II. FLSG-A and FLC were advised that pre-positioning of common use Class II at FLSG-A locations at Khe Sanh and Dong Ha was the only practical stockage policy, and only means to eliminate the requirement for special programs such as the HICKORY II buildup.

(10) Availability of tentage continued to be a problem area, as redistribution of assets and complete drawdown of the few tents in FLSG-A were necessitated by displacement of the 9th Marines CP.

(11) An FMFPac motor transport maintenance assistance team visited units in the northern area during the last half of July.

(12) The 9th periodic FMFPac Logistic conference was held on Okinawa during the later part of July. The Assistant Chief of Staff, G-4, 3d MarDiv attended as the Division representative.

Of the total messes in operation, 10 are permanent type field messes housed in MCON structures and the remaining 41 are temporary field messes. Subsistence support provided Marine Corps, Navy, and Army personnel of this Division averaged 30,800 rations daily. Of the total

personnel subsisted, approximately 87% were subsisted on "A" type rations supplemented with "B" ration items and approximately 13% consumed Meals Combat Individual daily. Meals Combat Individual are being consumed only when operational requirements preclude serving "A" rations.

(f) Division Supply Officer attended conference Senate Preparedness Committed at III MAF on 5 July 1967.

(g) Revised Division Supply SOP was published 6 July 1967.

(h) The following organizations were visited by the Supply Management Team during July.

g. Test Projects. Test was completed on the inflatable pillow on 10 July by 3d Shore Party Battalion and 2d Battalion, 26th Marines. Test results indicated that the idea itself was sound. The use of pillows is desirable for use as pillows, seats, and stream crossing expedients, however, the test items used were completely unsatisfactory as they were manufactured of a material which was too stiff and uncomfortable and leaked air at the stems.

h. New Items of Equipment

(1) Metascope Assembly, Image, Infrared. Provisioning has not been completed. Battalions of the 9th and 26th Marines have not received their allowances of subject items. Currently no units have received the required batteries. A message requesting assistance has been sent to CG, FMFPac.

j. Other Events. Revised procedures for reporting of Deadlined Combat Essential Equipment (FMFPacO 4000.13C) were implemented. Problems were encountered at Force Logistic Command in implementing programming of this report. These problems will be resolved in a reasonable time.

DIVISION ENGINEER

1. During July the Division and Force Engineers in the Division's AOR continued to perform in their combat support role. Continuous engineer support has been provided for all operations involving 3d Marine Division units as well as the 2 SIF's operating within the Division's AOR. Tasks have included construction, minesweeping, road construction and maintenance, obstacle installation and removal, water supply and utilities support. Bunkers have been constructed at Dong Ha, Camp Carroll, Con Thien, Gio Linh, Cua Viet and in support of CAP. Major engineer responsibilities and projects have included:

a. National Route #1. This road extends 148 kilometers through the Division AOR from the DMZ to Lang Co. The road is presently being upgraded by 4 Navy Mobile Construction Battalions working different sections of the road. Resurfacing operations are well underway with the Dong Ha - Quang Tri section and a majority of the Dong Ha - Gio Linh and Hue - Phu Bai sections complete. Plans for the future include the completion of resurfacing and the replacing/repair of bridges with emphasis on replacing the floating bridges at Ai Tu, My Chanh, Pho Trach and Phouc My before the monsoon begins.

b. National Route #9. Rte #9 extends 90 kilometers through the Division AOR from Dong Ha to the Laotian border. The road is open to Class 60 traffic from Dong Ha to Khe Sanh. Plans for the future include the upgrading of the Khe Sanh - Lang Vei section of the road to Class 60. Pre-monsoon plans call for the resurfacing of the Dong Ha - Camp Carroll section of the road and the upgrading and improving of the unpaved access roads to Camp Carroll and the Khe Sanh base.

c. RVN Route 551. This road extends 12 kilometers from Hue to Tan My. Resurfacing is now underway by MCB-3 with about 10 kilometers completed. At the same time the level of the eastern 3 kilometers of the road is being built up 2-3 feet to prevent inundation of that portion of the road during the rainy season.

d. RVN Route 547. This road is now trafficable by Class 60 vehicles from Hue to the Operation CUMBERLAND Fire Support Base in the vicinity of YD 6008. The installation of a 760' Class 60 floating bridge replacing the ferry across the Song Huong was a major road improvement. Continued road improvement and maintenance continues as the volume of convoy traffic increased.

e. RVN Rte Gia Le a Gio Long. This 15 kilometer road is presently being opened by the 3d Engr Bn to afford a more direct route from the Phu Bai Combat Base to Rte 547.

f. RVN Rte 561. Rte 561 extends 13 kilometers from Cam Lo to Con Thien. It is a Class 60 fair weather road; currently 20% is considered to be all weather Class 60. There is a 200 meter wide strip cleared of foliage on either side of the road. The 11th Engr Bn is upgrading the entire road to all weather Class 60 status.

g. Operation CUMBERLAND. A major effort by elements of the 3d Engr Bn and C Co of the 11th Engineer Battalion is underway to clear a Fire Support Base for the employment of heavy artillery to include 175mm guns. Ample area has been cleared for the artillery, an LSA and a strip for CH-53 helicopters. Work continues to improve and enlarge the base area.

h. Division Command Post. The 3d Engr Bn is constructing a new Division Command Post facility at Phu Bai including a large administrative building and quarters for the Commanding General and his senior staff officers. The central portion of the administrative building and the Commanding General's quarters are nearly complete. It is anticipated that the facility will be ready for occupancy by mid August.

2. MINESWEEPING OPERATIONS

a. Daily sweeps of lines of communication are conducted by engineer elements to counter enemy mine efforts. The 3d Engr Bn conducts an average of 11 deliberate minesweeps a day over 35,000 meters of roads and trails. Daily routine sweeps are made of Route #1 in the Phong Dien and Phu Loc areas and from Dong Ha to Gio Linh. Route #9 from Dong Ha to Camp Carroll and Route 561 are swept when required.

3. MINE WARFARE AND ROAD INTERDICTION

a. In July there were 53 incidents reported involving the discovery of mines or boobytraps by 3d Marine Division units. Approximately 215 explosive devices were disarmed or destroyed. Division units reported 66 detonations of mines throughout the TAOR causing 11 KIA and 120 WIA as well as damage to 12 vehicles.

4. MILITARY CONSTRUCTION

a. The 67S Military Construction Funds were made available on 3 July. About 10 days later materials began arriving and construction commenced in both Phu Bai and Gia Le by MCB-3 and MCB-62. Projects now underway will provide 542 - 16'x32' huts, 4 - 500 man messhalls, 23 showers, 24 heads and the necessary water and electrical distribution.

b. 4 requests were submitted for Advanced Base Functional Components (ABFC) in July. Major items requested were 813 huts, 7 messhalls and 75 bunkers. On 12 June, 58 ABFC bunkers of various sizes arrived in Dong Ha. Construction quickly commenced at Con Thien, Gio Linh, Camp Carroll, Cua Viet

and Dong Ha by the 11th Engineer Battalion and a detachment of MCB-1. 6 bunkers were later shipped to Khe Sanh for construction. On 30 July the materials for the 4th Marines cantonment at Camp Evans began arriving at the Hue ramp. Construction will begin in early August by MCB-1 and is expected to require 6 weeks to complete.

5. BASE DEVELOPMENT

a. Siting for the 32d Naval Construction Regimental Headquarters was completed at Gia Le. Construction of the NCR camp is expected to begin in early August.

b. The NSA Public Works detachment who will assume responsibility for facilities maintenance and utilities operation and maintenance within the Phu Bai Combat Base has been established and presently operates the central water and electrical distribution systems. Construction of their facilities and living areas has begun.

c. Space has been reserved for possible expansion of the 3d Medical Battalion facilities and the MP/IRO cantonment near the Phu Bai airfield on land that is expected to be released by the displacement of an 8th RRFS antenna.

d. 31 butler buildings have been completed in the Phu Bai - Gia Le area and work continues on the last 4. At Dong Ha 8 butlers have been completed and 12 are in various stages of completion.

e. Road construction has been delayed due to a shortage of crushed rock. A 200 ton/hour crusher has been located in the Nam Hoa area and will be operational in early August.

6. UTILITIES AND WATER SUPPLY

a. The Division's water needs are served by 13 water points producing 350,000 gallons of potable water a day. On 7 July a well at Gio Linh began producing water, terminating the requirement to transport all water for Gio Linh from Dong Ha. A similar deep well is presently being drilled at Con Thien by MCB-4.

b. The central water distribution system at Phu Bai began supplying non-potable water to all showers in the Division area on 27 July. Early in August the system will become fully operational giving the Phu Bai Combat Base city type water supply.

c. The MUSE (Mobile Utilities Support Equipment) central power system supplying electrical power to portions of the Phu Bai Base from 2 700 KW generators began operating 5 July. By 15 July 3d Medical Battalion and the 4 main cantonments in the Division Headquarters area were receiving all power from the central distribution system.

CIVIL AFFAIRS1. REFUGEES

a. General. The Cam Lo refugee camp continued to progress this month. In Thua Thien Province more refugees were generated in Quang Dien, Phong Dien and Phu Loc districts. During July the 3d Marine Division assisted in transporting food and other commodities for refugees in the Thua Thien and Quang Tri Provinces and MEDCAP teams treated refugees at established refugee camps and assisted GVN officials with inoculations at newly established refugee camps.

b. Cam Lo Area. The 11th Engineer Battalion was tasked with setting up a water system for the Cam Lo Refugee Camp Area. This water system will include a reservoir and some 5,000 feet of pipe and a pump. The 3d Marine Regiment is conducting a daily MEDCAP in the area which is being accepted enthusiastically by the local people. The cinvaram brick machines have arrived and the brick factory will commence operation in August.

c. Quang Diem - Phong Dien Areas. An ARVN Operation, IAM SON 87, generated 684 families (3,957 people in Quang Diem and 376 families (1,576 people) in Phong Dien as refugees during the period of 21-23 July 1967. The 1st ARVN Division operation took place in the "Street Without Joy" area (YD 5642) to (YD 6636). Only ARVN troops were involved in the actual combat operation with the Marine Corps participation limited to logistics support on an as required basis. Ten USMC trucks were furnished from 22-24 July to help transport refugees, their household effects and rice to the area of Quang Diem District Headquarters. The refugees in the Phong Dien area walked to the Phong Dien District Headquarters because of lack of suitable roads in the area. On 23 July two additional Marine Corps trucks were utilized to transport food and blankets to this area. An inoculation team of six corpsmen assisted the ARVN medical personnel at Quang Diem in inoculating the refugees for cholera.

The unexpected willingness of the people to evacuate their homes and bring all foodstuffs with them was due to a recent VC tax assesment (which has not been collected) in the area. A notable lack of young men and women in the Phong Dien refugee group was attributed to VC conscription in the area.

Adequate water remains the major problem in both areas and as a result additional wells are being dug at each refugee location. The GVN refugee service personnel and District Chiefs of both areas are well acquainted with the refugee problems and little U.S. assistance is required.

c. Phu Loc Area. On 24 July people of northern part of Loc Am village in the district of Phu Loc evacuated their homes and moved to the area near the Song Truoi Bridge at YD 967063. Marines of the 2d Battalion, 26th Marines furnished a blocking force for the operation but no other Marine assistance was given. The Phu Loc District chief has requested no further assistance in this area.

2. Operation BEACON GUIDE. During the period 20-30 July a civil affairs team consisting of members of the 1st Platoon, 29th Civil Affairs Company was attached to BLT 1/3 for operations in southern Phu Loc District. The team assisted in census grievance, disposition of captured rice and MEDCAPS within the area of operation. The operation was a success from the civil affairs standpoint in that it afforded an opportunity for the treatment and evacuation of seriously ill villagers and extended some government influence into this VC controlled area.

3. REVOLUTIONARY DEVELOPMENT

a. Thua Thien. The overall 1967 Province RD Plan continues behind schedule. Due to the April attacks on RD Area II, east of Hue, it is doubtful that the 1967 Province RD Plan will meet scheduled goals established earlier this year. The RD program, during July, however, has shown progress. Four of the seven RD teams scheduled to progress to second semester hamlets, have accomplished the transition. The three remaining teams are scheduled to move to 2d semester upon completion of hamlet protective fences. Education programs are progressing satisfactorily. Self-help projects have slowed down due to the second semester changeover and the lack of commodities. Security of the RD areas continues to improve. Three ARVN battalions continue to operate in and around the RD areas and are providing better security. VC activity has remained low for the second straight month with eight VC incidents involving RD cadre. Total casualties for the month to RD cadre were 2 KIA (1 KIA by friendly patrol) and 3 WIA (1 wounded by accidental discharge). RD Area I is progressing on schedule with the provincial plan, all teams in Area I having moved to their second semester hamlets. Areas II and III are progressing.

b. Quang Tri. In the month of July the RD program experienced its most successful month in the 1967 campaign. The two obvious reasons for this success are improved security and increased flow of supplies into the RD area. The coordination between the ARVN Battalions and the RD teams continues to improve with the establishment of an RD Campaign Headquarters. After a lax period of 3 months, when supplies were diverted into the Cam Lo Resettlement area, supplies are again beginning to move into RD areas. The recruiting situation continues to improve slightly with 77 recruits awaiting the next class. A total of 102 recruits returned from Vung Tau in July and 91 on 28 June 1967. There were 4 incidents during July involving RD Teams with the result of one RD worker KIA.

4. DIVISION CIVIL AFFAIRS/CIVIC ACTION

a. Agriculture. Highlight of the civic action projects this month was the delivering of 12 pigs to the Villages of Loc Bon (YD 936103) and Thuy Chau (YD 845172). Completion of the seven pig projects started in June required a trip to Saigon by the agriculture NCO to purchase pigs and their return transportation to the villages. Contracts signed with the village participants in the program stated that 50% of the first litter would be returned to the 3d Marine Division for distribution in other pig projects. This program will be closely monitored.

b. Medcap. A meeting was held at Phu Bai for all MEDCAP teams on 11 July to clarify the areas and insure coverage of the Phu Bai area. Third Medical Battalion agreed to expand their operations into the outskirts of Hue to assist an orphanage and additional people in that area. Several persons at Deim Tu (YD 865160) and Cam Lo (YD 1057) were suspected of having cholera, however lab test indicated they were suffering from severe cases of disentary.

c. Logistics. Civilians were banned from using military aircraft for transportation from Khe Sanh during July. In that road transportation into the area is limited and extremely hazardous, a decision from III MAF has been sought to alleviate the hardship caused by this ban.

Lack of rain during July has caused severe water shortage in some areas. In Dong Ha the 12th Marines assisted in construction of new wells. Wells in Thuy Luong and Thuy Tan Villages in the Phu Bai area were filled by tank trucks on 18, 20, and 30 July. Rice crops in other areas south of Phu Bai appear to be threatened by lack of water. The possibility of blasting holes in stream beds for collection of water is being examined.

d. Youth Scholarship Program. The program continues to progress with 53 students selected to participate. Implementing orders and budget estimates for the program are being prepared. Contributions from various U.S. Army and Marine organizations are being received.

e. Expansion of CAAOR. On 20 July, 2d Battalion, 26th Marines was assigned civic action responsibility for Loc Tri Village in Phu Loc District. Loc Bon village was reassigned to 4th Battalion, 12th Marines and the 155 Gun Battery.

5. PERSONAL RESPONSE

a. During July the Personal Response Program continued to expand. The monthly 2 day school at Phu Bai was attended by 9 officers and 25 Staff NCO's from throughout the Division. The Contact Team visited four units - 1st Battalion, 26th Marines, 3d Engineer Battalion, 3d Anti Tank Battalion, and 26th Marines Headquarters and talked with an estimated 1100 Marines on position from Gia Le to Hill 881.

The Personal Response instruction in the Combined Action Group's indoctrination program was increased to 18 hours. Plans are currently being implemented to raise the number of Personal Response connected subject-hours to seven per class in August.

July saw a number of visitors from other commands within I Corps to observe our Personal Response program.

2. ADMINISTRATION

a. Commander W. E. ARNS, MSC, USN was promoted to his present rank as of 1 July 1967 and was properly installed.

b. A meeting of the senior enlisted personnel in each infantry and separate battalions was held at Dong Ha on 27 July 1967 and at Phu Bai on 28 July 1967 for the purpose of disseminating information to facilitate unification of administrative procedures and to prepare for the semi-annual Navy-wide enlisted examinations.

3. PREVENTIVE MEDICINE/SANITATION

a. On 17 July malaria producing mosquitoes were identified at the MAG-16 area. On a more intensive inspection it was determined that the breeding sights were inaccessible due to the presence of antipersonnel mines in the area. A study was begun by LT JENKINS, Division PMS Officer as to the feasibility of aerial dispersal.

b. Aerial larvaciding of MAG-16 was accomplished on 22 July.

4. UNIT DISPLACEMENT AND ADDITIONS

a. On 8 July 1967 "D" Company 3d Medical Battalion relocated from the immediate vicinity of the Command Post in the Dong Ha combat base to a location east of the Air Force Compound and north of the eastern end of the runway. "D" Company now operates a medical facility with a present bed capacity of 60. There are 04 operating suites presently in use.

b. On 28 July 1967 the MUST Unit #2 was received at "A" Co., 3d Medical Battalion, Phu Bai, and immediately erected in parts for the purpose of determining it's feasibility as a medical facility for a C & C Company organic to a Marine Division. The parts erected for this purpose will add another 40 beds to the present bed capacity of 120, Two (02) more OR suites. With the use of One (01) MUST OF suite and a Neurosugeon TAD from NSA, "A" Company has the capability of handling emergency neuro-surgery cases.

5. DISEASES

a. 3d Marine Division personnel admitted to the sick list by the Division Psychiatrist with psychiatric diagnosis 50, 40 were evacuated, 10 were returned to duty, and a total of 131 outpatients were seen.




