PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATION

1. PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATION

a. During the month of November 79 Officers and 2515 Enlisted personnel joined the Division. Personnel transferred by normal rotation included 102 Officers and 2448 Enlisted. Personnel transferred by service records due to MedEvacs were 8 Officers and 254 Enlisted. Other personnel transferred by service records included 4 Officers and 17 Enlisted.

b. Award recommendations to FMFPAC: 2 Medals of Honor, 6 Navy Crosses, 46 Silver Star Medals, 4 Legion of Merit Medals, 1 Distinguished Flying Cross, 115 Bronze Star Medals, 12 Air Medals, 7 Navy Commendation Medals, and 2 Navy achievement Medals. In addition 305 Purple Hearts were presented.

c. Casualties sustained during the month included: 183 KIA, 1561 WIA, 20 DOW, 16 NHD, 62 HNI and 0 MIA.

d. Congressional Interest Cases: 144 case processed, 99 cases completed, 16 cases pending and 29 cases readdressed to other commands.

e. Discharges: 2 Hardship Discharges approved, 9 Hardship Discharges to GMC for decision. 3 Unsuitable Discharges disapproved, 3 Unfitness Discharges approved, 2 Unfitness Discharges disapproved, 1 Misconduct Discharge disapproved and 1 For The Good of The Service Discharge pending.

2. EXCHANGE SERVICES

a. On 15 November 1967 the Forean Laundry owned and operated by the Kong Yong Enterprises, was opened at the Gia Lo Combat Base. Kong Tong Enterprises is under contract with the Army & Air Force Exchange Service and all transactions are in MPC. Laundry pick up stations have been established throughout the Phu Bai area.

b. 1067 pallets of Exchange merchandise were received by Branch 1010 during the month of November. It is further noted that 167 pallets of the above total were received by motor transport convoy from Danang.

c. On 10 November 1967 the Camp Evans Exchange was moved from a tent type operation to a permanent structure. The additional space provides for a larger selection of merchandise and accommodates a larger patron shopping area.

d. On 15 Nov 1967 an Exchange stocking health and comfort items was opened in the 2/26 area of Phu Bai.

e. On 20 Nov 1967 the 3d MT Bn Exchange was moved from tent type operation to a permanent structure, Sales have more than doubled since the opening.

f. Merchandise Sales for Branch 1010 for the month ending 10 Nov 1967 were \$613,727.85 with the ending Inventory \$1,255,170.53.

3. POSTAL SERVICES

a. During this period all fourteen (14) stationary and mobile units continued to provide service to members of this command. One postal unit, Unit #13, remained inactive.

5. INFORMATIONAL SERVICES

a. 135 news, feature articles and photographs were released through the Force Informational Office, III Marine Amphibious Force. A total of 1,012 home town news releases were sent to the Fleet Home Town News Center, Great Lakes, Illinois.

b. A total of 64 civilian news correspondents visited the 3d Division area during the month. Ten came through the Phu Bai office and 54 worked through the Dong Ha Press Center.

c. The **Rad** TV section turned out a total of 1,045 minutes of tape recorded air time for the month. Of this time part was in home town interviews, part in feature tapes and included 65 Christmas messages.

d. The final check and membership rosters were sent to the 3d Marine Division Association on 24 November 1967. The result of the drive was a total of 9,771 new members for the association.

6. SPECIAL SERVICES

a. Recreation Fund Activity

(1) The following items were issued under the "Criti-Pak" Program during the month: Criti-Paks - 46; Paperback Books - 8900; Writing Kits 6390.

(2) 932 cases of beer and 484 cases of soda were issued under the Free Beer and Soda Program.

b. Division Education Program: During the month 132 High School GEB tests and 50 College (CCT-GE) tests were administered. Testing was conducted in the Phu Bai, Dong Ha, Con Thien, Gia Le, Thuan-An and Cua Viet River areas.

c. Special Entertainment: The following special entertainment was provided to units of the Division during the month.

(1) Jerry Coleman and Tony Conigliero, baseball personalities toured units of the Division on a handshaking tour on 6 November 1967. Units visited included 2d Battalion, 26th Marines, 3d Recon Battalion, 9th Marines, 1st Amphibious Tractor Battalion and 3d Medical Battalion.

(2) "The National Cartoonists Show", made up of three well known comic strip cartoonists, entertained units of the Division in the Phu Bai-Gia Le area on 12 November 1967. Units visited included 3d Anti-Tank Battalion, 3d Tank Battalion, 220th Aviation Company, and 3d Medical Battalion.

(3) "The Communicators", a show consisting of all types of music and made up of 5 male military entertainers, entertained units of the Division on 13 November 1967. Units visited included 3d Engineer Battalion and 3d Medical Battalion.

(4) "A Big Hello from Texas", consisting principally of variety acts, entertained units of the Division on 16 November 1967. Units visited included Headquarters Battalion, 3d Motor Transport Battalion.

(5) The Talent **Explosion**, a military show consisting of all types of music, made up of 5 male and 1 female entertainers, entertained units of the Division at the 3d Engineer Battalion and FLSG-A on 24 November 1967.

d. Division Special Services moved to its new office location directly beside the Division Special Services Warehouse and is now in full operation.

f. A total of 437 messages were sent by the Division MARS Stations. 1232 phone patches were placed to the states; of these, 81 were placed for patients at the 3d Medical Battalion.

7. **BAND**. Normal colors functions were performed and the band was engaged in playing mess hall concerts for various units of the Division. Thirteen appearances were made on the Marine Corps Birthday. The band played at Memorial Services for the late MajGen B. A. HOCHMUTZ, USMC, and for Change of Command Ceremonies on 7-8 November 1967.

8. PROVOST MARSHAL

a. Law Enforcement

(1) The usual Military Police functions were performed on a continuing basis through the month i.e., patrols and security watches.

(2) A total of ten convoy escort details were provided by the Military Police Sub-station in Hue for convoys passing through the city. No incidents occurred during the period involving the passage of convoys.

(2) A total of 82 cases were opened by CID, and 70 were closed. 40 cases are pending. Of the total cases there were 36 felonies; 5 blackmarket, 20 narcotics; and 21 misdemeanors.

(4) The total reported value of property stolen or otherwise missing was \$15, ,60. Total value of property recovered was \$10, 53.00.

(5) A total of 14 vehicular accidents was investigated by this office. Fourteen accidents occurred in the Phu Bai area, resulted in 2 fatalities (Vietnamese); 1 serious injury (Vietnamese); and 15 minor injuries. Total property damage caused by vehicular accidents in the Phu Bai area are estimated at \$2,460.00. The consolidated monthly total for property damage was \$2,460.00.

(6) During the month of November 61 persons were detained and finally processed as follows:

(7) In excess of 1,050 Vietnamese civilian employees are processed through the Phu Bai Pass Office daily. Civilian personnel are no longer permitted entrance to the Dong Ha Combat Base.

(8) The city of Hue was inspected for Black-market activities on two separate occasions during November. Black market volume and prices remain stable.

(9) 19 U.S. Prisoners were detained pending legal processing during November 1967. 16 were Marines; and 3 were U.S. Army personnel.

(10) The three man Traffic Control Points at the Huong Thuy bridge remained in effect for this period. The security of the bridge was assigned to 2nd Battalion, 26th Marines.

(11) Two (2), three man Traffic Control Points were established at the temporary bridge at Phu Bai and at the temporary Nong bridge. Both bridges are located south of the vital area on Highway #1.

(12) Established Traffic Control Points for "Roughrider" detail on 8 November 1967. "Roughrider" detail had created a traffic jam from the Phu Bai Bridge to the Vital Area. The detail was delayed as a result of Route #1, south of Troy Bridge, having been dug up by the Viet Cong.

(13) This office supplied fifty Military Police on 1 November 1967, for the security of the Vice President of the United States during his visit here to Phu Bai. Special security measures were placed into effect two hours prior to Vice President HUMPHREY's arrival.

(14) A security detail of ten men was provided to cover the "Delegates House", city of Hue, during the Vietnamese National Day celebration, on 1 November 1967.

(15) A total of five surveillances were conducted during this period resulting in the apprehension of two servicemen, and the recovery of 103 items of government property.

(16) The inescopes were utilized on a limited basis during this period. Their employment resulted in 35 moving violators being cited.

(17) The Quang Tri Sub-station was activated on 9 November 1967.

b. ANIMAL CONTROL

(1) A positive animal control program has been maintained, resulting in the disposal of:

- (a) Seven Dogs
- (b) Twenty Rodents

c. SECURITY CONDITIONS

(1) Vehicular checks by the National Police continues on both the North and South Check points to the Vital Area. U.S. Military Police distribute PsyOps literature to all incoming vehicles, when available.

(2) Liaison for security of the area is conducted periodically with Major PHUOC, Dong Ha Training Center and Captain MAU Military Security Service, Hue.

d. MISCELLANEOUS

(1) Civil Affairs continues to be a major activity of the Provost Marshal's Office. During the month of November, 10 cases of assistance to Vietnamese were rendered of significant importance requiring over one hours work with each case.

(2) The Provost Marshal attended the Corps Provost Marshal's Conference at Danang on 25 November 1967. Areas discussed were: Marijuana Prevention and Education; Unauthorized Absence Apprehension; Traffic

Violations and accidents; Criminal Investigation; Off Limits and Curfew Violators. As a result of an interchange of ideas between attending **Provost** Marshals, future meetings will be held on a **quarterly** basis.

9. OTHER SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

a. Major General Bruno A. HOCHMUTH was killed as the result of crash of a **UH1E** Helioonter in Thua Thien Province on **14** November 1967. Commrnd of the **Division** was assumed by Brigadier **General** Louis METZGER, USMC during the period 15 November - 27 November 1967. On 28 November 1967, Major General **Rathvon** McC. TOMPKINS assumed command.

b. A scholarship fund, the Major General HOCHMUTH **Memorial Scholarship** Grant has been established. As of 15 December 1967, over \$12,000 had been donated to the fund by members of the Division and other individuals who wished to contribute. The 3d Marine Division Association has agreed to administer the fund on a **continuing** basis and the **proceeds** to date have been turned over to that Association.

1. During **November**, the **Combat Intelligence Section** received, processed and **disseminated intelligence** reports from **Reconnaissance Battalion, Joint Technical Advisory Teams Detachment, Counter-Intelligence Teams, Aerial Observers, Interrogation and Translation Teams, Combined Action Platoons**, regiments of the division, **Military Assistance Command Vietnam, 1st Marine Amphibious Force, First Marine Division Thua Thien Sector, National Police, Hue TOC, photo mission readouts and I Corps Advisory Group**. Dissemination of intelligence was accomplished through **Intelligence Summaries, Periodic Intelligence reports, two daily briefings for the Commanding General and his staff, oral reports and personal liaison**. **Essential elements of information** were levied on subordinate, **adjacent and higher headquarters** to determine **the location of enemy artillery positions and infiltration routes** across the **Ben Hai River**. The **rocket research project** is continuing in the **Dong Ha Combat Base area**

10. TIO Command ~~Chronology~~

a. Two hundred and seven new targets were added to the TIO Target List during the month of November 1967. The targets include Quang Tri and Thua Thien provinces and the DMZ area. A Target Bulletin with new targets up until the middle of November and the deletions from the old TIO Target List was **published**. The target bulletins are **disseminated** to subordinate, adjacent and higher intelligence sections.

b. During November, 587 targets were attacked by TPQ controlled air strikes in Thua Thien Province. The TIO submitted 162 recommendations of which 52 were struck. The TIO published a daily long range target report which included TPQ-10 targets that were struck during the past 24 hours. This was distributed to

subordinate and adjacent intelligence sections and higher operations sections.

c. There were 34 **Arc** Light strikes in the Third Marine Division TAOR and in the DMZ area during November. The TIO prepared the **coordinates** and **intelligence justification** for 26 of these. The **intelligence** for 28 existing **Arc** Lights was **revalidated**. The TIO prepared **coordinates and intelligence justification** for 18 new **targets**, in the **DMZ** area.

d. The TIO contributed input into three updated Special Area **Studies**, **Targets** of a **priority** nature were passed on immediately to the **12th Marines FSOC** to be struck by artillery.

11. Plans and Estimates

a. The intelligence study prepared for Operation BOOTH was updated for Operation **CAVE**.

b. Special Intelligence Study **2-67** was duplicated for **1st** Marine Division files.

c. A report for the 3d Marines **regarding** suspected enemy use of infra red was duplicated for **-2** files.

d. An analysis of the incoming artillery, rocket, mortars and recoilless **rifle fire** for the months of July, August, **September** and **October** in the **Con Thien** and **Gio Linh** area was **completed**.

e. An **update** for the eastern part of **Special Intelligence Study 21-67 (Eastern DMZ)** was furnished to the **unit** participating in **Operation BALLISTIC ARCH**. The western part of the aforementioned study was also updated for a current **operation**.

f. An intelligence estimate on the **O. Bi-Thanh Tan, Song Bo** area was prepared and **distributed**.

g. The **enemy** threat to **National Route #1** and possible counter measures were **enumerated** in a memorandum prepared for the **Assista Chief** of Staff, **G-2**.

h. Thirty charts, ten signs, seven maps and four slides were prepared during the month by draftsmen in the section.

i. The month was brought to a close by the preparation of a presentation from the **enemy's** viewpoint dealing with what his operational planning for the coming **months** might be.

12. **1st** Counterintelligence Team

a. The 1st CI Team screened **194** persons during the month of November. Five (**5**) persons were released as innocent civilians, one (**1**) was an NVA rallier, 186 were interviewed in connection with employment at Phu Bai Combat Base.

b. The team continues to support 3d Marine Division operations within the Thua Thien (**P**) area of operation. One sub-team (one officer, one enlisted and one interpreter) is **providing** CI coverage in Phu Loo District. One sub-team (one officer, two enlisted and one interpreter) administering the **security** program in connection with the hiring of **indigenous** personnel at Phu Bai Combat Base and internal **security**. One officer TAD to Special Branch National Police, HUE City, to conduct liaison with all **U.S.** and ARVN intelligence **agencies**. One team officer is presently assigned as Staff CI Officer.

c. The present team strength is five (**5**) **officers** and nine enlisted.

d. Maintained liaison at **District**, Village and Hamlet levels in Houg Thuy, Phu Loo **Districts**. Liaison continues with U. S. and Vietnamese **Intelligence** and Security Agencies in HUE City.

OPERATIONS

1. GENERAL. The 3d Marine Division continued operations in the Thua Thien and Quang Tri Provinces. Operations during the month were characterized by numerous small unit sightings and contacts. The volume of enemy artillery attacks on positions just below the DMZ decreased significantly. There were few major contacts in the Division area. Operations along the DMZ were oriented to provide maximum support to DYEMARKER.

Operation GRANITE, which began in October, terminated on 6 November. At the termination of GRANITE, control of BLT 1/3, the Landing Force component of Special Landing Force A, was passed to the 9th Marines for operations along the DMZ. Control of BLT 1/3 was returned to CG III MAP on 16 Nov 1967. On 23 November SLF A landed ashore in the vicinity of Cua Viet in Operation BALLISTIC ARCH, to support Division and ARVN operations along the DMZ. This operation terminated on 27 November and control of BLT 1/3 was passed to the 9th Marines.

There was continued increased use of National Route 1 by Marine convoys. There were numerous mining incidents between Hue and Dong Ha.

2. KENTUCKY. Operation KENTUCKY commenced at 010001H November. The 9th Marines with three to six infantry battalions under their control conducted offensive operations in their assigned AO. Action during the first few days of the month was light and consisted mainly of small unit sightings and contacts. On 7 November, at vic YD 102693, A-1/9 while on a sweep from Con Thien, encountered an unknown number of NVA, well dug in. The ensuing action resulted in 14 USMC WIA, 17 NVA KIA(C) and 42 NVA KIA(P).

On 11 November, 9th Marines with six infantry battalions conducted extensive search and destroy operations in the vicinity of Con Thien. This operation was conducted as a continuation of a sweep with three infantry battalions conducted by the 3d Marines to the west of Con Thien. The 1st Battalion, 3d Marines encountered stiff resistance from an enemy platoon on the morning of the first day. The actions of the morning resulted in 1 USMC KIA, and 7 NVA KIA(C). Other than this action contact during the remaining phase of the operation was very light. During the period 17-28 November there were few

DECLASSIFIED

ground contacts.

On 29 November, the 9th Marines with three **infantry** battalions, and in conjunction with ARVN forces to the east, conducted offensive operations in the **vicinity** of the trace between Con Thien and Gio Linh. This was a search and destroy operation to uncover **DYEMARKER position A-3** and to permit construction to start in that **area**.

Con Thien received moderate incoming artillery and mortars during the month. Cumulative friendly casualties for the month were 37 KIA; 216 WIA(Evac), 118 **WIA(Minor)**. Enemy losses were 138 NVA/KIA(C), 167 NVA/KIA(P), 2 POW's and 19 individual weapons captured.

3. **LANCASTER**. Operation **LANCASTER** commenced at 010001H November 1967. The 3d Marines with two **infantry** battalions conducted search and destroy operations **within** their assigned **AO**. There were few sightings and contacts throughout the **month**.

On 5 November, 3d Marines with three infantry battalions conducted sweep operations toward the **DMZ**, along the boundary between 3d and 9th Marines AO to the west of **Con Thien**. There was little contact during this five day operation.

Cumulative friendly losses **for** the month were 1 KIA, 23 WIA(Evac), 6 WIA(Minor). Enemy losses during the period were 1 NVA/KIA(C), 3 NVA/KIA(P) and 2 individual weapons captured.

4. **SCOTLAND**. Operation **SCOTLAND** commenced **at 010001H** November 1967. The 26th Marines, with one infantry battalion conducted operations within assigned **AO**. There were no significant contacts during the **month**. There were few enemy sightings by reconnaissance **patrols**. On 29 November a platoon sized patrol from **B-1/26** received 5-6 incoming mortar rounds in the vicinity of hill 881 south. On 29 November the **USSF Camp** at Lang Vei received 10-15 rounds of **120mm** mortar fire.

Cumulative friendly casualties for the month: None.
Enemy casualties 5 NVA/KIA(P).

5. **COVE**. Operation **COVE** commenced at **180900H** November 1967 in the **Phu Loc** District south of **Phu Bai**. It was originally conceived as a two phase operation to be conducted by the 4th Marines and the elements of three **infantry** battalions, however, operational **commitments** elsewhere in the Division area required that **COVE** be **modified**. Phase **I**, from 18-21 November consisted

of search and destroy operations **conducted** by one infantry battalion with blocking forces **provided by** elements of another infantry battalion. Phase II from 21-26 November, was a continuation of Phase I though **conducted** by an infantry battalion (-). There were no major **contacts**. There were **numerous** small unit sightings and enemy sniper fire. Night defensive positions were attacked by **enemy mortars** on several occasions. Operation COVE terminated at **261200H**. Friendly losses were **1 KIA**, 13 WIA (Evac). Enemy losses were **1 VC/KIA(C)** and **5 VC/KIA(P)**.

6. GRANITE. Operation GRANITE **continued** into November in enemy **Base Area 114** south of Camp **Evans**. The 4th Marines with two infantry battalions and in conjunction with ARVN forces conducted search and destroy operations. During the period 1-6 November there were numerous small unit **sightings** and **contacts**. There were no major **contacts** during November. The operation terminated at **061700H November 1967**. Cumulative friendly casualties were **25 KIA**, **88 WIA(Evac)**, **22 WIA(Minor)**. Enemy losses were **34 NVA/KIA(C)**, **1 VC/KIA(P)**, **47 NVA/KIA(P)**, **7 individual weapons** and one crew served weapon **captured**.

7. PHU BAI TAOR. The 2d Bn 26th Marines with one rifle company **attached** from the 4th Marines continued to conduct operations in the Phu Bai TAOR and **Nam Hoa** area. In addition the battalion conducted numerous **small unit operations** in conjunction with Combined Action Platoons **operating along National Route 1**. Operations were characterized by numerous small unit **sightings** and **contacts** during the month. From 18-26 November 2/26 **provided blocking forces** to the 4th Marines in support of operation COVE. Cumulative friendly casualties were **17 WIA**. Enemy losses were **30 VC/KIA(C)**; **30 VC/KIA(P)**; **1 POW** and **15 weapons** captured.

8. OSCEOLA. Operation OSCEOLA continued through November. The **1st** Marines with two infantry battalions conducted operations in their assigned AO to the south and west of Quang Tri. In **addition** they provided security for the construction of the airfield and facilities at Quang Tri. The first part of the month was characterized by numerous small unit sightings and contacts. There were numerous incidents of encountering enemy surprise explosive devices.

On 11 and 12 **November** the 2d Battalion, **1st** Marines (-), responding to intelligence **information**, conducted a search and **destroy** operation into enemy Base Area 101. The results

of this operation were the discovery and destruction of 17 tons of rice and 300 lbs of salt.

Throughout the remainder of the month the regiment continued to conduct one Company and two Company sized search and destroy operations with numerous small unit contacts. At the end of November operation OSCEOLA was continuing.

Cumulative friendly losses for the month were 6 KIA, 79 WIA(Evac), and 9 WIA(M nor). Enemy losses were 1 NVA/KIA (C), 14 VC/KIA(C), 12 NVA/KIA(P), 17 VC/KIA(P), 14 individual weapons captured.

9. NAPOLEON. Operation NAPOLEON commenced at 010001H November 1967. The 1st Amphibious Tractor Battalion, acting in an infantry role, and with an infantry company under its operational control, conducted search and destroy operations in the Cua Viet Port Facility and supported DYEMARKE projects in their area.

During the early part of the month there were moderate enemy sightings and small unit contacts. During the latter part of the month, enemy activity increased and there were numerous squad size contacts.

On 18 November a patrol from F-2/4 made contact with approximately 50 NVA. The enemy broke contact under heavy small arms fire, artillery and air strikes.

Operation NAPOLEON was continuing at the end of the month with no friendly losses. Enemy losses for the period were 3 NVA/KIA(C), 1 VC/KIA(C), 5 NVA/KIA(P), 1 POW and 3 individual weapons captured.

10. NEOSHO. The 4th Marines commenced operation NEOSHO 1 November 1967, with 3d Battalion, 26th Marines and 1st Battalion, 4th Marines.

3d Battalion, 26th Marines and 1st Battalion, 4th Marines provided security for Camp Evans and conducted extensive patrolling small unit search and destroy missions throughout the OA.

During the early part of the month 1st Battalion, 4th Marines conducted a search and destroy operation along the Song Bo River, locating and destroying enemy fortifications and sanpans.

COMBAT AIR SUPPORT**1. SIGNIFICANT EVENTS**

a. In the Dong Ha/DMZ area Operation **KENTUCKY** was supported by 1,126 CAS/DAS and TPQ sorties during this period. **These aircraft delivered 1,110-tons** of ordnance in these **sorties**. Also, 297 **B-52** aircraft hit 33 targets one or more times surrounding the Dye Marker construction area. During this same time, **rotary** wing aircraft flew 670 sorties, carrying 917 passengers and 228-tons of cargo.

b. CH-53 helicopters once again provided the primary source of logistics support to the Dye Marker effort. On one **day, the** resupply effort moved in excess of **450,000-pounds** in support of the Dye Marker project and its supporting units.

c. Observation aircraft flew **418-hours** performing TACA/VR/artillery spot and convoy escort in this area.

d. In support of Operation **OSCEOLA** with the **First Marines** Regiment, Marine air support by CAS/DAS and TPQ flew 1- sorties and delivered 11-tons of ordnance on selected targets. Rotary wing aircraft flew three sorties in support.

e. In support of Operation **SCOTLAND** in the **Khe Sanh** area, the **Twenty-sixth** Marines received 26 CAS/DAS and TPQ **sorties** expending **41-tons** of ordnance on selected targets. Helicopters flew 160 sorties carrying 339 passengers and **147-tons** of cargo.

f. In the Fourth Marines area Operations **NEOSHO** and **GRANITE** received **151 CAS/DAS** and TPQ sorties, expending 291-tons of ordnance on selected targets. Rotary wing aircraft flew **185** sorties carrying 1,376 passengers and **44-tons** of cargo in the Camp Evans area.

(1) Eight channel system from 3d Marine Division to Shore Party Battalion at Col. Co Beach.

(2) Four channel system from 3d Marine Division Command Post to the Second Battalion, 4th Marines at Quang Tri.

(3) Twelve channel system (by 1st MAF) linking Quang Tri to 1st Marine Aircraft Wing Command Post.

(4) Twelve channel system (ARMY) linking Dong Ha Combat Base to Quang Tri.

(5) Four channel system from Phu Bai to Quang Tri. (1st Marines CP)

(6) Four channel system from Dong Ha Combat Base to Quang Tri. (1st Marines Command Post)

(7) Eight channel system from Dong Ha Combat Base to Con Thien.

e. The Division Cable Plant was increased during November with many additional cable miles laid at Division Command Post and Dong Ha Combat Base.

f. Additional teletype circuits were added with the following:

(1) 60 WPM secure circuit from Division Combat Operations Center to Dong Ha Combat Base Combat Operations Center.

(2) 60 WPM secure circuit from Dong Ha Combat Base Fire Support Coordination Center to III Marine Amphibious Force Combat Operations Center.

g. Most of the available modification kits for new FM Radios have been installed by Division units. **1st Amphibious Tractor Battalion** completed 77 units, **3d Tank Battalion** completed 38 units and **12th Marines** completed nine units. Additional modification kits have been requested from Force Logistics **Command**.

h. DYE **MARKER** activity in the communication-electronics field was considerably increased during **November**. A Communication-Electronics Office field grade officer was assigned primary **cognizance** over **Communication-Electronic** Equipment and training pertinent to DYE **MARKER**. Close liaison with ARVN Units involved in DYE **MARKER** was established and several liaison visits were made. All Division DYE **MARKER** Sites were surveyed for potential use of intrusion devices and the first increment of such devices was shipped to Dong Ha Combat Base for **issue**. A curriculum was developed and plans evolved for a comprehensive Division Level School, to teach DYE **MARKER** Electronic Devices and Radars at Dong Ha Combat Base. This school will become operational in December 1967. **1st Amphibious Tractor Battalion** personnel completed OJT at 9th Marines for Radar Operators to man **C-4**. Division units have already successfully employed **DYE MARKER** Radars and Night Observation **Devices**. It is planned to emplace various intrusion devices for testing at C-2, **C-4** and Con Thien during early **December**.

i. A 3d Marine Division, **Communication-Electronics** Representative attended the Fleet Marine Force, Pacific, **Communication-Electronics** Conference at Hawaii from 27-29 November 1967.

j. Representatives of the National Security Agency presented orientation briefings and demonstrations of the **KY-38** Tactical Secure Voice System and the **AN/PRC-77** FM Radio to 3d Marine Division personnel at Phu Bai on 20 November 1967. **Approximately 250** personnel attended.

k. Problem areas

(1) The AN/PRC-25 Radio situation remains extremely critical. No antennas, modules or handsets were **received**. However, 780 handsets were received at Force Logistics **Command** and **500** of these will be delivered to 3d Marine Division on **4** December. No information has been received on the arrival of modules or antennas. As an interim measure 3d Marine Division requested and received approval of a temporary issue of 122 **AN/PRC-10** Radios for short **range/perimeter** communications. Division units have been directed to requisition these from **FLSG-A**.

2. Psychological Operations supported all named operations and Regimental **TAOR's**. The Phu Bai **TAOR**, the DMZ and the Recon Zones were **also** targeted regularly.

5. There were 214 hours and 45 minutes of ground broadcast and 42 hours of waterborne **broadcast**. **PsyOps** speaker teams working with Coastal Groups 11 and 12 covered most of the waterways and coast from Phu Loo to **the DMZ** and along the rivers from Thua An Island to Hue and from the mouth of the Cua Viet River to Dong Ha. The 214 hours and 45 minutes of ground broadcast **was** in support of the 4th **Marines**, 9th **Marines**, 3d **Marines**, 26th **Marines**, 2/26, 1st Amtrao Battalion and Combined Action Platoons in **Thua Thien** and **Quang Tri** Provinces. General themes were Vietnamese **music**, **MEDCAP** instructions, **Chieu Hoi**, support GVN **good health**, mine and general weapons reward and County **Fair instructions**.
6. There were 25 hours of movies **shown**. Most of the movies shown were in support of a Division better health campaign in the Phu Bai area. General movie themes were **cartoons**, **good health**, and support GVN.
7. Hand distribution of **leaflets**, **posters**, Free South newspapers, and Farm Magazines totaled **228,450,000**.
8. Fifty seven **VC/NVA** rallied through the Chieu Hoi program in Thua Thien and Quang Tri **Provinces**.
9. The 64 Kit Carson Scouts employed by the Division participated in 438 patrols this **month**. A four week English Language school was conducted this month for twelve **KCS's** to **enhance** their usefulness with their **units**. The **scouts** continue to save lives by exposing booby traps, mines, and ambushes.
10. Operation **HEADSHED**, the **Air/Artillery/NGF** slam in the **DMZ** area was supported by leaflet drops and aerial broadcast on 21 and 22 Nov. 8,800,000 leaflets were dropped during the two day period. Themes were Allied Might, Chieu Hoi, NVA lies **vs truth**, and a Chieu Hoi message to the men of **324B** Division. JUSPAO tapes 7 and **8**, **Chieu Hoi**, Go Home or Death, was broadcast on 21 Nov utilizing two 02-B **aircraft**.
11. The 27th Independent **Battalion** was specifically **targeted** during Nov (YD 1466-1668). Prisoner reports indicated that the **unit's** morale was low **from** lack of food and medical supplies and **that the** unit had been hard hit by artillery and B-52 strikes. 1,200,000 Chieu Hoi and Surrender Appeal Leaflets were dropped on the unit.
12. Both the Quang Tri and Thua Thien **Armed Propaganda Teams** were used extensively by Marine units. The **Quang Tri** APT was employed with 3/4, **1/4**, 1/3, **1st AmTracs** and the 1st **Marines** in the Quang Tri and Dong Ha areas. The **Thua Thien** APT was employed with 3/26 and 2/26 in the Phu Bai TAOR and Phu Loc

area. Both **APT's** are being used to conduct face to face propaganda, identify VC, and gather intelligence information.

LOGISTICS

1. SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

a. General.

(1) The combat support and combat service support organizations of the Division were issued the M16A1 rifle on 10 November 1967. They are presently accomplishing final training prior to placing the M16A1 rifle in service. When these units have placed the M16 rifle in service the conversion of the Division from the M14 rifle to the M16 rifle will be complete.

(2) The first monthly logistics conference held at Force Logistics Command was attended by representatives of the Division G-4 and Supply Sections on 30 November. The purpose of the conference was to alleviate critical supply problems through closer liaison between the commands, Force Logistics Command, III AF, and 3d Force Service Regiment. Major command's Logistics Summary Reports were evaluated and discussed in the context of what each command can do to alleviate the problem areas.

(3) The Division received some new motor transport equipment during the month which will aid in solving transportation problems. Included were 16 M54 5 ton cargo trucks, six M52A2 truck tractors, 38 M54A2C drop side 5 ton cargo trucks, and four M543A2 truck wreckers, all delivered 11 November.

(4) Logistics technical/administration inspections were conducted during November as part of the Commanding General's Inspection of Headquarters Battalion, 3d Medical Battalion, 1st Battalion 12th Marines, 2d Battalion 12th Marines, and 4th Battalion 12th Marines. In addition the G-4 and the Special Staff under G-4 cognisance made over 100 staff visits to units of the Division. The Quarterly Division Logistics Conference was held on 11 and 15 November with all Division S-4's attending.

2. Problem Areas.

a. Supply. The shortage of office supplies and stationery continued to create **serious** administrative **problems** within the Division. Shortages of monoblocks for the Battery **BA-451** impaired the communication ability of all Division organizations. Inadequate repair parts support for the AN/PRC-25 radio, multi-fuel vehicles, heavy engineer equipment, and the M422 Mighty Mite continued to create serious maintenance problems.

b. Overtaxed lines of communication presented the greatest logistic problem. All three basic modes of transportation, land, sea and air, were used to the maximum. Each mode had to operate at peak efficiency in view of the high priority programs competing for the available transportation. Construction of the Quang Tri Complex, Dye Marker, and the normal daily resupply continued to compete for transportation during **November**. This month Division convoys continued to augment the transportation assets of **III AF** and **FIC** to provide a maximum transportation effort to Northern I Corps.

c. Services.

(1) Laundry facilities for the majority of the Division were still inadequate. Projected employment of laundry units by Force Logistic Command has still not been realized. The lack of this service is **critical**, especially during the monsoon.

(2) Organizations were still in need of bath units to maintain **their** health and comfort. Although this problem area appeared solved with the increased allowance approved by CMC, the additional units still have not been **placed in** service. Until they are, the lack of bath units will be **critical**.

d. Maintenance.

(1) Short supply of repair parts for accomplishment of second and third echelon maintenance continued to hamper overall maintenance efforts of the Division.

(2) Lack of replacement engines and transmissions for the Truck **M422-A1** continued to result in a high deadline rate for this vehicle.

(3) Shortages of replacement parts, modules, and accessories for the **AN/PRC-25** Radio continued to contribute to a high deadline rate.

(4) Support received from Direct Exchange Programs continued to be unsatisfactory due to **insufficient range** and depth of exchange items and the mechanical defects often encountered in the rebuilt items.

(5) Inadequate maintenance support for XENON Searchlight equipment has resulted in high deadline for this type equipment in 3d Tank Battalion and the First Searchlight Battery. Nearly **all** maintenance on this equipment **must be** performed at 3d FSR in **Okinawa**.

e. Food **Services.**

During the month of November 1967 the 3d Marine Division Food Services Program consisted of 47 operational messes supported by 469 ~~OF~~ 33 personnel. Of the total messes in operation 20 are semi-permanent field messes housed in TSFC structures and the remaining 27 are temporary field messes. Subsistence support provided Army, Navy, and Marine Corps personnel of this command averaged 32,000 rations daily and an average of 9,000 rations per day were provided other U.S. Military Organizations within the 3d Division operating area for a total average of 41,000 rations fed daily. Approximately 13% of the total average rations fed daily consisted of Meals Combat Individual and approximately 87% were subsisted on the Expeditionary Force Menu. The Expeditionary Force Menu is based on MCO P10110.17, Chapter 4, Marine Corps Expeditionary Force Menu (Tropic) and both perishable and non-perishable components are utilized. The Meal Combat Individual is used only where operational requirements preclude serving the Expeditionary Force Menu.

f. ~~Supplies.~~

- (1) The Excess and Cancellation Program totaled 14,390,388 dollars for the period 1 January 1967 to 30 October 1967.
- (2) Increased use of Rough Rider Convoys continued to reduce the backlog of Class II supplies at Force Logistic Command.
- (3) Field Supply Analysis Team - Four arrived on 24 November to inspect selected Division organizations. Formal reports will be made to the Commandant of the Marine Corps by the FSAO Team.
- (4) Increased emphasis has been placed on the use of Red Ball in an effort to expedite the receipt of critical repair parts and major end items. As of 30 November there were 36 items on Red Ball.
- (5) A critipak has been instituted by Fleet Marine Force Pacific to alleviate the shortages of selected stationery and office supplies.
- (6) The Division Supply Officer and Division Supply Management Teams visited numerous units conducting pre-FSAO inspections providing advice on improving supply readiness and providing general supply management assistance.

g. Planning. A plan was drafted and issued for the Rotation of BLT 2/4 to the Special Landing Force. Initial planning commenced for the phase down of 3d Anti-Tank Battalion to zero strength. Logistic sections were drafted for Division Operation Orders in conjunction with the G-3 Section. Initial planning for Planning Directive 1-67 commenced this month.

DIVISION ENGINEER

1. During November, the Third Marine Division received engineer support from a Division and a Force Engineer Battalion, four complete Navy Mobile Construction Battalions and detachments from three additional Navy Mobile Construction Battalions. Additionally, maintenance and utilities support was provided by detachments from Naval Support Activity, Danang. Coordinates below are taken from MAP:Vietnam AFS, Editions 6442 II and 6541 IV, 1:50,000. Major Engineer projects have included:

a. Maintenance of Route #1. The combination of bad weather and enemy action required continuous coordinated effort between Navy Mobile Construction Battalions, Marine engineers and ARVN engineers to keep Route #1 open. Major events included:

(1) 1 November. Three culverts 5000 meters north of My Chanh (YD460400) were destroyed but were quickly replaced.

(2) 2 November. Third Engineer Battalion replaced destroyed bridge at Phu Loc (ZD086007) with 200 feet M-4 bridge. Bridge opened to traffic 1200, 2 November.

(3) 5 November. At the An Nong bridge (YD927103) high water caused a wash out of the south shore approach. During construction no end ramp sections were available to install on this bridge. A timber ramp was installed as an expedient.

(4) 7 November. Two culverts were destroyed 2,000 meters north of the bridge at An Lo. MCB-3 repaired the culverts and the road was reopened the same day.

(5) 8 November. The road south of the Phu Loc bridge was cut by VC demolitions. MCB-74 repaired the damage and the road was reopened the same day.

(6) 12 November. Heavy rains and resulting high water created approach problems to the M-4 bridge at Phu Loc. MCB-121 and the 3d Engineer Battalion made repairs and improvements as required and the bridge was kept open to traffic.

(7) 16 November. The An Nong bridge was closed for repairs. Trestles were installed to shorten the span on the ramps - this will strengthen the bridge and prevent the approaches from washing out.

(8) 25 November. Repositioned pontoon floats at An Nong bridge to allow MCB-121 to place pilings for timber trestle bridge.

b. Maintenance of Route #9. On 1 November 1967, MCB-11 took over the responsibility of route #9. Improvements and maintenance continued throughout the month with the major problem area being west of Cam Lo where the road is badly potholed.

c. Maintenance of Route 561. Upgrading to class 60 continued on Route 561 (YD151607 to YD116701). River run gravel and crushed rock have been applied along the entire road and it is now classed as limited all-weather. Asphalt has been shot on about 50% of the road's surface. Inclement weather made asphaltting impractical during the latter part of the month.

d. Khe Sanh Airfield. Repairs to the runway progressed slowly during the month due to mechanical difficulties with TD-1 tractors and dump trucks. More than 3300 feet of runway was completed by the end of the month with approximately 260 feet left to be anchored down. It was estimated that the work would be completed by the morning of 2 December. The runway was open to C-123 traffic throughout the month. Two C-130's landed during the final week of November although the field was not fully operational for them at that time.

2. Military Construction. The Military Construction pace slowed down considerably during November as many of the larger 1967 S MCON projects were completed during October. Lack of certain construction materials and projected deployment also contributed to the slower pace. The Photo and Reproduction buildings were completed as was the Special Services building. Work continued on the 5th Cantonment of the Phu Bai complex with the completion of all SEA huts. Work is still in progress on the messhall and showers. The 1967 MCON program is completed except for some recreation facilities, water and power distribution, 25,000 SF of billeting, messing and administrative space and the Butler building. MCE-10 continued to build TSFC huts and messhalls in Dong Ha, completing 41 SEA huts and one 250 man messhall. Work is progressing on the Hu Lai Water Filtration Plant.

3. Base Development. The Naval Support Activity, Danang Real Estate Office has initiated procurement action for 190,000 square meters of land at Phu Bai for a new trash dump. Work continued on the Lang Tri complex with the erection of three hangars. A total of 48 SEA huts have been constructed at Lang Tri.

4. Combat Operations

a. Minesweep Operations. Division units conducted 389 visual/deliberate sweeps covering a total of 1,927,400 meters of routes 1, 5, and 561. In the process, these units discovered and destroyed 3 anti-personnel mines, 11 anti-vehicular mines, and 36 improvised mines that ranged in size from friendly and enemy grenades to 250 pound dud bombs.

b. Tunnel Teams. Negative report.

c. Enemy Facilities Destroyed. A total of 10 sampans and 25 bunkers were destroyed during the month as well as enemy clothing, 782 gear, and medical supplies destroyed on operation Neosho.

d. Combat Support

(1) The 3d Engineer Battalion provided one engineer platoon of CON to 1st Battalion, 26th Marines throughout the month. Nine platoons were in general support to infantry battalions.

Convoy support was provided by engineer mine sweep teams and demolition teams were employed during the month on infantry operations.

(2) The 3d Shore Party Battalion supported ISA's and HST's on ten separate combat operations. Elements of the Battalion conducted 14 mechanized patrols and 6 foot patrols, and established 9 ambush sites and one listening post. In addition, a 15 man security detail was provided for the LCU ramp at Dong Ha and bridge security at Thuan An Bay.

Lye Marker. During the month of November, construction commenced on site A-J, C-3 and C-4. Forty-two additional bunkers were authorized for C-1. Artillery positions at C-1. III FAF approved the deletion of the C-4 elements of shifting C-4 unacceptable e-C positions coverage and movement after installation. Triple strand concrete wire was used at A-2 and A-3 in lieu of banded steel tape. A total of 126 bunker shells were constructed. 7110 meters of wire were placed and 14,841 meters of wire employed during the reporting period. The top course of concrete at A-1 was completed and 3,400 meters of asphalt was completed. The 11th Engineer Battalion has been the principal construction force for Lye Marker, augmented by elements from Mobile Construction Battalion 10 and 11.

1. Refugees

a. Operation LAM SON **140** was conducted by the **1st ARVN** Division to relocate refugees from the "Street Without Joy" area to refugee camps near the Phong Dien and Quang Dien District Headquarters in Thua Thien Province. The Operation was executed in two phases, military operations and refugee evacuation, during the period 2-7 November 1967. It was conducted entirely by the GVN with the exception of some logistics support by the **3d Marine** Division. A total of 3,998 refugees were resettled at Phong Dien and 414 refugees were moved to Quang Dien.

b. Refugees were given medical checks, refugee cards and 300 piasters each and were fingerprinted when they initially came into their new camps. A census was also taken. It was planned to settle them in temporary shelters for one month. This was to give them a chance to get settled, organized and to construct frames for their new homes. Upon construction of the frames, tin was to be delivered to the camp and to be installed on the houses. Each refugee was then to be given 5000 piasters to help him begin his new life.

c. Logistical support provided by the **3d Marine** Division included the following:

(1) Movement of supplies and equipment which were pre-staged at the new refugee camps on 29 October, 1 and 3 November 1967. A total of 8,000 rice bags, 5 tons of rice, 25 resettlement kits, 15 tool kits, 1,500 sheets of roofing tin, 1 ton of dried fish, 9 cases of paper blankets and 16 tents were transported on **3d Marine** Division vehicles on the three dates for pre-staging.

(2) 20 trucks of the **3d Marine** Division were utilized on 3 November 1967 to move refugees from their homes to their resettlement locations.

(3) On 9 November 1967, 10 Marine Corps vehicles transported 20 pallets of roofing tin (6,800 sheets) and 3 boxes of paper blankets.

(4) 96 bags of cement to be used for constructing wells at the new refugee camps were delivered on 20 November 1967.

(5) 6 pallets of tin roofing were moved by 2 Marine Corps trucks to Phong Dien on 28 November 1967.

(6) 4 latrine covers and concrete tile for well construction will be delivered by our vehicles to Phong Dien on 1 December 1967.

(7) A **MEDCAP** Team from the 4th **Marines** assisted the RYN Provincial Medical Team in giving **mass inoculations** for tetanus, cholera, plague and typhoid to the **refugees**

d. Division **PsyOps** also supported **LAM SON 140** by dropping 250,000 leaflets on the "**Street Without Joy**" **area**. **JUSPAO** broadcasts were also **utilized** in the **area**. As a result of this **effort**, 39 refugees voluntarily left the "**Street**" on 2 November 1967. They walked to the new refugee camps **carrying** as many of their possessions as they **could**.

e. A new platoon, the **8th**, of the 29th Civil Affairs Company (U. S. **Army**) was formed and attached to the 3d Marine Division on 20 December 1967. It was located at Camp **Evans** and assigned in **direct** support of the 4th **Marines**. One of the primary tasks assigned by the **Commanding Officer**, 4th **Marines** is to take **followup action** at the **Phong Dien** refugee camp to assist the Vietnamese **Provincial** Refugee Service in bettering the life of the **refugees**.

2. Revolutionary Development

a. Thua Thien Province

(1) The RD Program in the Province **continues** to remain on schedule with the 1967 RD Plan. **Projects** are being completed or are almost completed. Sufficient quantities of **commodities** are available to meet project completion **deadlines**.

(2) **Military** support for the RD **Priority** Areas **continues** to be adequate. The three battalions of the **1st** ARVN Division are providing good general security for the RD progra, **Enemy** activity against the RD Cadre Teams **during** November sharply decreased **from** activity during the previous month. This was the lightest reported enemy **activity** in the Province's RD areas during any month of 1967. Five enemy contacts in the RD area in November resulted in one **PF KIA**, one civilian WIA and three **VC** KIA.

(3) The RD Cadre Teams showed modest overall effectiveness in the area of project building. **However**, their results in the more subtle areas, such as effective elimination of the **VC** infrastructure and the establishment and motivation of working, popular associations were only fair. The problem in the latter area is that RD Cadre are inexperienced and unable to stress the importance of these associations to the people or **among** themselves. It is hoped that the planned in-Province training course will improve this deficiency.

(4) The attitudes of the people remain very good. Hamlet inhabitants are interested and actively **participating** in hamlet affairs.

The relationships between GVN officials and the RD Cadre Teams are good on both the **Provincial and District levels. The more effective** leadership on the District level has already been reflected in the improved performance of the RD Cadre. Provincial level officials in Thua **Thien/Hue** are considered to possess a relatively high degree of professional ability. This is usually **true when** the officials are performing their prescribed duties or when specifically instructed by the Province Chief. However, these **officials** are generally not responsive to the needs and aspirations of the people in terms of aggressively seeking out needed improvements and developing solutions for these needs.

(5) All phases of the 1968 Province **RD planning** were conducted in an orderly and systematic manner by the Vietnamese Provincial **staff**. The tentative plans were presented to the Division and Corps Commanders and were approved without change. The 1968 RD **Plan genuinely** builds on the 1967 RD areas, concentrates on the **Province's** population - economic - strategic centers and is modestly ambitious **in** extent. It is further designed to carry the RD effort to the borders presently under the effective control of the enemy and will permit **an R thrust** into **those** areas during 1969.

b. **Quang Tri Province**

(1) The Province's 1967 goals **for** RD were revised downward by the Central RD Council in Saigon on 15 November 1967. This was **justified** on the grounds that the DMZ refugee resettlement effort in Quang Tri Province during **May-June** 1967 diverted RD energies and commodities so much that the original RD Program could not be fulfilled. As a result, the RD Program in the Province is now on schedule with the revised plan as of 30 November 1967. The revised program should be completed by 31 January 1968. Although the Province will not achieve the original statistical goal, the improved socio-political atmosphere in the Province as a result of **the** 1967 RD efforts is exceeding all expectations.

(2) The security situation continued to improve, in spite of one VC raid on a refugee **resettlement** area, during November. The **performance** of the RVNAF also improved. **Cordon/Search Operation Q.T. 25** against **Nhu Le** and Thuong Phuoo hamlets in **Mai Linh** District was especially **successful**. Sector troops and **PFF** using **ICEX** target folders arrested 22 Viet Cong Cadre and killed three VC guerillas. In addition, two Provincial level committee VC Cadre came into RVN control; one was captured and the other rallied under the Chieu Hoi Program. Further evidence of the improved security situation was demonstrated by the sharply increased number of Chieu Hoi ralliers; 23 Hoi Chanh in November compared with 17 in October and a monthly average of 12 for the first nine months of 1967. Another indicator in security progress was that only two terrorist **acts** were committed against the **Province's populace**, other than the detonation of enemy land mines on **major** routes of **communication**. The **1st ARVN** Regiment performed well in support of RD and pacification. **ARVN** units achieved or exceeded their support missions in every respect.

(3) The functioning of the Provincial **RD Control Group** was seriously disrupted by **factionalism** and alleged petty **corruption**. Regardless of the latter charges against Kajor Luy, The RD Group Leader, and his pre-occupation with his political interests, **he has instituted many** ~~RD~~ **improvements** in the RD Cadres. The effectiveness of the RD Cadre Teams varied from one team to another with the degree of success depending on the initiative and zeal of the RD **Teams** and the **adequacy** of the security and protection forces.

(4) The attitudes of the people improved markedly. "Town **Meetings**" convened for old and new RD hamlets continued to be popular with the people. The new **spirit** in the Province was indicated by the **enthusiasm** with which local government **officials**, RD Team **Leaders**, and Provincial Technical Service Chiefs entered into **the public** review of the 1967 RD **Program** and the discussion of the 1968 RD and Pacification **programs**. The people were shown positive evidence that the **GVN** would provide the people protection. One measure taken by the **GVN** in this regard during November was the addition of Thong Xa Hamlet, in **spite** of its strong **VCC** history, to the list of RD hamlets. **Such actions** plus the presence of additional 3d Marine Division units in **Quang Tri** Province have given the people a greater sense of security.

3. Division Civil Affairs/Civic **Action**

a. Agriculture

(1) IR-8 Rice. This is a high yield, short-stemmed rice that was very successfully introduced in the Philippine Islands and is now the **major** variety of rice in that nation. IR-8 rice **is** now undergoing an extensive experimental test in large fields in the Delta region of IV Corps, South **Vietnam**. IR-8 rice projects have been started in four **small** fields in Huong Thuy District of Thua Thien Province in the 3d **Marine** Division CAAOR. This rice has a different taste than the varieties normally grown by **Vietnamese** farmers and preferred by Vietnamese consumers. However, this disadvantage is heavily outweighed by the fact that IR-8 rice produces two to three times the amount of rice yielded by the current varieties of rice grown in Vietnam.

(2) Pig Projects. A total of 10 pigs are **being** raised in six pig projects now underway in **Thua Thien** Province. All of the pigs, except for three other pigs in Loc Bon Hamlet that died apparently of **pneumonia**, are doing very well. The three dead pigs will be replaced from the first litter of pigs produced by pig projects in the Thuy Chau Hamlet area.

b. **MEDCAPS**. A total of 48,590 Vietnamese patients were treated at **MEDCAPS/DENTCAPS** during November. This was an increase of about 2,425 from the 46,165 **MEDCAPS** in October.

c. **Food for Work**. The Food for Work **Program** sponsored by CORDS (USAID) continues to **offer** employment to Montagnard (Brou) families in the **Khe Sanh** area. 4,000 lbs. of rice were delivered to the 26th **Marines** at **Khe Sanh** during November to pay the Brou workers. An average of about 50 Brou per day were **employed** by the 26th Marines.

d. **Logistics.** The quantity of **commodities** issued by the Division G-5 Warehouse to units in support of **Civic** Action programs during November increased **approximately 50%** over **tober**. 15,422 items were issued in November versus 9,558 items **in** the previous month. The November **total** included 1,242 bags of cement, 465 sheets of **tin**, 7,650 bars of soap, 190 assorted books, 14 blackboards, 15 boxes of powdered milk, 4,000 rice bags, 3 boxes of clothing, **38** pieces of lumber, 110 sewing kits and 1,100 school **kits**.

e. **Public Health.** The School Health **Education** Program that was initiated in October 1967 is progressing well and all of the films are being enthusiastically received by the students and teachers. 2,985 children viewed the films at six **different locations** in Thus Thien Province during the month of **November**.

f. Third **Marine** Division **Vietnamese Scholarship Program.** During November, 114 students of Thua **Thien Province** and 9 students in Quang **Tri** Province received benefits from the **scholarship** fund for which a total of about **170,000 \$VN** was expended. These funds assisted the students in buying books, lunches and **uniforms** and helped defray their transportation, tuition and boarding **expenses**.

g. Personal Response Program.

(1) This is a systematic **effort to** establish a rapport between Americans and the people of **Vietnam**. Its objective **is** to achieve **ac-**ceptance of each **group** by the other **in order** to further the **accomplishment** of our mission in Vietnam. **Formal and informal instruction** in **Viet-****namese** history, culture and religions is presented during unit visits by the Third Marine Division Contact **Team and in** a formal two-day Division Personal Response Course conducted monthly at Phu Bai.

(2) The following Personal Response **instruction** was given during **Novembers**

(a) A total of 1,704 personnel (**133** officers, 189 **SNCOs** and **1,382** other enlisted) received **instruction during** 41 hours of formal school presentations and 14 hours at field **lectures**.

(b) The formal **schools** lectures included instruction at the CAG **School**, 4th Marines' Regimental **CO School**, the **3d Reconnaissance** Battalion Indoctrination Course, **the Division SMO** Leadership Course and the Division Personal Response **Course**.

(c) 21 officers, 21 **SNCOs** and 4 other enlisted personnel attended the Division Personal Response Course conducted at Phu Bai from 6-7 November 1967.



SUBJECT: Personnel (G-1)

I. **PURPOSE:** To advise staff members on the status of personnel strengths and discuss other manpower areas within the 3d Marine Division.

II. **SCRIPT:** This briefing will concern itself primarily with a discussion of allocation of Division personnel assets. The strength figures are as of midnight 23 November 1967.

We have allocated the 2d Qtr FY68 M/L of 1219 officers and 22621 enlisted assigned to us by CG, FPac in the following manner:

The fighting elements of the reinforced Division have been allotted 76.5% of the personnel spaces; this has been further allocated so that the ten infantry battalions and 3 regimental headquarters were assigned 12,767 spaces which represents 53.7% of our authorized strength; the combat support elements of artillery, tanks, anti-tanks and reconnaissance battalions received 5434 spaces which is 22.8% of the Division; the combat service support elements of the engineer, motor transport, shore party, medical and amphibian tractor battalions were allocated 4,002 spaces which represent 16.8%; and the Division Headquarters Battalion has been allocated 1555 spaces which is 6.5% of the total.

For a comparison of how the on-board personnel are actually assigned see enclosure (1). The Division is currently in the severe personnel shortage that has been expected for sometime, but which we believe will be progressively met throughout December and January. Even now the infantrymen replacements are arriving in increasing numbers and the soft skills will build up rapidly. Headquarters Battalion shows proportionately out of strength in the comparison. The continued heavy requirement for command and control elements and combat base camp activities at the various locations in the Division area has not allowed us to reduce the on board strength of this battalion. We are in the process now of making some significant changes in the M/L to account for those functions and to align the plan more closely with the distribution that has evolved under the pressures of continued operations. Until this past week the heavy emphasis on engineer efforts and movements of supplies and material required us to keep those service support units at an appreciably higher percent strength than the combat elements. The recent loss of large numbers of engineer and motor transport personnel who arrived as a body last year has reduced this

imbalance and we anticipate having the infantry, combat support and service support organizations remain evenly balanced during the winter build up.

In the past five months our on board strength has varied from a high of **100%** and low of **92%** for officers as compared to M/L and a high of **108%** and low of **89%** **enlisted**. These Division strengths, when translated to rifle company strengths, show the average of the forty Division rifle companies as having **4.7** officers and **193.5** enlisted on the rolls with **4.4** officers and **167.2** enlisted being available for foxhole **duty**. Enclosure (2) is an updated recapitulation of average non effective personnel on the Division (Rein) **rolls**.

We have skill shortages in the Division. Until recently these skill shortages were primarily those in the technical fields of electronics repair, intelligence **specialists**, artillery fire controlmen and senior grade operational communication. In the past month shortages have developed in practically all areas where experience is a major contributing factor for developing competent **NCO's**. The senior grade enlisted infantrymen, engineer, artillerymen, are **all** in a short status. We have advance **notice** that over 3000 Marines will arrive in December to replace the 1600 due to **rotate**. This influx, even though not sufficiently heavy in the higher enlisted grades will give substantial relief for all Division **units**.

Our rotation policies are those as prescribed by CG, **FMFPac** and CG, III MAF. Rotation flight seats are requested for each Marine on or about his 390th day since departing CONUS and if he is assigned to a unit with a **combat** mission he is removed from the active combat area five days prior to his flight seat date and processed in a more secure **rear**. Our policy is to rotate each man as he becomes eligible for return to CONUS regardless of **grade**.

The rotation problems of this past fall have been **resolved**. An even flow of returning plane seats has allowed us to schedule and carry out a plan which meets the policy stated above.

The Division participated last spring in a combined effort with **st** MarDiv to request changes to the M-Series **T/O**. This consensus produced, with CG, **FMFPac** concurrence, a provisional series **T/O** for units of a reinforced Division operating in the Vietnam **environment**. We have no word as to the status of that

request; however we are currently undertaking another analysis of the adequacy of even the provisional tables to properly man our units in consideration of the mission that has evolved for this Division in the past six months. In most cases we have had to come to grips with command and control problems and to more adequately man the combat base supporting functions of PX, Clubs, and Military Police.

We continue to use the RSI quotas assigned to us and feel the special leave program in connection with tour extensions offers a definite advantage. We have already approved well over 250 special leaves over the coming Christmas holidays for men eligible to extend at that period.

In summary we are in the lean time of personnel in WestPac. We recognize this fact and have done everything in our power to live with it knowing remedial action is being taken. We shift our personnel assets to utilize each man's skills for the good of the Division.

SUBJ: Intelligence Briefing (G-2)

I. PURPOSE: To brief subcommittee on **the** enemy situation in the Third Marine Division area of responsibility.

II. SCRIPT:

The Third Division area of operations (AO), stretches from Phu Loc on the south to the DMZ on the north - approximately 80 **miles**. From Laos on the west to the South China Sea on the **east**, averaging 40 miles in **width**. The area can be divided into four geographic regions as follows: the **coast, lowlands, piedmont** and jungle **highlands**. The area encompasses nearly all of the two northern provinces - Quang Tri Province with a civilian population of about 270,000; and Thua Thien Province with a civilian population of about **550,000**. Highway No. 1 is the major artery linking north and south - a length of 86 **miles**. Highway No. 9 is the major east-west artery and connects Dong Ha with the Laotian border, a distance of about **50 miles**. Route 561 between Cam Lo and Con Thien is also a **critical location**.

There are two types of warfare being conducted in the division AO. In the DMZ we are confronted with an aggressive, well organized military force - the NVA (North Vietnamese **Army**). These NVA regiments conduct offensive operations seeking to overcome our strong **points**. The tactics are based on the procedure of pushing their battle positions forward combined with **mortar, artillery** and rocket fire, in an attempt to encircle and bring pressure to **bear**. He progressively digs in as he moves **forward**. He is **skillful** at striking at small forces in an attempt to **cut** off or overcome these **elements**. He is well organized, **equipped**, tenacious and **organizes** his defensive positions **well**. We know we have hurt him badly in the last two months with our offensive operations and supporting **fires**. He has withdrawn part of his forces back across the Ben Hai **River**. **However, he** still holds substantial forces in the eastern DMZ, to the south of the Ben **Hai**.

Turning our attention to the area south of the **Cua Viet** River. The majority of the Main Force Battalions are deployed in the lowlands to the east of Route **1**, with the mission of rice **collection**, interdiction of Route **1**, and population **control**. Rice or other food obtained usually finds its way to Base Areas such as 101 or 114 where the **VC/NVA** conduct **training**, set up base camps **etc**. Reports indicate that the percentage of NVA soldiers in the Main Force Battalions has increased up to **70%**, as the enemy places more reliance on infiltration from the north rather than recruitment in the **south**.

The assimilation of a large number of NVA from the north has raised several **problems** for the **enemy**. He lacks intimate knowledge of the terrain and local **people**, and he finds it more difficult to fade into the country **side**. These factors combined with our aggressive ambushes and sweeps have exacted a heavy toll on the enemy in the **last** several **months**.

In **summary**, we can expect that the enemy will: maintain activity in the DMZ; continue harrassment efforts in the coastal areas; try to interfere with the R&D **effort**; and interdict our lines of **communications**.

SUBJECT: **Disposition of forces**, combat operations and training of 3d Marine Division

I PURPOSE: To show disposition of 3d Marine Division forces and to outline briefly current and proposed combat operations, as well as to comment on Division training programs.

II. SCRIPT: Forces currently assigned to the 3d Marine Division include 5 infantry regimental headquarters, 13 infantry battalions, 9 battalions of artillery and 2 separate artillery batteries. Historically, this is the largest Marine division ever organized under one commander. Presently, the Division is engaged in 6 continuing operations and conducts numerous special operations.

Beginning at the southern tip of our TAOR lets look at our current operations:

Phu Bai TAOR. One infantry battalion with an artillery battalion in support operates in the Phu Bai TAOR to keep the area clear of enemy forces and defend the vital airfield, Division Headquarters and artillery facilities. Additionally, the battalion is responsible for protecting highway #1 from Phu Bai to Phu Loc and for closing the infiltration routes into the populated coastal area.

Operation NEOSHO. One regiment, the 4th Marines, with two infantry battalions and an artillery battalion, conducts search and destroy operations in the Co Bi Thanh Tan area and vicinity.

Operation OSCEOLA. One regiment, the 1st Marines, with two infantry battalions and an artillery battalion, conducts search and destroy operations in the Quang Tri area and provides security for the new airfield complex under construction.

Operation KENTUCKY. One regiment, the 9th Marines, with **four** infantry battalions and a large portion of a reinforced artillery regiment are committed to conventional warfare in the Cam Lo - Dong Ha - Con Thien area just south of the DMZ. Separate from KENTUCKY but conducted by forces assigned to that operation is Operation HIGHRISE. This is a program lery fires into the DMZ.

Operation LANCASTER. One regiment, the 3d Marines, with two battalions and supporting artillery maintain security of Route #9, destroys enemy forces in the area, and blocks infiltration from the north and west.

Operation SCOTLAND. One regiment, the 26th Marines, consisting of one infantry battalion and supporting artillery, operates in the Khe Sanh area to destroy NVA/VC forces and block infiltration from the North.

Operation NAPOLEON. One battalion, the 1st Amphibious Tractor Battalion reinforced with one rifle company, conducts operations in northeastern Quang Tri Province. Mission assignment includes responsibility for security and command and control functions at anti-infiltration position C-4 and Cua Viet port facility; surveillance and reconnaissance, search and destroy operations, and support of US ARVN forces defending anti-infiltration position A-11

RECONNAISSANCE. The Division Reconnaissance Battalion augmented by a Force reconnaissance company conducts an active surveillance screen to the west of Phu Bai, NEOSHO, OSCEOLA, and throughout the northern area, observing avenues of approach and calling supporting arms fire on groups of enemy when sighted.

You will note that our posture acts as a screen for the heavily populated coastal areas and we believe that the enemy must get his food from the coastal plain.

SPECIAL OPERATIONS⁴ In addition to our continuing **operations**, the 3d Division conducts numerous special operations. Many of these are in conjunction with the 1st ARVN Division, a truly professional and aggressive unit. Excellent rapport exists at every level of command and is **conducive** to mutual **respect**, cooperation and **support**. Examples of **special** operations planned in the near **future** are

A two battalion operation northwest **of** the Rockpile (THON SON LAM), designed to provide security to Route #9 between Camp Carroll and Ca Lu; **interdict** known and suspected **enemy** infiltration routes; capture caches; obtain intelligence and destroy the enemy.

A two battalion operation west of Ca Lu and north of Route #9 designed to open and maintain security of Route #9 between Ca Lu and Khe Sanh, and to **achieve** the ancillary objectives as stated for the previous **operation**.

A two battalion operation northwest of **Cam** Lo and southwest of Con Thien designed to reduce **enemy** capabilities to interdict Con Thien, Cam Lo and the **Cam** Lo New Life Village; maintain security of Route **#9** from Cam Lo to the Rockpile and Route **#561** from Cam Lo to Con Thien.

These and all other special operations have the standard objectives of obtaining intelligence and destroying or capturing enemy forces and **material**.

Two battalion operations within the Phu Bai TAOR with particular attention to the area around the Phu Bai Vital **area**. This operation will reduce enemy capabilities to attack the vital area with observed indirect fire weapons such as **artillery**, rockets and mortars, and his capability to **conduct** hit **and run** raids **on** the base with significant force.

Also, this operation will materially improve our **security** posture along Route #1 in the southern portion of the Division TAOR from Phu Bai to Phu **Loc**, and significantly reduce enemy capabilities to infiltrate into and out of coastal rice producing **areas**.

One **regiment**, the 9th **Marines**, with three battalions in the attack, in conjunction with two battalions of the **1st** ARVN Division, commenced combat operations in northern Quang Tri Province on 29 November 1967. The objective is to locate and destroy or capture enemy personnel and **materiel**, and to **destroy** enemy combat infrastructure south of **the** DMZ. An **integrated** fire support plan to include air, artillery and **naval** gunfire will support the **operation**.

Special operations planned well in advance are not locked into an inflexible time schedule, **nor**, are D-Days and H or L Hours **unchangeable**. Prior planning produces a rapid response capability **when** required, and **flexibility** in execution dates enables the Division to attack more lucrative targets of opportunity as they arise.

TRAINING. The training program of the 3d Marine Division has increased proportionately to keep pace with the added number of **troops**. Though we are required to devote our primary effort to the combat operations, the remaining time must be devoted to assuring that our men are properly trained to **per-**form their mission and are kept abreast of current techniques, both enemy and **friendly**. In the past several months numerous hours **have** been devoted to **instruction** on the M16 rifle. **Additionally**, the following measures have been instituted within the 3d Marine Division to ensure **maximum continuing** emphasis in **this program**:

(1) Construction of improvised combat **bases**,

(2) Special training programs in care and cleaning of the **M16 rifle, ammo,** and magazines under combat **conditions.**

(3). Maximum time in **familiarization** firing with the **weapon,** before the **Marine** ever makes an operation.

As a result of **command leadership** at all levels and the comprehensive programs developed the great majority of Marines in the 3d Marine Division are developing the confidence in the weapons required to assure its effective **employment.**

SUBJECT: Logistics

I. **PURPOSE:** To brief you on the current logistic posture of the **3d Marine** Division.

II. SCRIPTS

I will present the logistic system for support of this division **including** both supply and **maintenance**, the lines of **communication**, and then describe the major logistic efforts **underway** in the area of operations of this **division**.

Logistics System

I will briefly review the logistic system in this Northern I Corps area. **As you know**, the logistic capability of this division is extremely **limited**. We hold **practically** no supplies and our maintenance capability is largely limited to second echelon. We receive logistic support **from** the **Force Logistic Command (FLC)** at Danang. To better serve us, two subordinate units of **FLC** have been established in our operating **areas**. Force Logistic Group Alpha is here at **Phu Bai** and Force Logistic Support **Unit One** operates at **Dong Ha**. In addition, logistic Support areas have been established at **Khe Sanh** and **Camp Evans**. Each of these logistic installations maintains supplies for issue directly to battalion and smaller separate units. Stock levels at each of these installations depend on troop density, projected operations, and an estimate of resupply capabilities.

This chart depicts stock levels for all classes at these four installations. Enclosure A.

Stock levels are under constant review and, **through close liaison** with FLC, are adjusted to meet projected operational **commitments**.

Third and fourth echelon maintenance is **performed** by technicians at **FLSU-1** at Dong Ha, and at **FLSU-A** at Phu Bai.

Concerning the maintenance of **equipment**, the division has had a program in effect which contains directives for the care and maintenance of major **end items**, requirements for close supervision of **1st** and **2nd** echelon maintenance procedures, contact instruction and maintenance management teams, and frequent inspections by members of the **division staff**.

The status of major items of equipment deadlined is shown on this chart. Enclosure B.

Any logistic system, of course, depends on lines of **communications**. Our lines of **communications** are at present over-taxed, and **this** is **probably** our greatest problem **today**. All three basic modes of transportation are used to transport materiel - **sea**, air and land. Each has its limitations in our operating area.

Sea

Amphibious ships and craft are used to transport materiel and supplies **from** Danang to Dong Ha/Cua Viet to support our forces in the north, and to Col Co/Hue to support our forces in the Phu Bai **area**. Facilities **at** these locations are operated by Naval Support Activity **Danang**. Modest expansion of the facilities at Dong **Ha, Cua Viet, Hue,** and Col Co is underway to better meet our **needs**. At **present, facilities,** and occasionally weather, are limitations to moving material by **sea**.

Air

Air is used to transport high priority cargo and perishable **items** in the division AOR. At present it is the **only** way of **supplying Khe Sanh**. All types of aircraft deliver high priority cargo to Phu Bai, **Khe Sanh** and Dong **Ha**. The principal limitation to air shipment is the **limited number** of aircraft **available**.

Road

For road **transportation,** the **only** north-south **MSR** is National Route **1**. This road requires constant and major engineer effort to maintain it in a trafficable state due to its **age,** weather erosion, numerous bridges, and **enemy activities**. This division presently has an **Army Truck** Company of 60 trucks to augment our two Motor Transport **Battalions**. Large quantities of **materiel** are being moved from Danang north by Rough Rider **Convoys**.

Internal distribution of supplies is effected by truck and helicopter to forward battalions. Otters, which are full tracked vehicles capable of moving **1¹ tons** of **cargo,** are used to distribute supplies within regimental **areas**. They are extremely useful in **muddy terrain**.

This chart shows cargo movements by category within the division **area**. Enclosure **C**.

Now I shall review briefly the major logistic efforts apart from normal division support which are underway in the division **area.**

The first of these is the Quang Tri airfield **complex** which is being built by the CB's. The field is now receiving C-130 aircraft. This area will eventually have a major ammunition supply point and hospital to better serve forward elements,

The second major effort has been rebuilding the ammunition dump in the Dong Ha area. The loss of the Dong Ha ammunition supply point on September third as a result of **enemy** action has severely taxed the LOC of the division to rebuild the levels of Class V required.

A third major effort has been the repair of the Khe Sanh air strip which was inoperative for two **months.** This had to be **accomplished** as quickly as possible since air is presently the only **LOC** to this remote installation.

The fourth effort has been the repair of Route **561,** which is the **only** supply route to Con **Thien.** This road is extremely important since the logistic burden of resupply by helicopter for an indefinite period would severely tax our helicopter assets.

The **fifth** effort is the expansion of the Naval beaching facilities. The Dong Ha ramp is being expanded to double its capacity, an additional LST beaching ramp is also being **built** at Col Co. These expanded facilities will almost double the capability to receive **cargo.**

In **summary,** providing logistic support to a widely dispersed reinforced division in the Vietnam environment is not **easy.** We do believe the situation is under control and that logistic support will improve as our facilities are improved.



DEADLINED COMBAT ESSENTIAL EQUIPMENT





SUBJECT Third Marine Division Civic Action Briefing

I. PURPOSE: To describe briefly 3d Marine Division Civic Action and how it complements the CORDS/RD effort.

II. SCRIPT

To refresh your memory concerning the area in which the 3d Marine Division is operating, the two northernmost provinces of Thua Thien and Quang Tri contain some 840,000 people (290,000 in Quang Tri and 550,000 in Thua Thien). There are 16 Districts, 150 villages and 900 hamlets. About the only cities of any significance are the provincial capitals; Hue has a population of 104,000 and Quang Tri City about 14,000. Ethnically the population is almost completely Vietnamese, the only significant exceptions are the 10,000 to 20,000 Montagnards who inhabit the western portions of the provinces. 85% of the people are at least nominal Buddhists; about 10% are Catholic, though this is a well organized minority. There is a scattering of Protestants and the Montagnards are chiefly Animists. There is no industry in the area. About 71% of the population are farmers with 8% being fishermen.

Civic Action is closely tied to the CORDS effort since our purpose is generally to carry out the RD concept. As our resources permit, our programs are designed to help in the villages and districts contiguous to the RD priority areas. Although MEDCAPs are our primary "Attention-Getter" we are also providing significant assistance to CORDS in public health, public works, youth and sports programs, agricultural and educational programs and the overburdened refugee programs. Chart A shows the total MEDCAP/DENTCAP figures for Jan-Oct 1967.

We currently have 110 students enrolled in the General WALT/3d Marine Division Vietnamese Scholarship Program. This program permits attendance at school of students, including refugee children, who without financial assistance would not otherwise attend. Once an applicant is approved by the village council and District Chief, an agreement is signed by the parents and the Marine Corps. All that is required of the student is that he or she attend school regularly and receive passing marks. Current students are enrolled in vocational schools, high schools and a very few in elementary schools.

Chart B portrays the many varied type Civic Action projects in which we participated. The significant point about these projects is "they are all self-help projects". We provided the materials and the villages provided the labor. The brick factory project at Cam Lo is an

excellent example of a cottage industry type **project**. The laborers are paid in **CORDS** commodities with the brick output being used for priority C/A construction for the refugee **village**.

Finally, I would like to mention our Personal Response **Program**. This project is a systematic effort to establish rapport between Americans and the people of Vietnam and to achieve acceptance of each group by the **other**. We have just completed our 9th Personal Response 2-day **class**. An officer **and/or** **SNCO** from each battalion attends each class. Our Personal Response Contact Team travels to field units on a scheduled basis and conducts classes in Vietnamese **history**, culture and **religions**. This instruction is also provided to the CAP Marines during the Combined Action Program indoctrination **classes**. Critiques of these classes have pointed up the need for this type of indoctrination for all officers and enlisted prior to arrival in-country.

This has been a quick look at some of the **highlights** of our Civic Action **Program**. It should be remembered that these projects and programs are designed to complement the much larger RD effort and provide help to **civilians** in areas where we have **military** troops. This completes the Civic Action **briefing**. Are there any questions?
