PART II
NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the period 1 to 31 January the battery continued to support operations of the First Marine Division. The modified mission of the battery was as follows: 1st Platoon continued its GS/Rein mission of Btry "E", 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines through 13 January when 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines passed to OPCON 1st Field Artillery Group. On 6 January provisional battery "Q" was activated by 11th Marines msg 060500Z Jan 68. 1st Platoon, 3d 8" Hewitzer Battery (SP) provides the control element for provisional battery "Q." Firing elements include 1st Platoon, 3d 8" Hewitzer Battery (SP), "A" Platoon, 3d 155 Gun Battery (SP), and a detachment of "W" Battery, 3d Battalion, 11th Marines. The mission of

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provisional Battery "Q" is to provide close support for ARVN forces in the vicinity of An Hoa and co-located USMC forces. From 1 to 15 January 2nd Platoon was co-located with 3d Platoon at the battery C.P. (AT921799). On 14 January 2nd Platoon departed the battery C.P. en route to Phu Bai and, in accordance with 1st Marine Division Op O 309-68 and 11th Marines msg 140845Z/Jan68 was chopped OPCON/ADCON to 1st FAG effective 151200H January 1968. On 16 January, in accordance with the verbal order of Commanding Officer, 11th Marines, 3d 8" Howitzer Battery (SP) assumed ADCON of 2nd Platoon. 3d Platoon continued its GS/Rein mission of 3d Battalion, 11th Marines. Priority of fires for 1st Platoon and 3d Platoon was assigned to 1st Recon. Battalion. The battery retained responsibility for technical fire direction control of Battery "M", 4th Battalion, 11th Marines. The Commanding Officer, 3d 8" Howitzer Battery (SP) exercises responsibility as artillery position area coordinator for the artillery complex (AT921799); a combined security program is coordinated and directed by the Commanding Officer.

During the month of January the battery fired the following missions:

Numerous missions were fired on enemy troop concentrations and positions. While firing 224 observed missions the battery accounted for 61 confirmed KIAs, 11 structures destroyed, and 9 secondary explosions. 3d Platoon on 7 January, 30 January, and 31 January fired 366 rounds on enemy rocket sites and routes of egress in retaliation against enemy rocket attacks.

There were four incidents of enemy initiated close combat involving the battery during the month. The artillery complex (AT921799) was attacked with 122mm rockets on 7 January and 30 January. On 3 January 1st Platoon C.P. (AT921799) received incoming satchel charges and on 11 January the artillery complex (AT921799) received approximately 4 rounds small arms fire.

On 26 January a Xenon searchlight and crew from Battery "G", 29th Artillery, U.S. Army which had been deployed in perimeter defense of the artillery complex since 4 November 1967 returned to its parent unit. The artillery complex (AT921799) maintains the capability for self-illumination with two 81mm mortars under the control of 3d 8" Howitzer Battery (SP) and Battery "M", 3d Battalion, 11th Marines and the self-illumination capability of Battery "M", 4th Battalion, 11th Marines and of Battery "H", 3d Battalion, 11th Marines.

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Intelligence gathering activities of the battery patrols and the Civil Affairs Officer and battery Interpreter indicated an increased degree of enemy activity in the villages of Hoa Vinh and Hoa Thanh located around the perimeter of the artillery complex (AT921799).

The battery continued its Civic Action Program in Hoa Vinh and Hoa Thanh villages.

1. PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATION

(a) Losses

(b) Gains

(1) Replacements: twenty-two (22) enlisted; two (2) officers.

(c) POWs Captured: one (1).

(d) Morale: Enemy harrassment, continuous 100% alert, and productive fire missions contributed to excellent morale among troops and officers.

(e) Personal Services: Construction of a recreation building was started at the battery C.P.

(f) Awards and Decorations: none.

(g) Court Martials: none; Article 15: three (3).

2. INTELLIGENCE

(a) Wire patrols and daylight reconnaissance patrols were sent out several times each week from the battery C.P.

(b) On 11 January, 24 January, and 26 January the battery received reports from different sources indicating that V.C. were kidnapping people from Trung Son, Van Duong, Hoa Lac, and Xuan Thieu hamlets in the vicinity of the artillery complex and using them for ammunition carriers and casualty bearers. Spot reports were submitted to 11th Marines.

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(c) On 11 January SSgt. DONG, the battery Interpreter, arrested a Vietnamese male, NGUYEN XU, on request of Thanh Vinh hamlet chief TRI who stated that NGUYEN XU came from a V.C. controlled area. Suspect was detained as a V.C.S. and turned over to 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines. A spot report was submitted to 11th Marines.

(d) On 14 January a Vietnamese male whose reliability was undetermined reported enemy activity at Thuy Tu (AT916848), Kim Lien (AT916862), and Phu Nam (AT858855). A spot report was submitted to 11th Marines.

(e) On 22 January a Vietnamese male whose reliability was undetermined reported an NVA Battalion consisting of 480 men and 185 supporting laborers in area AT833778, AT845775, and AT845763.

(f) Intelligence spot reports and summaries were utilized on a continuing basis in providing for security of battery command posts.

3. TRAINING

(a) Two enlisted returned from TAD to CAG school and one enlisted went TAD to CAG school. One enlisted attended NCO school at 1st Engineer Battalion and one enlisted attended Embarkation School at Headquarters Battalion, 1st Marine Division.

(b) The training program on the M16A1 rifle continued through the month of January. All newly joined personnel fired 200 rounds through the rifle and zeroed their weapons.

(c) The battery training schedule continues to emphasize safety in employment of weapons, general military subjects proficiency, and proficiency in MOS.

4. OPERATIONS

The battery supported no operations during the period covered by this report.

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(a) On 3 January at 0134H 1st Platoon received an unknown number of sniper rounds. On inspection of the compound during daylight hours four dud satchel charges were found in addition to other satchel charges found on the An Hoa runway and outside the defensive wire. There were no casualties.

(b) On 7 January shortly after 2200H the artillery complex (AT921799) received approximately 12 to 15 incoming 122mm rockets and sporadic sniper fire. No rockets impacted in the battery C,P.

(c) On 11 January at 2350H the battery C.P. received 4 rounds S.A.F. from AT923799 and a trip flare was ignited; there was negative observation.

(d) At 0140H on 30 January the artillery complex (AT921799) was attacked with approximately twenty 122mm rockets. Approximately six impacted in "H" Battery, 3d Battalion, 11th Marines position, six in "M" Battery, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines position, and five in this battery's position; three impacted outside the wire. 3d 8" Howitzer Battery (SP) sustained one minor WIA who was treated and returned to duty; two structures were destroyed and two were damaged. The battery fired 130 rounds in retaliation with no observed surveillance. Alert security posture prevented further injuries.

7. CIVIC ACTION

(a) Five General Walt Scholarship Fund scholarships were given to students from Hoa Vinh and Hoa Thanh. In addition, 500 individual school kits and other school supplies were provided for the school at An Ngai Dong.

(b) On 30 January 800 Tet gifts for children were given to the village chiefs of Hoa Vinh and Hoa Thanh for distribution.

(c) The battery Civil Affairs Officer has completed and submitted to the Hoa Vang District Chief plans for a dispensary to be located outside the artillery complex.
