1. GENERAL OVERVIEW OF ALL ACTIVITIES

7. LOGISTICS

a. Construction of eight (8) SEA Huts in the Battery Headquarters area (LZ BALDY) was completed late in November 1969.

b. One (1) gun pad was completed and one (1) partially completed at the "C" Platoon position at LZ BALDY.

c. Due to deteriorated road conditions, resupply from the DANANG complex was poor. Condition of the road and heavy mining activity from LZ BALDY to LZ ROSS has also increased problems of resupply to "B" Platoon. Resupply at AN HOA COMBAT BASE is by air only.

d. Resupply and movement of personnel between DANANG, LZ BALDY, LZ ROSS and AN HOA COMBAT BASE by air was hampered somewhat due to weather conditions.

8. COMMUNICATIONS-ELECTRONICS. No problems.9. EQUIPMENT. Maintenance problems are compounded by the combination of old howitzers and vehicles and difficulty is supply of repair parts.10. CIVIC ACTION. None

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11. PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATION. The Battery joined 5 Officers and 26 Enlisted and transferred 28 Enlisted. The Operating Percentage (of manning level) of Officers is 133%; Enlisted 109%.

12. TRAINING. Maximum general subject and technical training consistent with the tactical situation was conducted.
