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NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. Personnel and Administration. Personnel strength of Co "F" (OpCon-First Marines) has continued to be reported on our Battalion OPSTAT and PE-STAT section of the Command Chronology Report.

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g. During the month of April, Special Services furnished a total of 30 movies. Also games, athletic equipment and other useful items were distributed. A picnic was also given at which 50 cases of both beer and soda were given out free of charge.

m. Post Exchange: A PX van is open 7 days a week, providing basic necessities and featuring luxuries in sufficient quantities.

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O. Chaplain. The Protestant Chaplain assigned to this battalion is Lt James A. BROWN Jr., Roman Catholic coverage for the units of this command is provided by Chaplain J. S. JENSEN, First Marines. During this reporting period 5 Sunday Masses were conducted with a total attendance of 163. A total of 12 Protestant Divine Services were conducted within the units of this battalion with a total attendance of 388. The Chaplain assigned to this command is also responsible for providing Protestant coverage to First Marines GP and Co F, First Marines. During this reporting period 4 Protestant services were conducted at these units with a total attendance of 83. There were 39 personnel counseled during this period, in addition to 92 hospital visits.

2. Enemy

a. General. During the month of April, the S-2 section collected, evaluated and disseminated intelligence according to the established procedures. The Company Commanders, platoon commanders, S-2 scouts and the Kit Carson Scout were extremely helpful in providing information concerning their particular operating areas. Based on enemy contacts, intelligence reports and information provided by unit leaders, the Second Battalion, 1st Marines launched "Operation YELL" in KY MINH and the southern portion of THANH TRUNG village, which resulted in nineteen (19) Viet Cong KIA and fourteen (14) PW's. THANH PHONG and KY MINH villages and the southern portion of THANH TRUNG village continued to be the area of relatively intense Viet Cong activity within and adjacent to the Second Battalion, First Marines TAOR. Since late March there has been a total of 48 incidents and 146 Viet Cong sighted in this area. It is believed that there is one District Force company operating in and out of KY MINH village and one platoon in THANH PHONG.

b. Enemy units which operate near our TAOR.

(1) DIEN BAN (LF) Company (Q-15) with an estimated strength of 80, operating at (BT 063598). The normal operating area of this company is (BT 023635).

(2) 402nd (MF) Sapper Battalion, with an estimated strength of 600, last reported at (AT 950300). The normal operating area of this company is (ZC 145250).

(3) R-20th (LF) Battalion, with an estimated strength of 390, last reported at (BT 243529). The normal operating area of this unit is (AT 985535).

(4) V-25th (LF) Battalion, with an estimated strength of 500, last reported at (AT 950300). The normal operating area of this unit is (AT 829483).

c. Weather and Terrain. No change.

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3. Organization and Operations

a. Operations conducted during the month of April continued to emphasize small unit actions during periods of darkness to interdict suspected enemy land and waterway infiltration routes, and deny the enemy access to local villagers. Most typical of these operations was "GREEN LIGHT" which began on 12 April and provided protection to all areas harvesting rice throughout most of the Battalion's area of responsibility.

b. One battalion size operation was conducted employing control through a light command group in the field. Operation YELL commenced on 18 April and terminated on 20 April.

c. Company "E" was chopped OPCON to 1st Battalion, 1st Marines for Operation UNION on 22 April with the simultaneous joining of Company "D", 1st Battalion, 26th Marines who assumed the Company "E" mission in this TAOR.

d. The First Marine Aircraft Wing supported battalion operations by providing 48 medevacs, 7 resupply missions, 1 troop lift, 10 close air support missions, 7 communication missions, 2 Pay War missions, and 2 reconnaissance missions. Two administrative missions and two PW/Detainee lifts were made. Aerial Observation was provided as requested throughout all operations.

e. During the month of April supporting arms fired 75 missions and expended 731 rounds. Battalion 81mm mortars fired 26 missions and expended 591 rounds. Supporting arms expended 144 artillery rounds and 343 81mm mortar rounds on H&I's. During Operation YELL (18-20 Apr) Bravo Battery 1st Battalion, 11th Marines provided fast and accurate artillery fires. During the month there were five Counter Punch drills held with an average time of 3 minutes.

4. Training

a. All newly joined personnel have attended the Battalion troop indoctrination program and fired the M-16 rifle for proper battle zero on the 900' range. The Battalion continues maximum utilization of quotas received from 1st Marine Division and III MAF schools.

b. Grenade training, including live grenade throwing application was conducted for 60% of the battalion personnel. This training will continue periodically as required for all personnel.

c. The Battalion NBC NCO conducted individual training for 80% of the Battalion members in proper mask fitting concurrently with a Gas Chamber exercise and recognition of chemical agents. Individual NBC training is scheduled to continue during May. Weapon's safety precautions; and handling of POW's were reviewed by a series of weekly presentations at all small unit levels.

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5. Combined Action Company

a. GAC's D-6 and D-7 conducted 65 integrated PF/RE/MedCo patrols and ambushes concurrently with the physical improvement of the defensive position and manning of LP's, CP's and security posts. Marine leadership continues to instill confidence and enthusiasm in the Vietnamese members.

b. During the month of April, 22 PW's were captured, and 13 detainees were interrogated and processed for further interrogation. Friendly losses were: 1 US soldier KIA, and 2 PF members KIA. Coordination and cooperation is constantly increasing as Vietnamese and American members develop their language capability.

6. Logistics and Supply

a. During the reporting period, construction continued. The access road and extension was completed by US Co, 7th Engineer Battalion. An access road is presently under construction by 1st Engineer Battalion from 2/1 CP south to coordinates 071635. 1st Engineer Battalion has begun construction of a concrete sewage pit for the mess hall.

(1) Supply. Status of supply remains adequate except in the following problem areas:

(a) CP Tentage remains in short supply with only 8 of the 46 authorized received.

(b) 3,000 Sandbags were received. 50,000 are currently on order. Continued building of defensive emplacements and wire obstacles have already consumed the on-hand quantity.

(2) Fiscal obligations for the month of April 1968 was \$54,776.09.

b. During the reporting period, 107 Tactical Equipment Repair Orders were submitted to 1st FSR. Of these, 55 were completed. At present, 13 items of combat essential equipment are deadlined.

7. Civic Action. During the month of April, a MEDCAP structure was completed in PHONG NGU (1). Extensive MEDCAP's were held at the Battalion CP, THON CON DAU Hamlet, and QUANG LOC TAY (1). Arrangements were made to construct school buildings at AN TU (1), VIEM TAY (4), and PHONG NGU (1). A large amount of clothing was distributed in the TAOR and close liaison was maintained with local civilian officials and military advisors on every level.

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8. Psychological Operations. There was extensive use of loudspeaker broadcasting in the battalion TAOR during April, particularly at CAC D-6 and CAC D-7 positions. Many leaflets and "Free Vietnam" newspapers were hand distributed. An armed propaganda team was employed for several days, as was an audio-visual team from 244th Psychological Operations Company. Several leaflets were printed by the battalion to immediately exploit situations which tended to discredit the Viet Cong in the eyes of the local populace.

9. Communications.

a. A CG's inspection of communications was conducted at this battalion on 10 April, and on 25 April an instructor from 1st Radio Battalion, FortTran presented a 40 minute period of instruction on radio transmission security.

b. On 28 April, eight AN/PRC-6's were received on a special allowance. These radios are being used by IIS Co for perimeter defense and listening post communications. By employing the AN/PRC-6's in this manner, 5-7 AN/PRC-25's will be released and used as spare items, for newly formed CAC units and other commitments as required.

c. During the month of April, 25 AN/PRC-10 tape antenna adapters were specially constructed. This increased the ability to provide each AN/PRC-25 in the battalion with a tape antenna. Tape and whip antennas for the AN/PRC-25 are still critical supply items.

10. Medical and Dental

a. Sixteen combat casualties and 317 sick call patients were treated at the Battalion Aid Station during the month of April. The most significant of these was only 1 case of Heart Stroke.

b. Dental Trends. During the month of April, 224 patients were treated for a total of 662 restorations, placing 108 into class 1 status.

Also attached to the T-89 is the M-15 Special Transportation Platoon which is responsible for bringing all explosives, ammo and ordnance from a supply point on the HO CHI MINH Trail. Weapons of the T-89 consist of K-50 SMG for the infantry troops, 7-B40 Rocket Launchers for each infantry company and 2 RPG IMG for all companies. V-4 has 2 - 81mm mortars, 4 - 82mm mortars and 1 AK-47 assault rifle per mortar. V-5 company has 2 - 81mm mortars and AK-47 per mortar. T-89 has 320 men and the 402 unit has 20. V-4 (H-44) company was enroute to mortar American position (possibly 2/1) on 19 Apr and were to spend the night of 19 Apr at (AT 980534), 20 Apr at (AT 842547) and 21 Apr at (AT 879-543), then proceed to base (AT 804600). 140mm rockets are supplied by the MRV to the R-20 Bn which is commanded by NGUYEN VAN LAIM.

1. The following comments are made on paragraph 15 "Recommendations" to the basic correspondence.

a. Changes have been recommended in 1st Marine external boundaries placing the DUC KY area inside the 1st Marines TAOR. It is not considered desirable at this time to join the CHAU LAU, DONG TIEN and HA MONG TAY areas under one battalion because the SONG LA THO is still considered too great an obstacle to friendly maneuver. Future developments and techniques of crossing the SONG LA THO may reduce the dimension of the river as an obstacle, at which time the trace of the boundary will be reevaluated.

b. Concur. Establishment of a company patrol base at the junction of the SONG LA THO and the railroad embankment would provide an excellent means of interdicting two enemy lines of communication - the SONG LA THO and the railroad. The TAOR and areas to the south can be adequately covered from existing and planned artillery positions so no advantage would be gained from locating a battery at the above mentioned location. When the troop density in the 1st Marines TAOR so permits interdiction of this infiltration route as recommended will be considered.

Communications were excellent throughout Operation YELL.

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F. Psych

(1) On D-Day an aerial broadcast was made to the civilian populace within the objective area. Broadcasts explained purpose of Marine operations, stressed that civilians should not run from Marines, and explained benefits of the CHIEU HOI program.

(2) Sweep forces collected civilians within the objective area and delivered them to the Battalion Collection Point. Informal collect point operations were established to provide screening, security, medical treatment and food for the civilians. 169 persons were handled at the collection point.

(3) Formal screening and processing was delayed, and subsequently cancelled, due to delay in availability of helicopters. These services were to have been provided by the DIEN BAN District Headquarters.

13. Special Equipment and Techniques

a. Scout Dog Teams. The use of Scout Dog Teams during search operations was continued. The dogs have proved especially useful at night by alerting to VC along trails and in built-up areas.

b. Ordnance Detectors. Four test models of the Ordnance Detectors were employed during Operation YELL. The Detectors proved to be simple to use and maintain, and uncumbersome for use in the field.

14. Commander's Analysis. Operation YELL succeeded in its primary mission of destroying enemy units within the objective area. In addition the infrastructure of the VC local organization was seriously damaged by the seizure of POW's, the capture of documents and other information and the ability for subsequent use of information gathered from civilians in the area. Operation YELL did not clear the objective area permanently of VC. The Operation YELL objective area lies athwart at least three known VC infiltration routes. Information obtained verified NVA/VC forces in this area are highly mobile, spending short periods of time at harbouring sites or rest areas. During Operation YELL there were indications that local force VC were located in adjacent areas and were moving at will. VC forces have been found in this area each time

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friendly forces have entered. However, after each operation the VC forces continue to reenter the area upon the departure of friendly forces.

15. Recommendations

- a. That 1st Marines internal and external TAOR boundaries be revised in order to provide one battalion responsibility for the DUC KY, CHAU LAU, DONG TIEN and HA NONG TAY areas.
- b. That a permanent infantry company/artillery battery position be established in the vicinity of the junction of the SONG LA THO and the railroad bed.
- c. That the railroad bed be developed for overland use south from Anderson Trail to the SONG LA THO.

(2) Two preplanned close air support missions were requested. Both missions commenced on schedule. Three additional flights were provided by DASC to support these missions. The first mission successfully suppressed fire hindering a med-evac. The second mission was directed against suspected VC positions flanking a zone to be swept by ground forces. All strikes were on target.

(3) The average reaction time for med-evacs(from notification of DASC to arrival over med-evac LZ) was as follows:

Emergency(9 missions)	13.3 min
Priority(3 missions)	26.3 min
Routine(1 mission)	95.0 min(Delayed until first light)

(4) Two battalion size resupply missions were requested in advance. The first was on time. The second was begun on time but was delayed 1.5 hours due to an aircraft

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Mechanical failure and a divert to an emergency med-evac. Two unscheduled resupply missions were requested and flown at the times requested.

(5) Illumination was provided as requested. Effectiveness was reduced on D-Day night due to requirements to share the flareship with an adjacent battalion. Illumination on D+1 was continuous. All flare drops were on target and very effective.

(6) Two unscheduled admin missions were requested. The first was run 10 minutes after requested time. The second mission was run 6 hours and 30 minutes after the requested time. Delay in running the second mission substantially detracted from the effectiveness of tactical Psy-War operations.

(7) Support by O-1 aircraft and AO's was timely, continuous and highly effective.

(8) With the exception of the one admin mission, air support was outstanding.

c. Tracked Vehicles. In support of Operation YELL were 6 tanks and 3 ONTOS. Initially all vehicles were in support of Co C for sweep operations over a broad ZOA. The inherent speed and mobility of the vehicles provided for effective coverage in the ZOA, and rapid closure on the LOA. All vehicles were subsequently used in blocking positions and for sweeps within the cordon area. Both tanks and ONTOS reacted to targets becoming available at night. In all cases, enemy fire ceased.

7. Intelligence

a. Enemy Forces Anticipated in Objective Area

(1) Immediately prior to Operation YELL, the S-2 Section estimated that there were two hundred Viet Cong guerrillas and cadre in KY MINH and KY NGOC villages. Agent reports and local village studies provided by the DIEN BAN Combined Intelligence Center, documents translated by the Third CI Team, and interrogation reports placed elements of one Main Force Company, the DIEN BAN District Force Company, Q:15, two local village guerrilla platoons and political cadre in the operation area.

b. Enemy Forces Actually Encountered

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(1) During the entire operation, the Second Battalion First Marines met with scattered and harrassing resistance from an estimated twenty-five to thirty guerillas and political cadre. An interrogation of the detainees, captured during the operation, revealed that one platoon of the Q:15 had moved south on the evening of 17 April, and that the majority of the local guerillas had moved in a southwesterly direction on the morning of the 18 April after being warned of the approach of the Marines by the villagers to their immediate west.

(2) Mines and Booby Traps. A total of 7 mines and booby-traps were encountered by the Second Battalion, First Marines sweep forces. Two were detonated and five were discovered. Also encountered were four punji stakes, one mantrap and two foottraps.

(3) Caves and Tunnels. A total of fifteen bunkers, constructed of brick and bamboo were destroyed.

c. Terrain.

(1) Cover and Concealment. In the Operation Area there are numerous built-up areas, bamboo thickets and hedgerows which afford excellent concealment and fair cover.

(2) Critical Terrain Features. The railroad track in the objective area controls east and west movement, both day and night.

(3) Observation and Fields of Fire. Fields of fire were only fair due to thick vegetation and built-up areas. Ground observation is limited by vegetation and should be supplemented by AO coverage.

(4) Obstacles. Man made obstacles encountered during the operation consisted of mines, punji stakes, foottraps, mantraps and bamboo and brick bunkers. Natural obstacles were the rivers, SONG LA THO, SUOI CO CA, and minor streams and lakes.

(5) Avenues of Approach. There are limited acceptable avenues of approach into the operation area. Approaches from the north and east involve crossing the SONG LA THO or SUOI CO CA. Avenues from the south are barrier-free, but can be covered from HA NONG TAY. Avenues from the west have minor obstacles and can be covered from the railroad track.

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8. MISSION

Second Battalion(-)(Rein) conducts search and destroy operations commencing D-Day, H-Hour vicinity Ha FONG TAY(1) and (2) and DONG LIEN, to destroy NVA/VC forces, supplies and weapons.

9. Concept

Commencing D-1, 2nd Bn(-)(Rein) prepositions forces adjacent to objective areas by conducting customary small unit activities; under the cover of darkness D-Day morning two companies and Bn Cmd Grp move to the LOD. At D-Day, H-Hour forces commence search and destroy operations from the LOD to the LOA; blocking forces commence search of DONG LIEN. Evening of D-Day, establish cordon along LOA and blocking positions. On D-1 continue detailed and systematic search and destroy operation.

- (5) Enemy patrol contacts, to include location, nature of contact, and subsequent enemy reactions.
- (6) Suspected or confirmed jamming or intrusion of communication nets.
- (7) New weapons or equipment.
- (8) Marked change (increase or decrease) of mortar or recoilless weapon employment.
- (9) Troop movement, to include size, composition, type unit, direction and rate of movement.

(10) Location and activity of enemy laboratories.

b. Civil Populace

(1) Movement of civil populace from established hamlets/villages, include direction, number of people, and amount of personal belongings being carried.

(2) Any detected change in the attitude of local inhabitants.

c. Terrain

(1) Significant errors or omissions in the tactical maps.

(2) Presence of obstacles, natural or man-made that would restrict movement of foot troops or vehicles, wheeled or tracked.

(3) Location of fords or possible stream crossings.

3. INTELLIGENCE ACQUISITION TASKS

a. Orders to subordinate and attached units

(1) Aerial Observation. Aerial observation will be planned and requested via S-2 channels to support the reconnaissance plan. Additionally, all helicopter pilots are potential observers. Maximum effort will be made to receive reports from these aircraft flying over the objective area regardless of the type of mission being flown. Coordination with the Air Liaison Officer is essential in this effort.

b. Requests to higher, adjacent, and supporting units

(1) 1st Marines

(a) Provide current enemy order of battle.

(b) Provide aerial photographs in support of current and projected operations.

(c) Provide aerial observers for field observation.

(d) Provide latest weather forecast.

(e) Provide counterintelligence and interrogator-translator personnel.

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4. MEASURES FOR HANDLING PERSONNEL, DOCUMENTS, AND MATERIAL

- a. References (b) and (c) provide the basic guidance relative to handling of captured personnel, documents and material.
- b. Capturing Unit
 - (1) Expedite movement of prisoners from the point of capture to the battalion collection point.
 - (a) The battalion will establish a PW Collection Point in the vicinity of the Civilian Collection Point. If possible, all units will forward detainees and PW's to this point. If this is not possible, all detainees and PW's will be forwarded to the PW Compound at the Battalion CP at first opportunity.
 - (2) Report to the S-2 the number, condition and status of all prisoners.
 - (3) Ensure that prisoner escorts sent out to conduct the prisoners back to the Battalion Collection Point are thoroughly briefed on the circumstances surrounding each prisoner captured.
- c. Proper Tagging of Prisoners. All captives and their possessions will be tagged. All units will use the standard tag and will assure that it is properly filled out to assure fast processing of the captives. All captives should be warned not to mutilate, destroy or lose their tags.

5. MAPS, CHARTS AND PHOTOGRAPHS

- a. Overlay. Tactical information will not be placed on maps because of the possibility of loss either accidentally or in combat. Overlays will be used to record that information which is absolutely necessary for operations. Overlays are to be destroyed when no longer needed by the user.

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INTELLIGENCE ESTIMATE OF THE SITUATION

Ref: Maps: Vietnam, 1:50,000 AMS Series L7014, Sheet 6640 IV

1. MISSION

- a. Basic Mission. See Second Battalion, First Marines Operations order 206-67.
- b. Purpose of this Estimate.
 - (1) To provide accurate intelligence concerning the area of operation, KY MINH and KY NGOC villages.

2. ENEMY SITUATION

a. Characteristics of the Area of Operations.

(1) Military Geography

- (a) Topography: KY MINH and KY NGOC villages are characterized by relatively flat rice paddies which are sectioned by paddy dikes approximately 2'-3' high and 1'-2' wide. The commanding terrain and cultural features are the hamlets and the railroad bed, which runs generally in a north-south direction. The vegetation consists of stands of bamboo and secondary growth, which is thick along certain portions of the banks of the Song La Tho and in the hamlets themselves. It offers excellent to good concealment to the defending or maneuvering forces. The villages of KY MINH and KY NGOC are drained by the Song La Tho, the Suoi Co Ca and their small tributaries.

(b) Climate and Weather: (Issued Separately)

(2) Politics

- (a) Both KY MINH and KY NGOC villages have been under Viet Cong control since late 1965. An Autonomous Committee has been established for each village and this committee is responsible for the administration of the village. They collect taxes, issue

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authorization papers, permits to carry weapons and to travel and disseminate and carry out directives from higher authorities. The majority of the people in the area support the Viet Cong, but reports received from the villages indicate that there are GVN sympathizers among the populace. The number is expected to increase during this harvest season. The district chief of Dien Ban has given permission to certain refugees from KY MINH and KY NGOC villages to return to their former fields to harvest their rice.

(3) Economics

- (a) The people of KY MINH and KY NGOC villages raise rice, sweet potatoes, manioc and tobacco, but they must buy other staples and spices from the markets in the government controlled areas. In order to purchase these goods, the Viet Cong have established trade organizations in each village. The members of this organization are sent to the government controlled areas to buy fish sauce, salt, oil, clothes, clerical supplies and other necessities. The market that is most frequently used by the Viet Cong is the Thanh Quit Market.

(4) Sociology

- (a) The inhabitants of the area are classified as being members of the Poor Farmers Class by GVN officials. Based on the latest government figures, the population of Ky Minh and Ky Ngoc villages is 8,231, but due to the flow of people to government controlled areas, this population will be considerably less than the last census figures.

b. Enemy and Military Situation

(1) Composition

- (a) The Viet Cong force in Ky Minh and Ky Ngoc villages is a composite of local hamlet and village guerrillas and Viet Cong regular soldiers from both District and Main Force units.

(2) Locally Available Strength

- (a) Agent reports, interrogation reports, captured docu-

ments, contacts, and sightings indicate 200-250 Viet Cong guerrillas and cadre in Ky Minh and Ky Ngoc villages.

- (b) In each village there is an organized guerrilla platoon. A document captured on Operation Stone indicates that the strength of Ky Ngoc village platoon is 40 Viet Cong, who are armed with M-1's, M-14's, K-44's and carbines. The National Police report that the effective strength of the Ky Minh guerrilla platoon is approximately 30 Viet Cong. Their weapons also consist of M-1's, carbines and M-14's.
- (c) Since 26 March we have received numerous intelligence reports from various agencies and from the people who live adjacent to the area of operation that there is one regular guerrilla company, which regularly operates in this area. It is believed, based on past operations that this company is the Dien Ban District Force, designated Q.15. Due to casualties, the effective strength of this company is estimated to be 65-70 men. A POW captured shortly before Tet stated that the Q.15 is armed with 2x60mm mortars, 2x.30 caliber MG's, K-44's, K-50's, MAS-36's, M-1's, M-14's, French BAR's and carbines.
- (d) Agent reports also indicate that a Main Force Company has moved into this area from Phu Ky. The mission of this company is to coordinate with the local and district guerrillas during the harvest and to assist them in the collection of rice.

(3) Availability of Reinforcements

- (a) The Viet Cong have two Local Force battalions within 12 hours march of the operational area. These battalions are the V.25 and the R.20.

(4) Location and Disposition

- (a) At the present time the V.25 is located in northwestern part of Duc Duc District. The estimated strength of the battalion is 400 men and the combat effectiveness of its personnel is considered to be good. They are reported to be armed with 1x81mm mortar, 2x60mm mortars, 1x57 RR and individual weapons.

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- (b) The R.20 Battalion is located in the Phu Ky area. The estimated strength of the battalion is 250 men. The combat effectiveness of the battalion is considered to be good. They are reported to be armed with 1x81mm mortar, 3x60mm mortars, 1x57mm RR, 2xMG's, 54 AR's, and individual weapons.

3. ENEMY CAPABILITIES

- a. The Viet Cong are capable of attacking/ambushing in two company strength reinforced by local guerrillas.
- b. The Viet Cong are capable of defending with two companies reinforced by local guerrillas.
- c. The Viet Cong are capable of dispersing into small groups and withdrawing/hiding from our units.
- d. The Viet Cong are capable of reinforcing their units with two battalions within 12 hours.

4. ANALYSIS OF ENEMY CAPABILITIES

- a. The Viet Cong in Ky Minh and Ky Ngoc villages are capable of massing two companies, consisting of District, Main Force and local guerrillas in order to ambush/attack.
- b. The Viet Cong are capable of massing two companies of District, Main Force and local guerrillas to defend any hamlet or installation of vital importance to the Viet Cong.
- c. In the past the Viet Cong units in the operational area have attempted to disperse into small groups and withdraw to the southwest or to the northwest depending upon the movement of the sweeping force. Others have tried to hide in caves and tunnels.
- d. By calling upon the V.25 and the R.20 the Viet Cong can reinforce with two battalions.

5. CONCLUSIONS

- a. The Viet Cong will attempt to avoid our sweep force by hiding in tunnels or withdrawing to the southwest.
- b. If pressed they will choose an advantageous position to defend.


Activity Overlay for period 021800H to 030600H
