NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the month of January the 3d Force Service Regiment fulfilled its mission to provide sustained Logistical support to FMF WestPac Forces:

a. The Baggage Facility received 6,555 pieces, and released 7,347 pieces. A total of 74,859 pieces of personal baggage remains in storage.

b. Shipping and Receiving receipted for 10,835 measurements tons and 139 short tons of incoming cargo: 9,902 measurement tons and 1,279 short tons were shipped.

c. Total incoming and out going Message Center Traffic was 11,735 messages and 373,834 Autodin Cards.

d. 3d FSR vehicles traveled 257,954 miles, hauled 18,368 short tons of cargo and transported 17,651 personnel. Commercial transportation cost was \$4,441.03.

e. Maintenance operations for the month of January commenced with 2,729 work requests on hand. There were 2,712 work requests received during the month and 2,458 work requests completed.

f. The Fleet Stock Account processed 31,727 demands and made 25,397 Issue/Obligation releases. There were 9,717 receipts processed during this month. To date, for FY-69, 287,676 transactions have been processed.

g. Supply Operations for the month of January Commenced with 5,338 issue mats on hand. There were 47,574 issue mats received during the month and 48,884 issue mats were processed, leaving a balance of 4,028 issue mats on hand at the end of the month.

 - d. Sent wirenote to FLC providing several suggestions for preparation of equipment for retrograde.
 - e. Received authorization from FMFPac to submit requests for disposition instructions in message format for Section "M" Engineer Equipment subject to specified criteria.

1. During the period 1-31 January 1968, Headquarters and Service Battalion continued its daily activities in support of the regimental logistic mission.

a. Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles traveled 105,465 miles hauled 19,368 short tons of cargo, and transported 17,651 personnel. During the previous month of December, Headquarters and Services Battalion vehicles traveled 93,893 miles, and hauled 24,649 short tons of cargo, and transported 16,676 personnel. Commercial transportation hire cost was \$4,441.03.

b. The baggage facility received 6,551 pieces of personal baggage for storage while shipping out 7,347 pieces. There remains a total of 74,859 pieces of personal baggage in storage.

The Commercial Rental cost was approximately \$16,199.49.


