

d. Logistics

1-31 Dec 1967: Approximately 15 pounds of ecclesiastical gear was received for distribution to Chaplains in RVN.

Approximately 1,705 pounds of gear was shipped to RVN. A total of 2 shipments.

1-31 Dec 1967: During this period, Truck Company continued it's daily supporting activities by providing an average of 13 M-36 Trucks, 7 M-35 Trucks, 1 M-55 Truck, 15 M-52 Tractor-trailer Semis, 47 M-38A1 Jeeps, 7 M-37 Personnel Carriers, 1 A160 Shuttle Bus, 2 Buses, and 1 Miller Bus.

1-31 Dec 1967: During this period, Truck Company continued to provide 1 A160 Van for the 3d FSR Shuttle Bus Service; throughout the month, the Bus carried an average of 53 personnel.

1-31 Dec 1967: Buildings T-29-1, T-30, T-25-1, T-28-1, and T-32 at Camp Hauge were recovered by Camp Butler, after Supply Battalion supply section moved to building 1123, Camp Foster. Building 1005-C at Camp Hauge was given to Supply Battalion, 3d Force Service Regiment. This building has a capacity of 4,000 square feet. Building 2704 - change and reassign to Sub-Unit #1, Supply Battalion.

The Automated Materials Handling System was completed on 20 November 1967. Supply Company, Supply Battalion, assumed operational control 28 November 1967 for testing of system to include a 30-day operational test period. Building 2485, Ordnance Training Facility, was accepted 20 October 1967.

1-31 Dec 1967: The output of M-36 is on schedule with an output of five (5) being completed during the month of December. Efforts are continuing to increase the output and exceed the monthly quota. The M-37/43 program is now on schedule with an output of twenty (20) vehicles being completed during December.

The output of rebuilt generators continues on an upward trend. During the month of December, a record monthly output of forty-two (42) various types of generators were achieved. The trend of exceeding the planned monthly output is expected to continue through the month of January. Emphasis is continuing to be placed on the 60/75HP range of generators to relieve the critical shortage in RVN.



NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the period of 1-31 December 1967, Headquarters and Service Battalion continued its daily activities in support of the Regimental logistic mission.

a. Total incoming and outgoing message center traffic was 11,650 messages, 349,764 autodin cards, and 2,825 autodin messages.

b. Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles traveled 90,276 miles, hauled 18,190 short tons of cargo, and transported 19,484 personnel. During the previous month of November, Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles traveled 87,983 miles, hauled 18,232 short tons of cargo, and transported 17,655 personnel.

c. The Baggage Facility received 5,357 pieces of personal baggage for storage while shipping out 9,650 pieces. There remains a total of 66,292 pieces of personal baggage in storage.

d. The Shipping and Receiving Platoon receipted for 10,956 measurement tons and 210 short tons* of incoming cargo, and shipped 8,929 measurement tons and 1,205 short tons* of outbound cargo. For the previous month of November the Shipping and Receiving Platoon receipted for 13,422 measurement tons and 215 short tons of incoming cargo and shipped 12,836 measurement tons and 1,615 short tons of outbound cargo. It received 10.9% less measurement^{tons}; short tons received remained relatively constant. It shipped 30.4% less measurement tons and 25.4% less short tons of outgoing cargo than the previous month.

e. There were 56.7 forklifts available per day as compared to 76 in November. This decrease in availability is attributable to the shipment of 23 forklifts to RVN. During December, forklifts were dispatched a total of 11,153 hours and were utilized 6010.3 hours, a utilization rate of 53.9%. During the month of November the utilization rate was 61.7%.
