3. Significant Eventsa. Logistics

- (1) Received a January CRITAPAK.
- (2) 173 Jungle Hammocks were received for testing and evaluation.
- (3) 176 PX Ration Supplement (Bundled) were received.

b. Civil Affairs

- (1) The battalion continued to support a library program for the HOA VANG High School. The material for the library is donated by the IVA ALICE MANN Junior High School in Tacoma, Washington and distributed through the battalion.
- (2) The battalion distributed toys at the PHU THONG Orphanage and completed plans for a proposed cafeteria and kitchen to be built for the children by this unit.
- (3) The battalion doctor treated 150 citizens at the PHU THONG XI Refugee Center.

4. Operations

- a. The 3rd Reconnaissance Battalion in general support of the 3rd Marine Division, maintained its elements deployed around the periphery of the Division's TARR's.
- b. Company A conducted reconnaissance patrols for a total of 38 platoon patrol days during the month of January, reporting 16 significant sightings that included 12 VC and 19 VCS. Campsites, caves, fighting holes and numerous trails were located and reported. One contact with the enemy resulted in no friendly or enemy casualties. The company conducted intensive training in reconnaissance skills from 13 - 19 January 1966. (Enclosures 11-18).
- c. Company C conducted one company size operation in support of Operation LONG LANCE and conducted reconnaissance patrols for a total of 50 platoon patrol days during the month of January.

The company reported 15 significant sightings totalling 103 VC and 114 VCS. Enemy harbor sites and new landing zones were located. Three contacts with the Viet Cong resulted in (1) one enemy killed while no Marine casualties were sustained. The company conducted intensive training in reconnaissance skills from 31 December 1965 - 5 January 1966. (Enclosures 19-30).

- d. Company D conducted reconnaissance patrols for a total of 40 patrol days for the month of January 1966. They had two significant sightings totalling 2 VC and 15 VCS. New trails, booby traps, and harbor sites were located and reported. Two contacts with the enemy resulted in 2 VC killed and 1 VC wounded while no Marine casualties were sustained. Two weapons, documents and a knife were captured. The company conducted intensive training in reconnaissance skills from 6-12 January 1966. (Enclosures 30-39).
- e. Reconnaissance Group Alfa located at C-1-1 consists of Company B (-), 3rd Reconnaissance Battalion and Company C, 1st Reconnaissance Battalion. Reconnaissance Group Alfa conducted reconnaissance patrols for a total of 70 patrol days during the month of January reporting 36 significant sightings, totalling 26 VC and 61 VCS. During this period the Group located harbor sites, enemy training camps, fighting holes and panji pits. One contact with the enemy resulted in one VC killed and the capture of a rifle and cartridge belt. Artillery strikes called by the patrols were thought to have killed 5 Viet Cong. One Marine was KIA by a mine. (Enclosures 40 - 57).
- f. 1st Force Reconnaissance Company operating out of Army Special Forces Camps at TRA BONG (BS 3487) and BA TO (BS 5633) conducted reconnaissance patrols for a total of 15 patrol days during the month of January 1966. They reported 13 significant sightings totalling 77 VC and 1 VCS. The patrols located harbor sites, landing zones and numerous new trails. Three contacts with the enemy resulted in 11 VC killed, and 1 VC wounded while the Marines suffered one KIA, one WIA and two MIA. (Enclosures 58 - 63).

A six inch piece of primer cord with a blasting cap was also found. The grenades were thrown into the river and the blasting cap was buried. A wooden box marked "mines AP M2A462" was also found in the same building. It was empty and appeared to have been there for some time.
- (3) 050800H at coordinates (AT 855855), two metal cans were found sitting under a bush. They contained fishing gear, two quart pottery jars of rock salt, Nuoc Mom and grease. A bag containing two ponchos was also found. They were destroyed along with the rest of the gear.
- (4) At 050830H at coordinates (AT 856857) a newly made bamboo raft was found. It was approximately six feet by 8 feet, made of bamboo tied together with vines. It was left in place.
- (5) At 050900H at coordinates (AT 856857), six women carrying heavy baskets moved down to the raft. They cut 2 long bamboo poles, launched the raft and crossed the river. After approximately 1 hour they returned with their baskets filled with bananas and other greens. They moved Southwest to Route 14.
- (6) At 052115H at coordinates (AT 814853) the patrol was moving down the road and received fire from approximately 3 carbines from behind a rock slide on the road. The patrol returned fire and moved forward. Approximately 30 rounds of M-14 ammo and 2 grenades were used. The enemy broke contact and moved South. No further signs of them were found. No casualties were found on either side.

(2) The trail at that coordinates appeared well used with cooking fire remnants all along it. Many sandal and barefoot tracks were seen. On the night of the 6th of January incoming H & I fires fragments landed in the trees around the patrol.

Two VC that had previously been observed moving North up the hill with full packs approximately 3 hours earlier were observed moving South with empty packs. Uniforms of the VC were mixed civilian clothing, camouflaged utilities, utilities and khaki. One VC wore a khaki uniform with heavy leather belt and shoulder strap, holster and pistol. The VC always grouped at the top of the hill prior to small groups moving down the trail. The man with the khaki uniform and leather belt could be seen standing up with others grouped around walking back and forth. Others seemed to be kneeling behind rocks and bushes only their heads visible. The groups came down the hill as if dispatched at regular intervals. During approximately a 36 hour period that the patrol manned the OP, approximately 140 to 160 VC were actually seen during periods of fair visibility. Traffic seemed even heavier during the night than during the day. It is estimated that one out of every four VC sighted carried a weapon. Almost all had cartridge belts and grenades. Some had only packs, and a few carried wooden boxes about the size of our 3.5 cube boxes. Weapons sighted include Chicom Carbines, U.S. Carbines, M-1 rifles and French Sub-machine guns.

(11) 031245H during a break in the clouds the VC could be seen entering the village of PHU HUONG (2) at coordinates (AT 826570). Drums and shouting could be heard from the village as the VC entered.

(12) 040945H at coordinates (AT 833597), four VC established an OP. One man had a U.S. Carbine, the other 3 had M-14 rifles.

(13) 041000H groups of four to eight VC were seen searching the area to the Northeast, west and Southeast of the platoon OP position. All had rifles and no packs. Seven VC started down the trail in the vicinity of (AT 832596) but turned back up the hill. All had packs and weapons. One VC carried a 3.5 rocket launcher.

(14) 041130H at coordinates (AT 832596), eight VC moved down the trail directly towards the OP site. Some appeared to be wearing helmets.

(15) 041130H at coordinates (AT 833596), five VC were seen pointing directly at the OP and talking. The Plt. immediately moved Southeast into the stream bed and began a withdrawal in an Easterly direction. About 20 minutes later, seven VC were observed approximately 100 meters back up the trail behind the patrol. Five VC were seen searching the OP site. The VC opened fire into the stream bed but no casualties resulted. The fire sounded like M-2 Carbines. Seven VC ran down the trail perpendicular to the patrol's avenue of escape. The VC were taken under fire by the point and forced to take cover. They were kept pinned down by fire while the patrol crossed the trail. Seven VC pursued the patrol but were discouraged by M-14 and M-79 fire from the patrol. The seven VC were lost at approximate coordinates (AT 837587). The platoon joined Scat 3-Charlie 6 at their position.

(16) 061400H at coordinates (AT 836567), one VCS dressed in khaki ran North across the rice paddy and up the hill in advance of friendly troops entering the area.

(17) 071700H at coordinates (AT 833576), three VC moved South along the trail. Uniforms were khaki and black all carried packs.

8. RESULTS OF ENCOUNTERS WITH THE ENEMY: One VC KIA, one probable KIA, one VC wounded, no friendly casualties.
9. CONDITION OF PATROL, INCLUDING DISPOSITION OF ANY DEAD OR WOUNDED: Morale good and condition good.
10. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS:

Conclusion: This area appears to be used as a very large harbor site. The trail shown on the attached overlay is a main supply route into the hills. The villagers appear to be quite friendly with the VC as noted by the drums and shouting as the VC entered the village.




Communications were poor in the area of grid square (AT 8359). Transmission was on the PRC 25 and receiving was done on PRC 10.





 - b. Two sightings were made of people carrying boxes that looked like 3.5 rocket launcher ammunition boxes. These boxes were buried and made to look like graves.
 - c. Two sightings were of Vietnamese people moving into areas recently vacated by friendly infantry units. They were policing up the area for communication wire and other equipment left behind.

6. OBSERVATION OF ENEMY AND TERRAIN:

- a. 031120H at coordinates (AT 881579), 167 VN's in various colored clothing, predominately black and white, were seen standing on hill 65. They all seemed to have their attention focused on one man dressed in a white shirt and black trousers. Only three weapons were observed in the group, however, there are two ARVN out posts on that hill, so possibly it could have been ARVN troops with weapons. They disappeared from that area during a period of low visibility at approximately 031230H.
- b. 031505H at coordinates (AT 881579) 180 VN returned to the same position on hill 65. At about 031700H they moved East North East to a small village at coordinates (AT 882577). Some of the VN's moved West towards the village of NUI DAT at coordinates (AT 877577).
- c. 041800H at coordinates (AT 888596), 2 VCS with heavy packs crossed the river in a small boat. They moved about 75 meters Northwest. One moved into the bushes and the other sat down in the open. Both wore black clothing and coolie hats. The one in the open put on something green in color over his clothes and changed to a green hat. At approximately 041900H they both moved out in a Northwesterly direction and disappeared around the finger of a hill. The man in black did not have a hat on when he came out of the brush.
- d. 051417H at coordinates (AT 884540), 3 VCS crossed the river in a small boat. One VCS took the boat back to the other side, while the other two moved along the dike in a Northerly direction. Both wore black and 1 had a pack.
- e. 051448H in grid square (AT 8156), 2 mortar rounds, and small arms fire were observed in LZ Pelican as freindly infantry landed.
- f. 051440H at coordinates (AT 901601), three VC moved East, all three wore black and all had rifles.
- g. 051500H at coordinates (AT 881579), a large crowd of VN were again sighted standing on hill 69. One man again commanded their attention. No weapons were seen.
- h. 051819H at coordinates (AT 897600), 2 VN were seen crossing the river in a boat. One moved Northeast carrying a large pack or box. He was wearing black but had no hat.
- i. 061615H at coordinates (AT 912587), 17 VN were seen moving South carrying large bundles.
- j. 070715H at (AT 915575), tracer rounds and drum beats were seen

and heard from the village of AN DONG. The tracer rounds were going straight up in the air. (Possibly ricochet)

k. 070829H at coordinates (AT 879597), 6 VN were seen carrying two boxes about the size of 3.5 rocket launcher ammunition boxes. They were buried at these coordinates, 3 VN were dressed in white, and 3 in blue.

l. 071025H at coordinates (AT 887584), 10 VN carrying 2 red boxes about the size of a 3.5 ammo box, stopped and dug a hole approximately 3 1/2 feet deep and buried the boxes. The holes after the burial were made to look like graves.

m. 071532H at (AT 913588), small arms fire was heard. 2 bodies were observed, dressed in black, being carried away to the South on the trail, possibly by ARVN. People were seen evacuating the village of HOA DUAN (1) in all directions.

n. 031310H at coordinates (AT 908606), on hill 75 North approximately 25 men, women, and children were seen policing up the hill after the friendly infantry unit left the area. They picked up trash, communication wire, and equipment left behind. At least 1 shelter half was seen being picked up. At 1317H 2 more VN joined the others. They wore black shorts and shirts. One had a rifle and both had cartridge belts. They appeared to be concentrating on communication wire and supervising the police call. At approximately 1630H they moved down to DAI LOI (1) at coordinates (AT 898598). It was noted when they moved out that 3 VN had weapons, 4 had cartridge belts and 1 had a pack.

o. 081700H at coordinates (AT 886614), 1 VCS approached the OP site. He was fired upon and 1 grenade used, a search was initiated with negative results.

p. 090900H at coordinates (AT 907606), on hill 75, five VN's commenced police call again. They moved off the hill at approximately 1100H.

q. Except for the period during which the friendly infantry were in the area, Normal activity was noted in the rice paddies.

r. At coordinate (AT 898592), the VN kept large fires burning at all times. Large amounts of white smoke were seen. Very few lights were seen from the houses.

s. At coordinates (AT 994607) the railroad bridge has been destroyed.

t. At coordinates (AT 866574) the bridge has been destroyed only foot traffic can get through.

a. Recommend: Do not take the PRC 47 on patrol due to size, weight and extra equipment utilizing too many people, when a PRC 25 can be utilized to better advantage. The antenna for the PRC 47 is very helpful to the enemy in locating the patrols.





a. A total of 16 sightings were made during the period covered. Some of which were of VN armed with rifles and packs. However the close proximity of the ARVN outposts and positions made it very hard to distinguish if they were friendly or VC.

b. Possible mortar fire was heard on two separate occasions. At 081835H one round of possible 60 mm mortar fire landed in grid square 8861. At 092330H sounds were heard sounding like six rounds of 60 mm mortar fire from hill 75 in grid square 9060. The rounds detonated approximately 2000 to 2500 meters due east of those coordinates. No muzzle flashes were seen.

c. It was noted that at coordinates (AT 914585) boats made several trips across the river. It appeared to be a ferry service.

d. On two separate occasions VN's were observed policing up the trash on hill 75 at coordinates (AT 907605) after friendly infantry had left the area.

6. OBSERVATION OF THE ENEMY AND TERRAIN:

- a. 081300H at coord (AT 926607), four VN with weapons and fourteen or fifteen children picked up trash on hill 75 after friendly troops left the area. could possibly be ARVN or PF's.
- b. 081325H at coord (AT 902603), two VCS were observed crossing the river in two boats. One carried a rifle, the other a pack. They came from the village at coord (AT 905601). They disappeared around the Southeast side of hill 75. Both had canteens and cartridge belts.
- c. 081835H one round of possible 60 mm mortar fire landed in grid square 886L.
- d. 091000H, two men moved out of the brush and talked to the people working in the fields. There were approximately ten people and they talked to each of the ten individually for about five minutes. The two men then moved back into the brush and disappeared at coordinates (AT 909607).
- e. 091145H, ten people were seen on hill 75 at coord (AT 907605). Six were picking up "C" ration boxes while the other four stayed in a group. They wore black clothing and one appeared to have a rifle. The people moved off the hill in a Southeasterly direction and disappeared.
- f. 091410H, four VN's moved East across the river in a boat at coord (AT 914585). The VN's all wore black. The boat made several trips back and forth.
- g. 091815H, six men were observed in tow boats apparently checking inlets along the river coord (AT 897601). Four of the people wore white and two black.
- h. 091600H, as six H-34 aircraft proceeded from the West side of the valley to the East side, It appeared that they were taking automatic weapons fire.
- i. 092330H, six rounds of suspected mortar fire were fired from hill 75 in grid square 9060. They detonated approximately 2,000 2,500 meters due East of hill 75.
- j. 100850H, a large volume of automatic weapons fire was heard from grid square 9152, but could not be observed due to fog.
- k. 101500H, approximately seventy VN's moved South on the road at coord (AT 927613). They moved into AN MY (3) coord (AT 923608). A very few came out from the other side of the village. They wore various colored clothing, and carried baskets.

l. 110705H, amtracks with VN flags were observed firing on the village of MY HEIP (2) in grid square 9060.

m. 111130H, a boat with two men, one dressed in a light blue shirt and dark blue trousers, the other dressed in white, moved from West to East on the river and into an inlet and disappeared. The boat was heavy in the water and had a canvas across the center portion between the men.

n. It was noted that during the AM of 11 January there was a marked decrease of workers observed in the fields until approximately 1000H. After that time people worked in the fields, but mostly close to the residential areas.

o. Sporadic sniper fire was heard from the wooded area at coord (AT 942592) throughout the day of 11 January.

p. 111700H, three VN males, one approximately ten years old moved from the river at coord (AT 913567) to coord (AT 898508). They wore black clothing and coolie hats, and carried four large bundles of wooden stakes about three feet long and one inch in diameter. They worked in an area of about fifty meters in diameter for approximately fifteen minutes. Then walked out empty handed. The stakes were not panji stakes.

7. OTHER INFORMATION: The sniper rifle was not used due to lack of opp ortunity and close proximity of ARVN forces.

8. RESULTS OF ENCOUNTERS WITH THE ENEMY: None.

9. CONDITION OF THE PATROL: Excellent, with some sunburn.

10. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS BY PATROL:

a. Observation Posts at coordinates (AT 903607) and (AT 899616) afford good observation and good field of fire for the sniper rifle over hill 75, with good avenues of escape to the North and Northeast.

b. While operating on the company tactical frequency constant interference was received from ARVN. It was believed to be communications between the ARVN outpost on hill 65 and the ARVN defensive positions at (9157). On 11 January at 1600H the ARVN communicator, ridiculed the Company Call Sign. And on 12 January at 1100H the same communicator used English slang vulgarities six times in rapid repetition.

Recommend: Investigation of ARVN communication units within area of operations and change of frequencies.





b. Sporadic fire fights were heard on the night of 16 and 17 January, from the vicinity of hill 300 in grid square (AT 9288) and DINH LINH CHIEU Village. Fire was directed at, and returned, from, the ESSO Plant and the NUI NAM Bridge.

c. A small cooking fire and two VCS were observed on hill 300, the two VCS were seen two separate occasions.

6. OBSERVATION OF ENEMY AND TERRAIN:

a. All during the night of 16 January sporadic fire was heard from village of LIEN CHIEU and from hill 300 in grid square (AT 9288), directed at the ESSO Plant at coord (AT 935864) and the bunkers immediately to the Northwest of the plant. g. 180845H, machine gun fire was heard in the vicinity of the ESSO Plant and the NUI NAM Bridge.

h. 181115H, the same two VCS were observed walking around at coord (AT 927886).

i. 181245H, two U.S. Carbine rounds were picked up at coord (AT 908859). Both rounds were just laying on the trail.

j. 181310H, the patrol received fire from ARVN at the NUI NAM Bridge. The patrol was approximately 700 meters Northwest of the Bridge.

7. OTHER INFORMATION: No opportunity presented itself for the use of the sniper rifles or machine gun.

8. RESULTS OF ENCOUNTERS WITH THE ENEMY: None.

9. CONDITION OF PATROL: Condition, morale good.

10. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS OF PATROL:

a. Sniper teams could really be utilized in this area if given time to become familiarized with the many trails.





MISSION: To establish CP's vicinity Thanh My Trung (1) and the area vicinity BT 4006.

At 011115H, the patrol departed by helicopter from landing zone RLT-4 and were inserted in RZ #2 at 011125H at BT 400080. The patrol, on clearing the helicopter, proceeded towards the southwest. At 011700H at BT 399075 the patrol found a small cylindrical device buried in the ground. Only one-half inch was protruding from the ground. This object was approximately 1" in diameter and silver in color and was partially covered with vegetation and dirt. The patrol leader believes this may have been a booby trap. At 011730H, a patrol harboring site was occupied at BT 400075 and remained at this location till first light. The night was uneventful. At 020630H, the patrol displaced and proceeded cross-country towards the south. While enroute, the patrol discovered an old trail marker paralleling a trail at BT 401072. This was L-shaped, 3 feet high and the arm 2 feet in length with elephant grass secured at the end giving it an appearance of a broom. It had been constructed of saplings and fastened together with vines. This marker appeared old and east down a trail. At 020930H, the patrol arrived at their objective point at BT 403071. A CP/OP was immediately established. The area of observation was to the northeast in grid square BT 4006. No friendly or enemy activity was noted. The rice paddy complexes are presently overgrown and unattended. At 021830H, the patrol displaced and proceeded north to BT 403071 and occupied a harbor site at 021845H. Again, the night was uneventful. At 030700H the following morning, CP's were manned from this location affording good observation to the north in grid square BT 4007 at 030705H; the only sighting made throughout the day was 6 water buffalo grazing unattended at BT 407073. The patrol remained at this location till the following morning with no unusual occurrences that night. At 040700H, the patrol departed in an easterly direction towards hill mass 43 at BT 406068, arriving at this location at 040645H. A CP/OP was immediately manned providing excellent observation to the southwest in grid square BT 4006. During the early morning hours, no friendly or enemy activities were noted. At 041300H, the patrol displaced and headed towards the northwest where contact was made with an elderly man and woman accompanied by 2 children on a trail at BT 403071. They wore black pajamas, straw hats and were heading east on the trail. The man was carrying a cane knife. The woman a yolk stick. Their activity, equipment and appearance did not indicate that they were possibly VC or VCS. Both parties proceeded towards their destinations after the brief encounter. At 041400H, the patrol located a well concealed and dug trench at BT 403073. This trench ran generally from east to west and paralleled a trail. The trench was 5 feet deep, 4 feet wide and approximately 200 meters long. The bottom of the trench appeared smooth and well taken care of.

Natural overhead concealment was afforded by dense vegetation; this was also true along its base. The eastern end of the trench afforded good observation and fields of fire along the axis of the trail and a rice paddy complex to the east at BT 406073. It appeared this trench had been dug within the last 2 or 3 months. A conclusion could not be formulated as for its exact use. At 041345H, a large and believed to be old panji trap was discovered at BT 404073. Protruding from its bottom were approximately 20 1 foot bamboo panji stakes. The trap was rectangular in shape and measured 4' by 4' by 3'. The trap was moderately concealed by its natural vegetated surroundings. At 041530H, the patrol arrived at its objective at BT 4008, and established an OP/CP. Point of observation was to the northeast in grid square BT 4008. At 041535H, normal activity was being carried on in the fields. No unusual sightings were recorded and a harbor site was later established that night. At 050730H, the patrol vacated their present position and moved southwest towards their predesignated landing zone at BT 398075. At 051020H, they were extracted by helicopter without incident and returned to RLT-4 landing zone at 051045H.

At 011100H, the patrol departed by helicopter from RZ #4 and was inserted into RZ #2, BT 427023 at 011145H. On clearing the helicopter, the patrol proceeded north cross-country to the vicinity of NLL 127 at BT 403-071 and arrived at this location at 011245H, establishing a OP/CP site. Observation was conducted to the north and northeast in grid squares BT 4304 and BT 4305. Normal rice paddy activity was noted throughout the day. At 011700H, one man armed with a nondescript weapon was observed talking to children for a period of 20 minutes at BT 430046. He wore black pajamas, no head gear, and a scarf made of camouflaged material, adorned his neck. It also appeared he may have been wearing a cartridge belt. Visual contact was lost when he proceeded to BT 426036. At 011800H, OP's were secured and a harboring site was occupied for the remainder of the night. The night was uneventful. From 02 to 05, the patrol remained at this location manning OP sites during the day, and harboring sites at night. At 021200H, a large column of white smoke appeared from a wooded area in the vicinity of BT 457002. At 021635H, 5 people were noted chanting and beating several drums at BT 426024. This peculiar activity did not seem to arouse or incite other local inhabitants. OP's were secured at 021700H. No unusual events occurred throughout the night. At 030730H, OP's were manned. From 031100H to 031330H, 2 columns of white smoke were observed from the vicinity of BT 459012. Again, no unusual sightings were recorded throughout the day. The night was uneventful. At 041700H, OP's were manned and poor visibility was attributed to rain and low cloud cover which engulfed the area. At 041700H, when visibility was fair, activity in the paddies had ceased. At 041700H, one man was observed heading northeast across a rice paddy dike at BT 425023 wearing a straw hat and black pajamas. He was carrying what appeared to be an "A" frame wrapped with a green poncho. No weapons were noted. The harbor site was occupied at 041800H, and no unusual events occurred the remainder of the night. At 050900H, the patrol departed the OP/CP site and proceeded south to their pre-designated landing site at BT 427023. They were extracted without incident to the RLT-4 landing zone at 051040H.

Debriefing Comments: Indications are that the trench network located at BT 403073 was constructed in such a manner as to provide concealment, shelter, storage and could be easily utilized if properly fortified and manned as an ambush site or fighting position. Any friendly force, large or small, attempting to cross the open areas to the south, east and west would be vulnerable to grazing, concentrated, and distributed fire. It should be also noted that this trench parallels a well used trail and stream. The stream affords an excellent natural obstacle which would be advantageous to the enemy occupying this hill mass.



Team BIG STUD: 1st Squad, 1st Platoon, Co B, 3rd Recon Bn. (5) Enl USMC.

MISSION: To maintain surveillance over the Tien Xuan (1) - Xuan Ngoc (2) area (BT 4010) and the Thanh My Trung (1) - Dong Co valley area (BT 4302).

At 051015H the patrol departed from the RLT-4 landing zone by helicopter and at 051020H was inserted in RZ #2 at BT 420025. The patrol then headed south along a stream bed and arrived at their CP/OP (BT 433006) at 051600H. A night harbor site was established and the night was uneventful. From 060645H to 081830H, the patrol remained at this location manning OP's during the daylight hours, observing the valleys to the north and northwest in grid squares BT 4102, BT 4103, BT 4101 and the village of Thanh My Trung (1) at BT 4402. At night, harboring sites were occupied and defended. Throughout this period, normal working activity was being carried out in the fields. No unusual occurrences were noted. At 081830H, the patrol displaced and proceeded north to BT 433010 arriving at 081920H. There a night harbor site was established without incident until the following morning. At 091110H, the patrol was extracted by helicopter and arrived at the RLT-4 landing zone at 091130H.

Team COOL DADDY: 2nd Squad, 1st Platoon, Co B, 3rd Recon Bn. (4) Enl USMC, (1) Enl USN.

MISSION: Same as above.

At 051015H, the patrol departed from RLT-4 landing zone and was inserted in RZ #2 (BT 399076) at 051030H. The patrol immediately established an OP/OP at these coordinates. Point of observation was the northern valley complexes. Normal friendly activity was noted throughout the day. At 051900H, the patrol displaced moving northeast to BT 409079, arriving at this location at 052105H. The patrol then established a harboring site for the remainder of the night. The night was uneventful. At 060935H, OP's were manned, keeping under observation the Tien Xuan valley complex to the north. Other than normal working routines by local inhabitants, no unusual occurrences were noted. The patrol remained at this location until the morning of the 7th. At 071830H, the patrol displaced and proceeded towards the northeast to BT 403088, arriving at 072030H. A harbor site was occupied for the remainder of the night without incident. At 080810H, OP's were manned and observation was directed northeast to the villages of Tien Xuan and north to the villages of Xuan Ngoc (1) and (2). Normal activity was noted throughout the day. At 081900H, the patrol vacated their present location and proceeded southeast. At 081915H while enroute, the patrol located 10 recently dug fighting holes on the topographical crest at BT 404086. These holes were 3 feet long, 1 and 1/2 feet wide, and 2 and 1/2 feet deep and concealed by dense brush.

They carried cane knives and two other children carried yolk sticks. On making contact, they proceeded north down trail towards the village of Tien Xuan (1). At 091115H, the patrol was retracted by helicopter without incident and arrived at the RLT-4 landing zone at 091130H.

At 091100H, the patrol was helilifted from the RLT-4 landing zone and inserted in RZ #2 (BT 415022) at 091120H. On clearing the helicopters, the patrol proceeded northwest across a rice paddy complex into a dense wooded area. At 091200H, while enroute, the patrol discovered an unexploded shell at BT 414024. The shell was 12" long, and 3" in diameter. The casing was manufactured of brass and the projectile was olive drab in color. The primer had not been perforated. There were no visible markings indicating if it was US or foreign manufactured. Although handling was avoided, there was no evidence indicating the shell was booby-trapped. The patrol continued on their route, arriving at their objective (BT 409031) at 091500H, where a CP/OP was manned. From 091520H to 091730H, only 2 sightings were made of friendly inhabitants tending their cattle. At 091735H, the patrol displaced and headed north on a trail to BT 408035, arriving at this location at 091800H and established a harbor site for the remainder of the night. The night was uneventful. At 100645H, OP's were manned observing the Dong-Nghia basin to the northeast. At 100935H, a column of white smoke was observed at BT 433028. At 101300H, 2 men were observed running northeast at BT 427012 wearing black pajamas and straw hats. No weapons or equipment were noted. At 101555H, 3 men were moving southwest from BT 418021 to BT 408015, wearing black pajamas and white hats, no equipment or weapons were noted. At 101600H, 4 men moved southwest and joined the other 3 men at BT 408015. They wore black pajamas and white hats, and no equipment was noted. At 101800H, a shot was heard from the vicinity of BT 411042. At 101800H, the patrol occupied a harboring site for the remainder of the night. The night was uneventful. At 110645H, OP's were manned and at 110910H, a column of white smoke was observed in a rice paddy at BT 438026. At 110930H, an artillery round detonated in a rice paddy at BT 429036. At 111000H, 20 men were noted working in a rice paddy at BT 429036 to BT 426039, wearing black pajamas and white hats. They remained there for approximately 15 minutes and then disappeared into the brush at BT 429036. At 111010H, 3 men were moving southwest along a trail at BT 429029, wearing black pajamas and white hats. No weapons or equipment were visible. At 111130H, 4 men moved northeast on a trail at BT 438032, wearing black pajamas, and white hats: no weapons or equipment were visible. At 111200H, 1 man was observed running southwest into the brush at BT 438022 to BT 437019, wearing black pajamas and a white hat. At 111525H, 5 men were moving east across a rice paddy from BT 426039 to BT 438039, wearing black pajamas and white hats. One man carried 2 baskets suspended from a yolk stick. At 111555H, 1 man was noted coming out of a brushline at BT 426039, wearing black pajamas and a white hat. No equipment or weapons were noted. At 111600H, 3 men herding cattle moved northwest from BT 417028 to BT 415030, then moved northeast to BT 415030. They wore black pajamas and white hats. They entered a brush line at BT 417032 where visual contact was broken. 1 man later came out of the brush running and waving his white hat, then entered the brush at BT 418032. At 111800H, a rifle shot was heard from the vicinity of BT 411043.

No activity was observed. At 111800H, the patrol occupied a harbor site at this location for the remainder of the night, which was uneventful. At 120645H, OP's were manned. At 121125H, 1 man was sighted moving east on a trail at BT 438030, wearing black pajamas and a white hat. He carried a yolk stick with baskets suspended from either end. At 121245H, 11 men moved southwest down a trail from BT 438020 to BT 438027. They wore black pajamas and white hats. No weapons or equipment were noted. At 121255H, 1 man was observed running southeast across a rice paddy and hid when an aircraft flew over, then continued across the paddy when the aircraft was gone. He remained in the rice paddy for a period of 15 minutes, pacing back and forth as if awaiting someone. He then entered a brush line at BT 436028 where visual contact was broken. He wore black pajamas and a white hat and was unarmed. At 121625H, 20 people were observed moving east on a trail at BT 438030. These people wore various colored clothing and some wore straw hats. No equipment was visible. Visual contact was lost as they rounded a bend in the trail. At 121725H, 3 men were sighted moving northeast across a rice paddy from BT 427040 to BT 428042 and on to a trail where visual contact was lost when they entered a wooded area at BT 478042. They wore black pajamas and white hats. At 121845H, the patrol again occupied a harbor site for the remainder of the night without incident. At 130655H, the patrol vacated their OP/CP and proceeded south on a trail to BT 408032, then west to BT 405030 to their predesignated landing site. At 131030H, the patrol was retracted by helicopter and returned to the RLT-4 landing zone without incident at 131045H.

At 091100H, the patrol was helilifted from the RLT-4 landing zone and inserted in RZ #2 (BT 405010) at 091115H. On clearing the helicopters, the patrol proceeded east along a stream bed. At 091230H, while heading south up the stream bed, the patrol located an old VC harbor site at BT 406102. Within the site was a destroyed hut and bunker. Found in the vicinity were 10 empty beer bottles with paper stuffed in the neck portion and a pile of small shells, plus an old cooking pot. In addition, 2 propoganda leaflets were found near the pile of small shells, and fresh footprints which had been possibly made by 2 or 3 people. Indications are that the site had been vacated minutes before the patrol's arrival. The patrol then followed what appeared to be a trail south to BT 405009 where they came upon another small uninhabited harbor site. One hut which could accomodate 3 people was found destroyed. The area was well policed and indications are that the site had not been used for a period of time. No unusual sightings were noted. The patrol then continued south along their route arriving at their objective at 091800H at BT 403001. A harbor site was established and occupied for the remainder of the night without incident. At 100600H, the patrol headed east across a stream then north to BT 410007 where an Op was immediately established to observe the Dong Co basin in grid square BT 4001 and BT 4101. The patrol remained at this location for a period of 4 days manning OP's during the day and harbor sites at night. There was not one sighting of enemy or friendly activity in that 4 day period. It was evident that the small basin had been periodically bombed and shelled. This was indicated by the numerous shell craters in the area. It was also noted that the fields were barren. One noteworthy sighting was made and this was that for 4 days approximately 15 water buffalo and pigs were grazing freely and unattended. This was considered very unusual. The map presently indicates dwellings in the area, this proved to be untrue. No huts were presently located in this particular area. At 131030H, the patrol was retracted by helicopter at BT 410007 and returned to the RLT-4 landing zone without incident at 131150H.

Debriefing's Comments:

Indications are that the patrol observing the Dong-Nghia basin in grid squares BT 4103 and BT 4102 made numerous sightings which could be considered suspicious in nature even though weapons and equipment were not noted on the individuals sighted. 90% of the men sighted wore the white pith helmets with the standard black pajamas. On several occasions, the approach of an AO would drive these individuals into hiding as indicated in the patrol report. The 127 hill mass in grid square BT 4102 and BT 4202 could presently be harboring a company or larger size VC unit. A confirmed VC company, the 94/304 reported on 18 December 1965 is presently supposed to be occupying the 270 hill mass in grid square BT 4204, which is approximately 1200 meters northeast of where the sightings were made. Possibly an element of this company could be harboring in the 127 hill mass.

a. At 191730H at coordinates BT 419024, approximately ten Vietnamese were observed chopping wood. They observed the patrol landing. They were seen as the helicopter was approximately 20 feet off the deck. When the helicopter sat down, they could no longer be observed.

b. Starting about 200700H until 231400H, drums were heard from the east of the patrol. Probably the Thanh My Trung area in grid squares BT 4402 and 4603.

c. After the drums had stopped and between 231445H and 231625H, a total of 30 Vietnamese were seen gathering up the cattle that had been grazing and wandering around and all moved back into the villages.

d. At 241130H, as the patrol was moving along the edge of the rice paddy at coordinates BT 417027, on the way to the LZ, Cpl. SPINUZZI tripped a mine or booby trap. He was lifted off the ground 3 to 4 feet and killed instantly. No hole was made in the ground by the blast. No fragments were found. Only the stock and buttplate of his rifle were found.

It was only from the pistol grip to the butt that was found. He was carrying the radio and the handset was destroyed, so no communication could be established. 2 UH1E aircraft were flying overhead. Due to not being able to contact the aircraft, the red air panel was displayed and yellow smoke was used. The helicopters orbited for a while, then disappeared.

7. OTHER INFORMATION: None.

8. RESULTS OF ENCOUNTERS WITH THE ENEMY: 1 friendly KIA. Body was delivered to B Med by UH1E aircraft.

a. Communications were lost at times when the team moved to lower areas to establish LZ's. If they had a PRC-25 with them, they could have maintained communications at all times.

5. SYNOPSIS: The patrol covered a period of 92 hours. Only two sightings were made, one being lights and the other being ten Vietnamese carrying objects that turned out to be US made 2.75 rocket motors. They believe that some had the warhead still attached, while others had the heads removed. One was captured and brought in by the patrol. Six were seen being hidden but when the patrol investigated, they could only find one. Evidently, the others had been recovered during darkness.

6. OBSERVATION OF THE ENEMY AND TERRAIN:

a. Drums were heard constantly from the evening of the 19th of January until the patrol was picked up at 241230H. They came from the direction of Ky Long (1) or (2).

b. At 191900H to 192100H, lights were seen from approximate coordinates in grid square BT 4508. The lights came on dim and gradually got brighter, then went out. It lasted approximately 15 seconds and came on about 1 hour later. Smaller lights came on to the southwest of the big lights and stayed on 5 to 15 minutes, then another would come on. The last light in the chain was at approximate coordinates BT 429043. No pattern could be established, except that they were on a direct line. Some were stationary and some were moving. It was not a dot-dash type of signal. These lights were seen every night that the patrol was out.

The number of lights could not be determined but there were many. There were about 75 to 100. The drums would pick up after the lights went out. The drums would quit and the lights would come on again.

c. At 221500H, 4 Vietnamese men, 3 women and 3 children about 10 or 12 years old moved out from Ky Long (1) and (2) and met at coordinates BT 425042, then moved out to pick up the cattle grazing at BT 418035. 3 wore blue, 2 wore green and 5 wore black. All wore coolie hats except the 2 dressed in green. At 221730H, they returned with the cattle and were carrying 7 objects. One of the objects was recovered by the patrol at coordinates BT 425039 where 6 of the objects had been hidden. It was a 2.75 rocket motor. It had not been fired but the explosive head was missing. It had been pried off. 2 men came from the southeast and were given one of the objects by the people carrying them. One man with the object moved south and disappeared at coordinates BT 427038. The other people went back to the villages. Some of the before mentioned lights were seen moving towards where the objects had been hidden. But the lights never reached the hiding place.

d. Communications were lost about 231330H and at about 1430H. Rosemont was signaled and landed at the patrol's position at coordinates BT 424038, which was supposed to be the patrol's LZ. Rosemont stated that they would either bring out a radio or send helicopters to pick up the patrol. However, Hellcat and Bobcat joined up and stayed at Hellcat's position until pickup. Radios were not brought out by Rosemont.

7. OTHER INFORMATION:

a. The sniper rifle was not utilized.

b. At 210312H, the patrol had checked in by radio and asked Scat Bravo to roger the check in. The answer was yes rather than I Roger your last. At 210600H, a position report was requested by Scat Bravo. At this time the patrol asked if Scat Bravo had received their 0312H check in. The answer was negative.

8. RESULTS OF ENCOUNTERS WITH THE ENEMY: None.



(See Annexes A & B). Several possible HLZ's were located (See Annex A). An inhabited village, not marked on the map was located at BS 438992 (See Annex B). The debris from a possible mid air collision or explosion of at least one jet aircraft, possibly a photo recon aircraft was located in the vic of BS 436985 (See Annexes A,C). All data and findings were immediately reported both to MAG-12 and MAG-36. A trail, approx 1½' wide was located running north/south at BS 447965 and at BS 460975. A moderately used trail paralleling the stream heading east and then south into the village of Tho An (BS 4795) was located. (See Annex A).

b. That the 4 man team is a most successful means of gathering information. It is both feasible and sound to release the team prior to landing in an area of operations rather than releasing them from a platoon CP in the field. To fully utilize the concept, helicopters are a necessity.

11. Recommendations

That the trail systems be further reconnoitered to determine if another V.C. training site has been established in the area, to replace the semi-abandoned one located on this patrol and to fully explore the complete network.

The patrol departed from LZ QUAIL at 131010H by helo and were inserted at (BS 452933) at 131030H. On clearing the helicopter the patrol proceeded across country towards the northwest and came across a well used trail at (BS 454934). The trail was considered well used and approximately 3' wide. Along this trail, the patrol encountered 3 obstacles which had been constructed of brush and saplings. It is believed these obstacles had been placed at certain trail junctions to channelize movement to a special trail network. The obstacles had been constructed in the last couple of days. This was determined by the fresh cuttings and the green vegetation. At 131100H, the patrol located a harboring site at (BS 455937). Indications are, that this site had been used in the last 3 days, and could easily accommodate 100 men. The area was well policed. At 131130H, as the patrol proceeded East on the trail they encountered a well constructed obstacle. This obstacle was 3½" high and interwoven with, saplings, brush, and vines. The obstacle was by passed and the patrol proceeded up a stream bed towards the north and then proceeded west at a stream junction. At 131730H, the patrol traveled on a well used trail at (BS 454950) crossed this trail and proceeded north to hill mass 294 at (BT 453956) and arrived on the crest at 131930H, and harbored for the night. The night was uneventful. At 140730H (BS 453956) the patrol established OP's where point of observation was directed at the THO-AN, TAY PHUOC #1 and AN-~~TH~~ MI-ONG basins. There were no unusual sightings that day other than normal working routines being conducted by the local inhabitants. At 141700H, the patrol displaced approximately 150 meters south west and occupied harboring site for the remainder of the night. The night was uneventful. At 150730H the patrol established an OP at (BS 453956). At 150850H, 6 men were observed moving across a paddy at (BS 472934) wearing black pajamas, packs and possibly weapons. Visual observation was lost when they entered a wood line. During the remainder of the day no unusual sightings were noted other than normal activities being conducted in the fields and along the trail networks. At 151730H, a harboring site was occupied at (BS 452958) for the remainder of the night. The night was uneventful. At 160730H, OP's were established at (BS 453956). Throughout the day no unusual sightings were recorded other than normal routines. At 161645H, the patrol displaced and proceeded to (BS 452957) and secured a LZ. At 161700H the patrol was retracted by helo and on departure received several rounds of small arms fire from the vicinity of (BS 442966). The patrol arrived at LZ QUAIL at 161720.

The patrol departed from LZ QUAIL by helo at 131002H, and were inserted at (BS 453931) at 131015H. On clearance the helo, the patrol proceeded to the east and followed a trail towards the southeast. The trail was well used and approximately 3' wide. There were no obstructions or obstacles along this trail. At 131030H, the patrol moved off the trail towards the west at (BS 45599299) and kept this particular trail under observation for a period of 30 minutes. Several trail markers were noted along this trail. Saplings had been broken so the broken and pointed towards the south. At 131100H the patrol proceeded west overland and remained at (BS 45569296) for a period of 1 hour and 15 minutes. The patrol then proceeded southwest until they arrived at (BS 45439257) and located another well used trail approximately 3/4' wide. The trail ran on an azimuth of 116%. At 131430H the patrol left the trail at (BS 45539236) and established another listening watch. At 131450H the patrol departed on an azimuth of 175% and at 131645H (BS 45569215) where the patrol established a harboring site for a short period and later harbored there for the remainder of the night. The night was uneventful. At 140855H, the patrol departed from their location to (BS 459921) and found a trail junction at these coordinates. This trail ran generally from north to northeast. At 141130 (BS 462919) the patrol established an OE to observe the basin in grid squares (BS 4691) and (BS 4691). The village of MUONG-IAM #1 could not be observed due to the vegetation around its periphery. No sightings were made from this point. At 141255H the patrol departed from this area in a northerly direction to (BS 46229236) where the point observed a hole 4' square which could have been used for a small storage cache. The holes were approximately 2' deep. 50 meters north of this location, two trees 10 meters apart had on horizontal pole 5" in diameter 8' off the ground and one wooden pole was supporting it from the center. There was no indication what the structure were being utilized for. At 14145H, the patrol located a VC Camp at (BS 46229236). There were 5 huts, one unthatched. Refer to diagram for dimensions and layout of the camp. The camp was uninhabited, but had been used recently. Found in its main area were 1 battle flag, 15 empty medicine vials, and old clothes. Fighting holes surrounded the site. The holes were of all shapes and sizes. Some holes were covered with dirt and rock as an overhead shelter. Found in the vicinity were old parts of BA-30, and BA-29 batteries. Indications are the camp had been recently occupied. There are 3 main trails that were used as routes of egress and ingress into the camp. The camp could accommodate 50 men. 2 huts were used as sleeping quarters and one for possibly the command group and one as a cooking area. The flag and medical supplies were found in the command hut. The flag was found rolled up on a sleeping platform. At 141515H, the patrol departed the area towards the north along a trail which became a stream bed. Approximately 50 meters from the camp on the west side of the trail and under the canopy we found a clearing 25 meters in diameter with a table in the eastern edge. There were several trails leading back to the camp area.

a table was placed in the center which probably had been used as an outdoor class room. The patrol then proceeded northwest along the stream bed reconnoitering as they were in route. At 141555H, the patrol made contact with one armed VC wearing a straw hat, black pajamas, and pack. He was armed with a carbine. The encounter took place at a point where the stream bed joined a well-used trail. The VC came around a bend in the trail that had just been reconnoitered by one of the patrol members, calling and gesturing in the patrol direction. There was not enough time for the patrol to get adequate cover or concealment. When he came within 15 meters of the patrol, he realized that the patrol was not friendly, broke and ran. He was immediately killed. His weapon and ammunition belt were taken by the patrol and then quickly broke contact believing other VC may have been in the area. The VC was approximately 27 years old and considered quite husky. The weapon and cartridge belt were not returned by the patrol. The pack was not retrieved. The patrol quickly proceeded north to (BS 459303) where the patrol harbored at 141700H to 150930H. OP was established observing AN-KHUN #1 and #2 village complexes. No unusual sightings were made. At 151030H the patrol proceeded northeast to north crossing the draw at (BS 462934) which was found to be a prominent stream bed about 4 feet wide. Then they proceeded north to the main stream bed in the same grid square and moved northwest along it. Movement was difficult from that point to BS 455938 because of the steep, slippery rock, deep pools and swift current. At (BS 455938) a defined but unused trail was found paralleling the stream. No trails were found south of this point. At 151600H, the patrol came to a trail junction at (BS 449945) where many guard stakes were placed on the trail with no attempt at concealment. Several recently air dropped leaflets were found torn up among the well defined rock masses under the surface that made it a very adequate fording location. The patrol proceeded north encountering many natural barriers that had been placed across the trail at regular intervals. By-passing the obstacles posed no problems. At 151845H the patrol linked up with the other patrol at (BS 453855) where they harbored for the night. 

 - c. At 201635H one 60 mm mortar round was heard being fired at approx. grid square BS 4890. No explosion was heard.

- d. At 21000H machine gun fire was heard from the area of grid square 4890. It lasted about 15 minutes.

- f. At 210815H a trench was found approximately 15 ft long, 3 ft wide, and 2 ft deep at BS 465924. It was a very old trench and was pretty much overgrown.
- g. At 210900H punji stakes were found just off the main trail. A small trail goes to the left and right at BS 466924. About 3 stakes were seen on each side right on the small trails. They looked about one month old.
- h. At 211030H a corral about 10 ft long, 8 ft tall and 6 ft wide was seen at BS 466920. It was made of 4 inch logs squared. It was made like a rail fence only straight.
- i. At 211035H machine gun and small arms fire was heard from GS 4890. It lasted about 8 minutes.
- j. At 211145H three huts that could either be used as storage bins or POW huts were found at BS 464909. They were spaced about 100 meters apart. They were about 20 ft long, 6 ft wide and 5 ft from the floor to eaves. They stood about 3 to 4 feet off the ground on stilts and were covered by a canopy of trees. (See attached diagram).
- k. At 211700H a suspected bunker was seen at BS 477914. It had timber like a door or gate in front and a mound behind. The patrol could not get closer than 400 meters to it due to normal activity in the fields and village.
- l. At 221600H three more huts were found built like the others except one was about 40 ft long at coord BS 463912. These also were about 100 meters apart.
- m. At 240100H to 240130H small arms and machine gun fire were heard from the area of the village at BS 474916. About twelve 60 mm mortar rounds were heard being fired from the same location. The rounds landed about 1,000 meters north east of the firing position.





- c. Every morning at about 0830 about 5 men would move separately to and from a large building at BS 471952. They disappeared close to the buildings. Rosemont checked out the area at the OP's request and stated there appeared to be a cave at that location.
- d. At 251250H, 7 VCS moved down the trail from the village moving NW at coord BS 472955. All wore black and moved in an evenly spaced column. At 251320H they returned to the village using the same trail.
- e. At 250841H, 7 VCS moved out of the village moving north west on the trail. After about 40 meters they stopped. They were in an evenly spaced column and kept spread out even when they stopped. One appeared to have a rifle. Four wore what appeared to be green uniforms and the others black. All wore coolie hats. They remained in the same position until 0855, then returned to the village. One man left the village carrying a load but when he saw the 7 men, he turned around and re-entered the village. Another man was moving towards the village but went the other way when he observed the 7 men. This is the same village and thought to be the same 7 VCS reported at 251250H.
- f. At 260923H, the same 7 VCS moved out of the same village moving south and disappeared along the trail about 50 meters from the village. They were followed approximately one minute later by 2 men in black.






(2) 051630H at coordinates (AT 836888) the patrol found the broken pieces of a small transistor radio and some broken pottery dishes.

(3) At 070815H at coordinates (AT 823874) the patrol had stopped, and security was out about 75 yards. One VCS wearing khaki trousers with long sleeved khaki shirt walked into view from the South, unarmed but carried a rucksack. He was not fired upon due to the fact that other people could be heard following him. He sat a bottle of Nuoc Mom on the ground then wandered up the trail a few more yards to about four yards from one member of the patrol. He was startled

and started yelling and ran off in a Southerly direction. Lots of ~~VN~~ yelling and movement was heard throughout the area to the South. However, it was thought that the VCS may have circled around.

(5) Along the trails noted in the attached overlay were fresh cuttings. The trails were well used.

7. OTHER INFORMATION.

- (1) The three VC were ambushed by a four-man team. Two VC were KIA, one escaped, probably WIA and possibly KIA. They were moving south-south-west along trail, shown on overlay #2, all carrying large loads on their backs. All gear was captured, and included: 1 U.S. carbine, M1, with 8 rounds; 1 standard VC grenade; 1 U.S. M8 knife; 2 canteens and covers, and pistol belt; large quantities of food and supplies. See appendix for complete list. They apparently were making a supply run.
- (2) From the nature and extent of activity in the vicinity of BS 628322, it appears that the VC may be in the process of establishing defensive positions here.
- (3) There appears to be some limited VC activity in the vicinity of grid square BS 5830.
- (4) The large valleys noted above are both cultivated, well kept, and inhabited. Both offer excellent concealment for troops from air and ground observation.
- (5) Concealed day movement in many of these areas is impossible, due to vegetation.

8. RESULTS OF ENCOUNTERS WITH THE ENEMY: See above, 7(1). No friendly casualties.

9. CONDITION OF PATROL: Condition and morale excellent.

10. CONCLUSIONS OR RECOMMENDATION: See paragraph (7) for opinions. No further conclusions or recommendations.




APPENDIX ASUMMARY OF EVENTS CONCERNING VC CONTACT
ON 21-22 JANUARY 1966

At about 211430H Hateful stopped at BS 521369, to await better visibility, since poor visibility (50 feet) made accurate movement of the hill-top impossible. About 211700H four VC, wearing black, approached the patrol base from the southeast, moving cross-country. They detected the rear position of the patrol base, without being detected themselves, and opened fire. They fired only two .30 cal rounds before they were scattered by M3A1 return fire. They ran screaming and yelling, with at least one probable WIA. Due to the heavy vegetation and terrain, the main body of the patrol was unable to see the action, and hearing all the firing and yelling, took off in the other direction. The patrol had been often briefed that VC initiated contact would be broken immediately. About 40 yards from the patrol base, Lt. PARKER assembled those near him, and immediately returned, on line, to the scene of the action. There they found OBERHAUS, who had remained after firing his M3A1. Lt. EGAN was missing. Teams were sent out to search for him, and his name yelled from the position. He was not found, nor were any tracks or signs of movement in another direction found. Conflicting reports by witnesses make it impossible to determine whether or not Lt. EGAN was wounded, or in which direction he might have moved. He did have his rifle with him and no subsequent firing was heard. The rally point was the USMC camp. Having searched the immediate area and waited until near darkness, the patrol departed at 1830H, and located themselves for the night several hundred yards from the incident. A patrol base was established about 1930H at BS 523372.

About 220745H, the patrol moved out to the northeast to continue the mission. Visibility remained the same and the patrol had to move by dead-reckoning, since it was too hazardous to remain. About 0900H, further movement to the north or east became impossible due to the severity of the grade. The patrol was forced to back-track, losing an hour and move to the southeast along the contour line, trying to locate a place to descend. Such a place was found, and the patrol was moving straight downhill, when attacked from the rear at BS 524369 about 1015H.

Upon contact, the patrol was in a dispersed column, moving straight down a steep incline. The attack was made by an estimated 30 to 50 VC/PAVN, who were observed to have been following Hateful's track. When, in tracking, the VC made contact with the patrol's rear point, they began the attack. Due to the vegetation and terrain, only those two men on the rear point, upon initial contact, saw or engaged the enemy. The remainder of the patrol immediately attempted to break contact by rapid downhill movement, through 6 to 8 foot elephant grass and brush. The two men on the rear fired about 10 rounds into the VC, killing at least 2 to 4, and wounding several. They then joined the rapid descent. The VC attacked initially with large numbers and grenades and automatic weapons (heavier than carbines, lighter than M3A1's). They pursued both physically and by fire, now using primarily semi-automatic .30 cal weapons at longer ranges. The entire descent was made under conditions of heavy attack, and was not a controlled movement. During this time the corpsman stopped, thinking that the rest had stopped, and found himself in the midst of the VC. He killed five, and probably six, and continued moving.

Seeking cover, concealment, and terrain without great disadvantages, Lt. PARKER led six other men to a position in heavy vegetation, high up in a draw, where they set up an ambush for anyone tracking them (about 1100H at BS 528368). The VC at this time were searching the entire area. About 1130 other men from the patrol came into the ambush, and linked up. Lt. PARKER then called in over 150 rounds of artillery on suspected and possible positions.

At 1223H, helicopters picked up three men who had linked-up at BS 529367. At 1325H, helicopters picked up the nine men at BS 529367. GRISSETT was the only man missing in this incident, and is still listed as MIA. He was the point for the patrol and was seen several times during the descent, in good condition and further down the hill than the rest. It is reasonable to assume that he escaped unharmed from this incident, and began his movement back to the USSF camp.

The VC were observed by five men to be wearing khaki uniforms, one man observing khaki rain-type hats and wrap-around leggings, another observing grey or darker khaki uniforms. From the attack, it is apparent that they were armed with sub-machineguns, semi-automatic .30 cal weapons, and a great number of hand grenades. They were aggressive and fairly well trained, and their morale appeared to be high.

It is reasonable to assume that the four VC involved in the incident on 21 January moved to inform a VC/PAVN unit they knew to be in the area. Due to vegetation, terrain, and weather, night movement by units in the area is virtually impossible. Thus the VC/PAVN unit appears to have been located no more than one hour's march from BS 521369, since this would allow day-break movement there, and subsequent tracking, to the sight of the attack.

6. RESULTS OF ENCOUNTERS WITH ENEMY: Patrol was moving through thick undergrowth on its approach to high ground at BS 606375, when it came upon an open area. Patrol leader surveyed high ground for enemy observation posts and didn't see any, so patrol started to move. Then one man appeared on top of the hill. The three men that had broken out of the tree line got down, not knowing whether they had been observed. A second man appeared on top of the hill and one of them started shouting. There was a fog rolling over the top of the hill and the three men were going to wait until the hill was covered with fog before they moved back. It didn't fog in thick enough and when the three men moved back, they started taking fire. Apparently the men on top of the hill had been shouting at a patrol that was moving up on the recon patrol. Some of the firing was from a position closer than the top of the hill.

There were no friendly or enemy casualties.
7. CONDITION OF PATROL: Morale good, physical condition good except for hands and feet which had been exposed to constant rain.
8. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS:
 - a. The size of this patrol was satisfactory. The patrol was able to move faster and with less noise.

6. RESULTS OF ENCOUNTERS WITH ENEMY:

Patrol was occupying its observation post at 603378. One man was in a tree and another was at the base of the tree. The other two men were about 20 yards away. The man in the tree saw six men about 50 feet from the tree coming toward the tree. He climbed down and the two men ran down to where the other two team members were. One man got on the radio and said we had been spotted and needed a helicopter pickup. The VC then opened fire and the team jumped into the bushes. The radio was left behind. At this time LCpl SOLOVSKOY was wounded in the left calf. The team moved to 598379 and was going to await the helicopters or until darkness and then move out. After waiting an hour, the VC opened up on the team again from about 10 feet away. This broke up the team. The initial burst killed LCpl DOWLING. LCpl SOLOVSKOY returned fire and killed two VC. By this time the helicopters were flying overhead. The remainder of the patrol was picked up in three different locations.

Friendly casualties: 1 KIA, 1 WIA. Enemy casualties: 2 KIA.

7. CONDITION OF PATROL: Morale good, 2 men have many scratches and bruises.

8. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS:

a. VC patrol that attacked observation post either were moving through the area or had picked up the trail that the team had left.

1. SITUATION.

- A. Enemy Forces. A PAVN Battalion, reported to be part of 18th PAVN Regiment, located in Grid Squares BS 6227 and 6228 on 041400H Jan. (Information rated C.2 by USSF). This unit reported to have 81mm mortars, 57mm RR, and 60mm mortars. Additional information as briefed by USSF intelligence specialist.
- b. Friendly Forces.
- (1) As briefed by Commanding Officer.
 - (2) A 105mm artillery battery (-) (H.3-12), located at BS 567322, will be in direct support of operations conducted from SF Camp A-106 only.
 - (3) "Birdwatcher" CAS and observation aircraft available as required.
- c. Attachments. One Artillery F/O Team (with each platoon-sized patrol from Special Forces Camp A-106 only).

2. MISSION.

- a. Conduct platoon-sized reconnaissance/surveillance operations, in an area of operations, vicinity of Special Forces Camp A-106, for a period of about four days commencing on 13 January 1966, to determine the location; identity; strength; movement and armament of VC/PAVN units; capture VC/PAVN prisoners, documents, and equipment; locate VC/PAVN assembly areas, training and logistics bases, and infiltration/supply routes.
- b. Be prepared to conduct additional platoon-sized reconnaissance/surveillance operations as directed by fragmentary orders in the vicinity of Special Forces Camps A-106 and A-107.

3. EXECUTION.

- (2) Each patrol leader will have an AN/PRC-25 on patrol for his primary means of communication. Each F/O team accompanying a patrol will have an AN/PRC-25. Inter-patrol communication will be by an AN/PRC-10.
- (3) Patrol leaders and F/O's will use each others radios and/or frequencies as necessary to ensure positive communications with Special Forces Camp. Any patrol out of communications with Special Forces Camp or any portion of the patrol for a period of 6 hours, will abort its mission and return to camp.
- (a) Patrol leader notify command group any time communications are lost with a portion of his patrol.

(b) Command Group will request overflight of last reported position of element which has not had communications for a period of 4 hours, weather and light conditions permitting.

- (4) Red panels will be displayed to mark Team/Platoon positions prior to and during air strikes.
- (5) Yellow smoke will identify landing sites for helicopter recoveries.
- (6) Communication Operating Instructions will be provided by the Communications Officer. Radio relay sites as approved by Command Group may be established by Patrol Leader.
- (7) Challenge/Password. The number system will be used while on patrols as designated by Patrol Leaders.

b. Command.

- (1) The Platoon Commanders will exercise control of their platoons while in the field. All patrols will be led by platoon commander except as specifically authorized by CO, 1st Force Recon Co.
- (2) The Company C.P. is located at BS 567322.




