NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the month of April the 3d Force Service Regiment fulfilled its mission to provide sustained Logistical support to FMF WestPac Forces:

a. The Baggage Facility received 9,166 pieces, and released 5,445 pieces. A total of 76,905 pieces of personal baggage remains in storage.

b. Shipping and Receiving receipted for 10,350 measurement tons and 234 short tons of incoming cargo: 11,614 measurement tons and 1,367 short tons were shipped.

c. Total incoming and out going Message Center Traffic was 13,371 Narrative Messages and 2,840 Card Messages.

d. 3d FSR vehicles traveled 256,569 miles, hauled 12,679 short tons of cargo and transported 20,811 personnel. Commercial transportation traveled 32,498 miles.

e. Maintenance operations for the month of April were 1,799 work requests received during the month and 2,330 work requests completed.

f. The Fleet Stock Account processed 29,135 demands and made 24,688 Issue/Obligation releases. There were 10,031 receipts processed during this month.

g. Supply Operations for the month of April commenced with 6,022 issue mats on hand. There were 31,070 issue mats received during the month and 27,417 issue mats were processed, leaving a balance of 9,675 issue mats on hand at the end of the month.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the period 1 to 30 April 1969, Headquarters and Service Battalion continued its daily activities in support of the regimental logistic mission.

a. Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles traveled 104,277 miles, hauled 12,677 short tons of cargo, and transported 20,811 personnel. During the previous month of March, Headquarters and Service Battalion vehicles traveled 114,073 miles, and hauled 18,342 short tons of cargo, and transported 17,455 personnel.

b. Motor Transport Operations were abnormally light. This has provided opportunity to catch up on some back logs of training, etc. in these areas. It has also helped to offset the effect of a shortage of drivers (MOS 3531) during this period, which has forced operationally ready trucks to be deadlined for lack of drivers.

c. The baggage facility received 9,166 pieces of personal baggage for storage and shipped 5,445 pieces. There remains a total of 76,905 pieces of personal baggage in storage.

2. In the general mess system, concerning the new sign in procedures, ration credits for April ran about 85% of those in March. This is probably in part a seasonal decline due to the good weather. It is believed that success of the program is largely due to the informal program of educating personnel concerned.

3. Defensive Drivers Training School was established in Headquarters and Service Battalion during the month of March. It is primarily designed for personnel who operate motor vehicles and personnel (25) years of age and under. Headquarters and Service Battalion thus became the only National Safety Council certified agency on Okinawa offering this type of training. As of 30 April 1969, 129 students have graduated satisfactorily.

4. Combat Skills School is a three week course during which General Military Subjects Training for all E-5's and below, as well as requalification with the M-14 rifle is accomplished. For the first six classes this calendar year, approximately 650 students from the regiment have completed the training. The results are as follows:

a. GMSPET - 90% passed, with an average score of 80%

b. Rifle Requalification ("C" Course) - 90% qualified with an average score of 64.






