2. Commander's Narrative Summary of Significant Events

a. As the present reporting period began the 1st Antitank Battalion (-) was preparing to deploy to Okinawa with other units of the 1st Marine Division (Rein)(Rear). The Battalion at that time was comprised of H&S Company and Company B (-). Prior to the beginning of the reporting period 2nd Platoon, Company B and 3rd Platoon, Company B were attached to BLT's 2/5 and 3/5 respectively. 1st Platoon, Company B had deployed to Kaneohe with BLT 1/5 in July, 1965.

b. The organization for embarkation put this Battalion in Embarkation Unit Charlie, commanded by Col. C.F. WIDDECKE, Commanding Officer RLT-5.

c. Lt Col W. MOORE, Commanding Officer, 1st Antitank Battalion was designated Commander, Embarkation Team Charlie-1. Embarkation Team Charlie-1 embarked aboard the USS Talladega (APA-208) and sailed from Long Beach on 14 January 1966, and CHOPPED to Commanding General, FMFPAC on the same date.

d. Capt J.E. FELKER, Commanding Officer, Company B (-), 1st Antitank Battalion was designated Commander, Embarkation Team Charlie - 3. Embarkation Team Charlie - 3 embarked aboard the USS St Clair County (LST-1096) sailed from San Diego on 14 January 1966, and CHOPPED to Commanding General, FMFPAC on the same date.

e. While aboard the USS Talladega, the 1st Antitank Battalion Staff functioned as the Embarkation Team Charlie-1 Staff, coordinating all troop activity aboard that ship. Worthy of note was the ambitious training program initiated and run under the direction of the AT Battalion S-3. This is discussed under Detailed Description of Significant Events.

f. Embarkation Team Charlie-1 debarked at White Beach Okinawa on 5 February 1966 and CHOPPED to Commanding General 1st Marine Division (Rein). The Battalion was stationed at Camp Hansen.

g. Embarkation Team Charlie-3 debarked at Naha on 14 February 1966 and CHOPPED to Commanding General, 1st Marine Division. Company B (-) rejoined the Battalion at Camp Hansen.

h. Upon arrival of the 1st Antitank Battalion on Okinawa, Company A (-), 1st Antitank Battalion was rejoined ADCON & OPCON. Company A (-) was comprised of its headquarters and 3rd Platoon, Company A, 3rd Antitank Battalion.

i. Capt G. R. VAN HORN relieved 1st Lt D. F. FEENEY as Company Commander, Company A (-) on 8 February 1966. 1st Lt FEENEY was assigned as Company A (-) Executive Officer.

j. After arriving on Okinawa, the Battalion began a full-scale counter-guerrilla warfare training program. All hands went through the Jungle Lane at Camp Schwab. Forty men participated in the oneday Landmine Warfare, Demolitions and Boobytrap course run by the 1st Engineer Battalion on 10 February 1966. Fifteen Marines of this Battalion attended Counter-guerrilla Warfare School at the Northern Training Area 24 February - 28 February. Command Post Defense drills were held on the afternoon and evening of 28 February.

3. Detailed Description of Significant Events

a. Shipboard Training

Training aboard the USS Talladega was conducted by all units of Embarkation Team Charlie - I. The program was initiated and coordinated by Major A.J. EAGAN, S - 3 of this Battalion.

On 17 January the section remained in their security positions around the artillery battery. On 18 January they escorted another convoy to Chu Lai and returned to the artillery position. Upon their return to the artillery position information had been received ordering the battery back to Chu Lai. At 1700 the entire convoy returned to Chu Lai completing our mission.

c. The 3rd Platoon in support of 3/7 has been manning positions on the MLR at (BT525024) and (BT549016). A light section is positioned at each location. Each night, prior to sunset two Ontos along with a fire team, patrol around the dump and up and down route #1 to insure that all the local people are out of the area.

b. At this date, Company "C", has one ontos deadlined for seven (7) track sections. There is not one (1) section available for the ontos in the Chu Lai area. Missions were available for all platoons both in patrols, convoy escorts, and major operations. However, all operating has been curtailed because of the complete unavailability of track sections. In ten (10) days one entire platoon will not be able to man positions on the MLR because it won't have the track to drive one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) mile into position.



1. Purpose. To promulgate a thorough training program for troops embarked aboard ship.
2. Self Cancellation. 15 March 1966.
3. General. Officers and Staff Noncommissioned Officers are responsible for ensuring that each Marine within his command/section participate in the training aboard ship. Each Marine is expected to achieve a proficiency commensurate with his rank and time in service. Knowledge of the general military subjects must be reviewed and increased. Knowledge of each Marine's occupation specialty must be refined to a capability of employment expected of a member of the finest fighting force in the world.
4. Scope. General Military Training is defined as training in those basic military skills which are an essential part of the professional tools of the Marine. Each individual Marine must become thoroughly competent, through training and practice, in the General Military subjects as outlined in Enclosure (1). In addition, each individual Marine must become thoroughly proficient in his specialty through training and practice as directed by the officer and staff in charge of the section.
5. Policy.
 - a. No individual will be excused from those subjects made mandatory by reference (a). These subjects are marked by an asterisk on enclosure (1).
 - b. Due to the shortage of training hours and space, cooperation between the commands/sections and assistant training non-commissioned officers is imperative.
 - c. Those hours designated as Section Training are available to section and will be utilized by each section to the utmost for bringing the individual Marine up to required standards.
6. Continuity. The following elements of this order are prescribed to insure a smooth flow of this training program. Complete compliance with these instructions is expected.

- a. All training will be conducted in accordance with enclosure (2).
- b. All training conducted will be planned, scheduled and supervised by the Training Officers and Assistant Training Non-Commissioned Officers.
- c. All designated instructors will prepare a lesson plan for approval by the training Officer. Each training NCO will submit a roll call sheet to the Training Officer immediately upon completion of the scheduled training.
- d. There will be periodic monitoring by the Training Officer in addition to that which will be conducted by the Embarkation C1 Team Training Staff. An officer monitor will be assigned on a daily basis for all training by a separate directive.
- e. The training NCO's will record and maintain the records of all training accomplished during those periods designated as Section Training. The records will be submitted to the Training Officer prior to 1700 daily, signed by the section training NCO. The following is a list of necessary training records.
- (1) A copy of each lesson plan.
 - (2) Roll Call roster for each class period.
 - (3) Daily record of training accomplished.
- f. A daily training report of attendance and training accomplished will be prepared by the Training Officer to be submitted to Embarkation C1 Team Training Officer.
- g. Staff Non-Commissioned Officers and NCO's are required to demonstrate their proficiency at a level commensurate with their rank. These NCO's will attend mandatory classes.

Objective. To insure that the individual Marine has a basic knowledge of elementary first aid with emphasis on the medical & sanitary problems in Viet Nam.

- Scope.
- (1) General and specific sanitation problems in Viet Nam.
 - (2) General instruction, hemorrhage, asphyxiation, shock and poisoning.
 - (3) Wounds, injuries to bones, joints and muscles.
 - (4) Heat cases and emersion foot.

*4. INFANTRY WEAPONS. (4 Hours)

Objective. To insure the individual Marine has a thorough working knowledge of the basic infantry weapons, including safety precautions.

- (1) Thorough knowledge of the M-14.
 - (2) Thorough knowledge of the U. S. Pistol, Cal. 45
 - (3) Familiarization of the 3.5 Rocket Launcher.

*5. SCOUTING AND PATROLLING (5 Hours)

Objective. To insure that the individual Marine has a thorough working knowledge of the basic elements of scouting, patrolling, and handling of prisoners of war.

- Scope.
- (1) Basic elements of individual movement in scouting and patrolling.
 - (2) Reports, warning and patrol orders.
 - (3) The capture, handling, and processing of prisoners of war.

*6. SMALL UNIT TACTICS (6 Hours)

Objective. To insure that the individual Marine has a thorough working knowledge of the basic principles of small unit tactics.

- Scope. (1) The organization of the fire team and duty of the members of the team.
 (2) The organization of the rifle squad.
 (3) The basic combat formations of the rifle squad in offensive combat.
 (4) The deployment of the rifle squad in defensive combat.

*7. STUDY OF GEOGRAPHY, CLIMATE, AND MORES OF VIET NAM. (5 Hours)

Objective. To familiarize the individual Marine with a general knowledge of the geography, climate, and mores of Viet Nam.

 (3) The mores of the people; and breakdown of various regional tribes and customs.

- Scope. (1) Review and explanation of basic rights.
 (2) Explanation of those articles involving misconduct before the enemy.
 (3) Explanation of those articles covering the conduct of sentries.

*9. CIVIC ACTION. (5 Hours)

Objective. To insure the individual Marine has a thorough knowledge of the concept of civic action as currently employed.

- Scope. (1) The individual Marine's responsibility to conduct civic actions.




