

f. Morale and Welfare. The overall morale of the Battalion is considered to be excellent. In addition to the recreation and rest programs available to all Marines in Vietnam, the Battalion maintains an enlisted club with a large outdoor theatre which has hosted six USO shows this month. High on the list of favorite pastimes is an outstanding beach with facilities for Sunday parties. The Special Services program is active providing nightly movies, a weight room, a reading room and equipment for sporting activities. The PX facilities include a Marine Corps exchange, laundry, photo shop and gift shop. This commandment has a messhall which efficiently feeds 600 men three hot meals daily.

ENEMY, WEATHER TERRAIN & S-2 FUNCTIONS

2. ENEMY, WEATHER, TERRAIN AND S-2 FUNCTIONS

a. Enemy Activity: The enemy's R-300 campaign was initiated on the 20 and 21st of Feb 1971. It was a coordinated attack on military units in the Quang Nam Province. These coordinated attacks were primarily directed against GVN Cupp and Capp units. The purpose was to gain popular support for the Viet Cong by indicating to the people that the Government of Viet Nam was unable to protect them.

Enemy booby trap emplacement remained at the same level as the previous reporting period, with a total of 20 booby traps encountered. There were twelve (12) booby traps detonated eight (8) booby traps found.

c. Order of Battle

All though there are no NVA main force units located as a unit in 2/1's TAOR, there has been significant enemy movement but no change in the overall Order of Battle.

d. Weather and Terrain

(1) Weather. The average high temperature was 75 degrees and the average low temperature was 63 degrees with an average humidity of 77%. Rain for the month was .59".

(2) Terrain: The terrain in 2/1's TAOR is in flat and sandy land with rice paddies and scattered broken tracklines. There are two (2) main water transportation routes, the Vinh Dien River in the East and the Yen River in the West. In addition, there are numerous lakes, ponds and paddies where boat traffic is heavy.

e. S-2 Functions

(1) Security Clearances: Two (2) security clearances were initiated and none were terminated. Two (2) were required by H&S Company.

(2) ARVN Interpreters: Due to reassignment of interpreters within the I Corps Headquarters, the S-2 Section now has one (1) interpreter. He is assigned to S-2, 2d Battalion, 1st Marines.

(3) S-2 Personnel: One (1) Staff NCO, and two (2) enlisted Marines. The S-2 Scouts continue to work as a Battalion Recon Squad.

(4) VIP Funds: The allocation of Voluntary Informant Program funds remain a part of the S-2 Function. A total of 800VN were spent during the month of February. The Voluntary Informant Program is not only a source of intelligence information, but it also eliminates the availability of ordnance to the enemy.

(5) KCS Program: There are a total of twelve (12) KCS assigned to the Battalion. By walking with the point man on patrols, the KCS are able to act as an early warning for booby traps and ambushes due to their familiarities with the enemy's tactics, habit and signs.

(6) Training: The S-2 Section continued to furnish instructors on call for indoctrination training. At this time they are briefed on enemy, weather, terrain and the capabilities and functions of the S-2 Section.

(7) Maps: The S-2 office has a full supply of maps of 2/1's T10R and will continue to supply them as needed.

(8) Special Liaison Team: The S-2 Officer has operational control of a Special Liaison team located in Nui Kim Son. The team now consists of twelve (12) enlisted personnel. Their function is to act as a special intelligence gathering and pacification source.

(3) Vietnamese civilians continued to turn in ordnance to Marines and supplied periodic intelligence leading to the capture of VC infrastructure personalities.

(4) Operations were characterized by continued close cooperation and liaison with Vietnamese Military and Civilian Officials. The many Regional Forces (RF) and Popular Forces (PF) units located within the Battalion TAOR carried an ever increasing burden of the defense & safeguarding of their areas, so important to our eventual goal of the Vietnamization concept. Four cordon & search operations were held in conjunction with the PF and RF units which produced positive results in the form of VC infrastructure personalities and small amounts of ordnance and foodstuffs used by the enemy.

2. Air Support

a. The Battalion's air support for the month of February was hampered by inclement weather on several occasions and a restriction on fire support which included close air support (CAS). Also, due to inclement weather, liaison runs normally facilitated by visual reconnaissance (VR) flights were often either rescheduled or run by vehicle. Helicopters were obtained from MAG-16 and OV-30, aerial observation aircraft, from MAE-11.

b. The Battalion had a total of thirty-seven (37) medevac missions in February, evacuating sixty-seven (67) personnel. There were sixteen (16) U. S. emergency, eleven (11) U. S. priority, three (3) U. S. routine, twelve (12) emergency civilian, six (6) priority civilian, two (2) routine civilian, eight (8) ARVN emergency, four (4) ARVN priority, four (4) ARVN routine, one (1) ARVN permanent routine, and one (1) VC/NVA emergency. The shortest delay for an emergency medevac was five (5) minutes. The longest delay for an emergency medevac was forty-four (44) minutes. The average time for all emergency medevac missions was nineteen (19) minutes. This time was computed as time elapsing from the moment when the medevac was called into the Battalion COC until the casualty was airborne.

c. There were twenty-seven (27) resupply missions flown during February. This included 171 sorties, carrying 247,595 pounds and 734 passengers.

d. Twenty-seven (27) visual reconnaissance missions were completed during the month of February. The VR was utilized for liaison runs, visual reconnaissance, and the administration transfer of passengers.

e. One (01) aerial observation (AO) mission was flown.

f. Due to the restriction on fire support, no close air support (CAS) missions were flown during February. Flare ships were used in support of troops on six (06) occasions.

PART II
SECTION C
OPERATIONS

1. Operations.

a. Mission. The 2d Battalion, 1st Marines was assigned the mission to:

(1) Conduct unilateral and combined offensive operations within the assigned TAOR to locate and destroy enemy forces, installations and LOC, with primary emphasis on those forces and bases which pose the greatest threat to GVN control of important population and economic centers and to the security of friendly military installations.

(2) Deploy forces throughout assigned TAOR to provide defense of the Da Nang vital area and military complex with emphasis on avenues of approach to known/suspected mortar/rocket positions, to include waterways.

(3) Be prepared to provide a reaction force for relief of Hoa Vang District Headquarters and CAP/CUPP's within the TAOR.

(4) In cooperation and coordination with FVMAF and District Headquarters, maintain continuous programs to upgrade hamlets within the TAOR in accordance with the Pacification Program.

(5) Provide security for roadsweeps and other engineer projects as required.

(6) Support Revolutionary Development Program within the TAOR.

(7) Be prepared to be reinforced and committed anywhere in RVN on 12 hour notice.

(8) Be prepared on 48 hour notice to be relieved of present mission and to assume the mission of either of the other Battalions within the 1st Marine Regiment.

b. Operations.

(1) The Battalion continued the concept of neutralizing the Viet Cong infrastructure in its TAOR. This is the concept of operation that will best benefit the Vietnamization program during the limited time span that the Battalion will remain in Viet Nam. This concept involves employing four rifle companies in the field conducting saturation patrolling and utilizing an intensified intelligence effort.

(2) During February 1971, the battalion, anticipating a high rocket threat period, utilized towers with Night Observation devices to their fullest capabilities. The use of these devices coupled with saturation patrolling, Aerial observers and our extensive U. S. Intelligence effort, produced significant results in that no rockets were fired from the Battalion's TAOR during the month.

3. Artillery and Fire Support

a. Artillery fire support was provided by Battery B and Battery W, 1st Battalion 11th Marines and the 3rd 8" inch Howitzer Battery.

b. Thirty-seven artillery fire missions were fired by Battery B, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines. All missions on enemy forces were fired out of 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines TAOR. Battery W fired no artillery fire missions in the TAOR for the month of February. The total round expenditure for 105mm high explosive ammunition was 280 rounds. Fifty-five 105mm illumination rounds and 10 105mm WP rounds were also fired.

c. The 81mm mortar platoon fired 43 observed missions of which seventeen were contact illumination missions. Ten missions were fired on the haven site area in the AT980690 grid square. A total of 415 81mm high explosive rounds were expended on this haven site in the month of February. Five hundred fifty two high explosive rounds, 27 WP rounds and 799 illumination rounds were fired by the 81mm mortar platoon during February.

d. Clearance of artillery fire support remains the most significant problem in this TAOR. It is almost impossible to obtain clearance for pre-extensive fire even though extensive precautions are taken.

SECTION D
TRAINING

1. Training

a. Training consisted of indoctrination training for replacements, platoon rehabilitation training, formal schools and refresher training as required.

b. The replacement indoctrination course was broken down as follows:

(1) 5 day course. Conducted for replacement personnel initially coming into the Republic of Viet Nam. During the month of February, seventy-nine Marines including two Corpsmen completed the course. The subjects included: MFC and pistol spending, Pay and Allowances, Emergency Leave, Record of Emergency Data, Evac/Casualty Procedures, CAP Program, R&R, Postal Regulations, Private Weapons, PX Facilities, Request Mast, Respect for Religions based on customs of Viet Nam, Moral Guidance, Red Cross, S-2 Mission, VC/NVA Mission, TAOR/Weather, Enemy Forces, Enemy Tactics, Rewards Programs, Handling of POW's, Care of Maps, VC/NVA Infrastructure, Interpreters and Kit Carson Employment, Security Compromise, War Trophies, Scouting and Patrolling, Basic Map Reading and Aerial Photos, Password and Countersign, Terrain Analysis and Navigation, Employment of Snipers, Battalion Mission, Supporting Arms, Air Support, Rules of Engagement, Troop Conduct, MACV Rules of Engagement, Vietnamese Armed Forces, Spot Reports, Ambushes and Counter Ambushes, Demolitions and Destruction of Booby Traps, Booby Traps, Booby Trap Lane, Compass, Small Unit Tactics, Employment of Chemical Agents, Motor Transport, Supplies, Discarded Equipment, Armory, Engineers, Civil Affairs, Psychological Warfare, Vietnamese Customs/Personal Response, Chieu Hoi Program, Scouts, Pacification, Assisting Vietnamese People, Conduct/Attitude Toward Vietnamese Nationals, Vietnamese Political Parties, Off Limit Areas, Prostitution, Narcotics, Alcohol, Logal Assistance, Accidental Discharges, Loss of Weapons, Buddy Aid, Heat Casualties, Personal Hygiene, Preventative Medicine, Venereal Disease, Anti-Malaria Measures, Military Decorum, Local Regulations, Military Courtesy and Discipline, Weapons Safety, 60mm Mortar, Claymore Mines, Grenade Safety and M-26 Fragmentation Grenade, M-16 M1 Rifle, Care and Cleaning, Battalion Range Regulations, Fan Firing, Zeroing of Weapons, and Quick Fire/Quick Kill.

(2) 3 day course. Conducted for replacement personnel joining the Battalion from other "in country" commands. This training was designed to disseminate requirements and tactics relevant to the Battalion's TAOR. One Hundred Fifty Eight Marines including three Corpsmen completed this course during the month of February. The subjects included: Tactical Update, Legal Considerations, Vietnamese Relations, Religion and Personal Welfare, Quick Fire/Quick Kill, Military Bearing and Leadership, Booby Trap Lane, Countermeasures for Mines and Booby Traps, Night Fire "X", CCG Brief, Communications Security,

Personal Affairs and Logistics.

c. During the month of February 337 men including 77 Corpsmen underwent Practical Application on the Battalions Booby Trap Lane.

d. During February 337 men used the Battalion 1000 inch using Quick/Fire-Quick/Kill Technique and fam firing of Individual weapons. Additionally 52 persons fam fired the .45 Cal Pistol.

e. During February four (4) men satisfactorily completed the Resident Course of Instructions on Mine and Booby Traps as conducted by 1st Engineer Battalion.

f. Additionally one officer completed Embarkation Officers Course and two enlisted men completed the NCO Leadership Course.

SECTION 3
LOGISTICS

1. Logistics

a. During February, resupply of operating units was accomplished by helicopter and trucks. There were a total of 176 helicopter resupply lifts with a combined total weight of 362,140 pounds. Trucks logged approximately 7,913 road miles.

b. There were twenty work orders completed during the month. There was a total of forty (40) barrels renewed within the Battalion area for urinal and excrete purposes.

c. One new work order was submitted during the month, to grade area adjacent to the enlisted mess club.

d. During the month of February, the Battalion's Laundry Unit washed and dried approximately 15,250 pounds of clothing.

2. Motor Transport

a. As of 28 February 1971, seven M274 mules are on deadline. One in (FSR) Third Echelon Maintenance Shop. Two in transit to Third Echelon Maintenance and one (MOR-2) awaiting parts. There are presently one M151 Jeep deadline in (FSR) Third Echelon Maintenance, one for breaks. There is one M151 deadline for transit to (FSR) Third Echelon, for rear differential.

b. At present there are no M274 mules over T/E. We are also no M151 jeeps over T/E.

c. At present we have no personnel over F/E.

d. At this time we have five M274 mules in operation, totaling all M274 mule runs. All other mules are administratively deadline.

3. Supply

a. During the month of February, one 2511 rotated, two 3041 and one 3051 rotated, three 3051 joined the section.

b. Sufficient quotas of 27 and 47 cubic embark boxes were received during the month to embark the Battalion. Supply is currently replacing all old mount-out boxes.

c. Process 39 personal effects 14 of which were walking.

SECTION F
CIVIL AFFAIRS/CIVIC ACTION

1. Civil Affairs/Civic Action

a. Public Works. The month of February was a very active one in the area of public works. Eighteen (18) 2X4s and ten (10) 4X4s of plywood were delivered to Le Son for the construction of the dispensary being built there. Two truckloads of salvaged lumber was gathered up at "Stack Areas" and used to repair five (5) houses at Hui Kim Son. Construction of the village office in Hai An is nearing completion. S-5 to this date has furnished twenty-three (23) 1X4 boards and fifteen (15) lbs of nails for this project. A total of 175 man hours were spent assisting the various villages on this project by the S-5 personnel.

b. Welfare. During February a total of 39,450 dollars Vietnamese money was paid for local hire by the AIC (Assistance in Kind) employment fund. This program accomplishes two basic things; first, it enables needy Vietnamese to earn money on a daily basis for their food and living expenses, secondly, it provides a ten man work force that can perform many of the menial tasks throughout the cantonment i.e. area police, burning of feces, etc., which frees that many more Marines for other tasks. At the present there are twelve (12) Vietnamese civilians working for the Battalion under the Assistance in Kind program. They work and are paid on a daily basis, and receive a minimum of 150 Vietnamese dollars per day.

c. Education With the completion of the schools in Tam Luv and Le Son, the S-5 has on a weekly basis, arranged for the U.S. Army H.E. (Hamlet Education) team to show movies to the children. The movies are based around the theme "A Better World through Education". The H.E. team has shown films to a total of 725 children in the above mentioned schools and the school at Hui Kim Son. Fifteen school kits were distributed to school children in Tam Luv. These kits contain the basic necessities (pencils, paper, eraser) to assist the children in accomplishing their schooling.

d. Health. Because of the vast number of people in our TAOR, S-5 has made an increased effort to treat as many people as possible during the past month. A daily medical is run in the S-5 office, this little dispensary treated 270 people. In addition to this 1205 Vietnamese civilians were treated in field medevacs throughout our TAOR. The U.S. Air Force medevac and dental team conducted a medevac in Le Son which treated 331 people in one day. Eleven Vietnamese civilians were medevaced to Province hospital in Da Nang. A total of 102 civilians were treated by U.S. dentists, 94 Vietnamese civilians were treated by the Air Force dentist at Le Son, and 8 civilians were treated by the dentist

at this Battalion. In addition, S-5 sought the services of a Veterinarian from the 175th Veterinarian detachment to treat livestock at Thai Cam. A total of 18 cows, 1 water bull, and 60 hogs were treated and inoculated.

e. Security. One case of hand illumination canisters was delivered to the PSDF (Peoples Self Defense Force) at Xuan Tra to aid the villagers in spotting the enemy during the periods of poor illumination. Two hundred leaflets were distributed to the children of Nui Kim Son, concerning safety while walking on roads.

f. Solatium. A total of 8,000 Vietnamese dollars was paid for the death of Pham Thi Phu a Vietnamese civilian who was killed by a sentry on OP WEST outside our cantonment. This payment was made by the Battalion to show our sympathy and to help the immediate family. III MAF Claims Investigation Team will make the final payment of 150,000 Vietnamese dollars to the family.

g. Personal Response. A total of ten (10) boxes of mixed C-rations, two cases of baby food, and large can of candy was given to the Sacred Heart Orphanage to aid the needy children there. Da Nang Culture Tours are scheduled as often as possible to give Marines a better view of how the Vietnamese people live.

h. PSYOPS. During February, psyops were fully by the S-5 in conjunction with the S-3. The H.B. team was utilized 14 times. This team participated along with the S-5 personnel on four (4) Cordon and Search operations. The remainder of the time was spent on medcaps conducted by S-5 personnel. Early Word was utilized two (2) times at Le Son, on February 16 to announce the Air Force medcap and dentcap teams presence. The airdrop of leaflets in our AO totaled 65,000 leaflets dropped. Also a total of 12,000 leaflets were hand distributed throughout our AO. The Armed Propaganda Team consisting of fifteen (15) Chieu Hoi personnel, were utilized the entire month of February. This team worked extremely well in their mission. They secured a list of VC, conducted a census of the villages and hamlets and provided intelligence information to S-2. The APT team worked with the CUPP units in an effort to increase our relations with the Vietnamese. This team was utilized in Bich Nam, Bich Nam (2), Duc Ky (1), Bich Bach, Ky Mien, and Thai Cam (2). This team also was utilized as part of the search team on a Cordon and Search operation in Le Son.

COMMUNICATIONS

1. Communications

a. During the month of February, the Communications Platoon provided and maintained all normal communications for the Battalion. The month of February was a month of transition for the Communications Platoon experiencing almost a 50% turnover of personnel due to early rotations to COMUS, transfer to the Fifth Marines, plus an influx of replacements from the Fifth Marines and from state-side. While maintaining normal communications, the Communications Platoon has been and will continue to stress section unity and training in order to prepare the unit for its move to HILL 34 in March and its eventual embarkation.

b. Radio Relay Section. The Radio Relay Section continued to provide a means by which land line and message traffic could be sent to regiment. Radio Relay had a total of 1.1% down time, .6% which could be attributed to Regiment, .5% which could be attributed to 2d Battalion, 1st Marines.

c. Radio Section. The Radio Section continued to provide normal radio communications within and outside the Battalion. The turnover of personnel has created a slip in the operational performance of the section, steps are being taken to train these new personnel and hopefully the section will be unified and ready for HILL 34 and embarkation. The Radio Section received a 90 day supply of BA-4386's. The Radio Section is presently engaged in an extensive inventory of all equipment, accountability records and preventive maintenance records.

d. Wire Section. During the month of February the Wire Section maintained the Battalion switchboard and performed normal maintenance of all telephone equipment. During the time period the Wire Section completed the 2nd Echelon of all T4-312, installed an extension in the Commanding Officer's office and accounted for all phones by serial numbers. The Wire Section received a new Section Chief, Sergeant HICKS who is succeeding Sergeant REAIS who is scheduled to be transferred to Fifth Marines.

e. Message Center Section. Teletype and courier service for the reporting period totaled thirty-nine messages sent and 822 messages received. Because of continual equipment failure the Message Center had a total of 69 hours and 06 minutes down time. The down time is broken down as indicated below:

1. Medical and Dental

a. The Battalion Surgeons are Lt. R. D. COX, MC, USNR and Lt. R. L. FROEB, MC, USNR. The Battalion Chief is HMG C. W. PELUSO, USN. During this reporting period the Battalion had three officers (Two (2) Medical Corps, and One (1) Chaplain Corps), and fifty-one enlisted in the field and garrison.

b. The Battalion Aid Station treated five hundred and eighty-five patients during the month. The Division Preventive Medicine Units Monthly Sanitation Inspection Report was submitted and the discrepancies were noted and corrected.

c. Analysis of mortality figures reveals that there were zero USMC KIA, three USMC DOW, twenty USMC WIA, eleven NBC, zero USMC DAI, five USMC WAINE, and zero USMC MIA. There was zero USN KIA, two USN WIA, and zero USN NBC.

d. Analysis of routine treatment revealed eighty-two cases of diarrhea, one hundred and twenty-two cases of upper respiratory infection, twenty-seven cases of foot disorders, thirty cases of skin disorders, eight cases of Gonorrhoea, two cases of fever of undetermined origin, zero cases of immersion foot, one case of malaria, and no hepatitis. There were one hundred and ninety Dental patients seen.

e. The civilian medical program was active. There were one thousand two hundred and seventy-two Vietnamese civilians and nine Vietnamese civilians were treated for dental reasons.

f. There were nine USMC, and six Vietnamese civilians, and zero wounded Viet Cong evacuated.

g. There was a total of sixty-seven patients sent on consultation to 1st Medical Battalion, or 95th Evacuation Hospital.

h. There were five dental patients sent to 1st Medical Battalion on consultation.

i. The Chaplain attended three meetings at the Division Chaplain's office, and one Protestant Retreat at XVI Corps.

j. Liaison was continued during the month with various Army and Air Force Chaplains as well as adjacent Marine Chaplains.

k. In civic action the Chaplain participated in services at the Vietnamese Protestant Church of An Hoa. He also made two visits to China Beach Protestant Orphanage and two visits to Sacred Heart Catholic Orphanage. During those visits canned goods, soap, candy, clothes, and cooling tile were donated.

- (1) On 1 February Fox 3, Golf 2, Echo 3, and the 134th RF's loc BT084664 on 011330H to 021400H conducted a ground cordon with a heliborne assault on an area that intelligence had targeted as a VC meeting site. On the initial pass over the area the HCA containing the Battalion Commander spotted three VC with AK-47's and a large group of male and female Vietnamese. One of the VC fired at the HCA, the HCA returning fire. The HCA was hit and disabled but glided to the ground before burning. All personnel escaped unscratched from this event. The 134th RF Group and Echo 2 arrived and conducted a search of the area, finding and killing two VC/NVA. Echo 2 and Golf 2 were helolifted into the area and established a cordon. Three VC were found lying underwater breathing through reeds. Eight other detainees were sent to the Battalion rear and turned over to ITT/CIT.
- (2) On 2 February Echo 2 PCP loc BT077662 spotted movement to the front of their position to the cordon. Marines fired M-16 and M-79 which resulted in one VC/NVA confirmed kill. One M-26 was found on him. The next morning another sweep of the area produced one AK-47 and one PRC-25 radio.
- (3) On 9 February Hotel 1 began 5-day rehabilitation program with 36 men strong.
- (4) On 12 February CIT intelligence agent turned in one AK-47 secured from the village of Nui Kim Son at BT068706.
- (5) Major General ROBERTSON visited 2d Battalion, 1st Marines and Cupp Taylor.
- (6) On 19 February at the Hamlet of Binh Ky, a sickness among numerous people was reported. Upon further investigation by doctors the sickness was found to be Bubonic Plague. All Marines were moved from area and Hoa Vang District Officials and the Vietnamese government took over the problem.
- (7) On 23 February Golf Company affected a cordon and search operation at Mieu Dong loc BT021681. Five VC/NVA suspects were detained and two command detonated booby traps, four "toe popper" booby trap devices, two M-26 grenades, five VC utility uniforms and numerous other items were found.
- (8) On 26 February Fox Company with 02 platoons of Popular Forces, Cupp Taylor, Hoa Vang District Officials, advisors, ITT, S-2 and S-5 personnel conducted a cordon and search of Le Son.
- (9) On 28 February Golf 2 began five day rehabilitation period.







Cupp Wiggins returned fire and called in 81mm HE mission on AT995627.
- 0315 CUPP CP loc AT965605 on 312200H. CP North observed that 796 RF Co. CP. located at Golden Gate Bridge was attacked and the bridge destroyed.
- 0845 Golf-1C loc BT030694 on 010845H. While moving to new PCP, the point man tripped a trip wire to one M-26 booby trap. The booby trap was buried on the side of a gulley and had negative delay. The point man received multiple fragmentation wounds to arm and leg. One emergency medevac was called and completed.
- 1330 Fox 3, Golf 2, Echo 3, Echo 2 and 134th RF's loc BT084664 on 011330H to 021400H. Fox 3 conducted a heliborne assault on an area that intelligence had targeted as a VC meeting site. On the initial pass over the area the HCA spotted three VC with AK-47's and a large group of young male and female Vietnamese. One of the VC fired at the HCA and the HCA returned fire. The HCA was hit and disabled but was glided to the ground where it was totally burned. All personnel escaped from the helicopter with the only injury being a superficial wound to the pilot. The 134th RF Group and Echo 2 arrived and conducted a search of the area. The RF's found and killed two VC/NVA. Echo 3 and Golf 2 were later helolifted into the area and a cordon was established around the area. Seventy detainees were screened and eight were taken to Battalion Rear for further interrogation. Three other detainees were later found lying underwater breathing through reeds. The night of February 2nd, the RF's swept the area of Echo 2's contact and found one AK-47, one PRC-25 radio and some documents. The radio was set on the frequency 43.70.
- 1500 Woodstock loc BT078695 on 011500H. Woodstock observed a large number of people moving north towards the above grid from an area of RF operation. Two special liaison patrols were dispatched to screen persons. Twenty-one persons were retained and are being processed at the present.
