(f) On 29 April 1966, 50% of the Shock-Resuscitation Team's equipment was deployed to the U. S. Air Force Base at Dong Ha, Republic of Vietnam to set up for the receiving of casualties from that area. On 30 April 1966, the remaining equipment and supplies of the Shock-Resuscitation Team was moved to Dong Ha along with the teams personnel under the charge of LCDR R. W. KNAPP, MC, USN. LT R.
