

On 25 June, 1967, the platoon of 155 Howitzers (SP), from L Battery, 4th Battalion, 12th Marines was released from OPCON of the 155mm Gun platoon at GIA LE.

On 29 June, 1967, the platoon of 155mm Guns was moved from its position at GIA LE, 3rd Engineers compound at (YD 829153) and took up a position at (YD 716106) in continued support of Operation CUMBERLAND.

During the month of June, the battery continued to improve its defensive positions and defensive counter-attack plans. Two bunkers were rebuilt and numerous fighting holes were added. The battery's extensive wire laying effort has continued with resulting thicknesses in many areas approaching 70 ft. Other wire has been laid to better channelize the enemy into predesigned killing zones. Extensive perimeter white lighting has also been erected with a range of 300 meters.

As part of the battery's overall security measures the battery ran 7 patrols and put out 13 listening posts.

4. Bunkers & Perimeter Security. During the month of June the battery acquired another 15mm mortar for use in illuminating the perimeter. Two local security bunkers were rebuilt and numerous individual fighting holes were constructed.

5. Water. The battery continues to truck water from the Division water point.

031110H June67 - Fired 10 rounds 155mm Gun HE at VC position vic YD 018005. Good effect on target. Fire mission for 3rd Battalion, 26th Marines.

042230H June67 - Fired 3 rounds 155mm Gun HE at suspected VC lights vic YD 901012. Rounds on target, lights extinguished. Fire mission for 3rd Recon Battalion.

090010H June67 - Fired 20 rounds 155mm Gun HE at VC mortars firing vic YD 862223. Mortars silenced, no more incoming. Fired for 2nd Battalion, 26th Marines.

120800H June67 - Fired 15 rounds 155mm Gun HE at 3 VC on road vic YD 892988. Rounds on target. Fire mission for 3rd Recon Battalion.

240935H June67 - Fired 10 rounds 155mm Gun HE and 2 rounds 155mm Gun WP at VC bunkers and fortified positions vic YD 624188. Very good coverage. Fire mission for 3rd Recon Battalion.

280610H June67 - Fired 25 rounds 155mm Gun HE and 25 rounds 155mm Gun WP at enemy caves, tunnels, and spidertraps vic YD 735140. Good effect on target. Fire mission for 2nd Battalion, 26th Marines.

291230H June67 - Fired 21 rounds 155mm Gun HE at VC storage huts vic YD 875908. Huts destroyed. Fire mission for 3rd Recon Battalion.
