PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of July 1967, operations continued at a normal level. The Battalion joined 10 officers and dropped 6 officers. Tests of the emergency out of country communication circuits were conducted with NAVCOM STAPHILL. Reliable communications was established in the FSK mode but difficulties were experienced using the tone pack. Additional tests are being conducted with NAVCOM STAPHILL to improve equipment compatibility. Message traffic increased slightly from 55,891 in June to 57,055 in July. Operation of the AN/TCC-7A Switchboard System at the III MAF Headquarters continued to operate smoothly. The COC Switchboard has been eliminated and all COC lines integrated into the AN/TCC-7A with no less service reliability. The Commanding General, Force Logistic Command inspected the Battalion during the period 24-26 July 1967. Results indicate an overall readiness posture of satisfactory with minor discrepancies. 5th Communication Battalion added MARS phone patch service to CONUS to its members by utilization of the station located at Mobile Construction Battalion Seven. A direct line between this Battalion and the MARS station was installed and this service is being utilized by members of the Battalion with gratifying results.

(1) Training was conducted on Vietnam oriented subjects, selected General Military Subjects, small engine generator operation (through 10KW), individual MOS's and Troposcatter Radio Relay Set AN/TRC-97.

(2) Familiarization firing was conducted at the Hoa Cam Regional Forces Training Center for 104 members of the Battalion. Weapons fired included Rifles M-14, M-16, Pistols, Caliber .45 and Shotguns, 12 Gauge for permanent members of the Battalion Security Platoon. In addition five hours of formal instruction was conducted on the M-16 rifle with emphasis on the care, handling and cleaning of the rifle and magazines and the reduction of stoppages by inserting only 18 rounds, vice 20, in each magazine.

(3) Six members of the Battalion attended "out of country" formal schools that are conducted by other commands.



PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the period of this report, Communication Company continued to provide communications support to the III MAF Headquarters. The total communication center message traffic count was 57,055- up slightly from the 55,891 reported for June. Operation of the AN/TCB-7 switchboard, initiated 27 June, continues smoothly. The switchboard operators rapidly learned to operate the new board. A test of the HF emergency circuit to NAVCOMMSTA PHIL was conducted on 31 July with unsatisfactory results. Detailed alert procedures have been implemented by the Communication Center and Wire Platoons located at III MAF Headquarters. The company underwent the FLC 1G inspection during the period 24-26 July. An informal critique reflected a "satisfactory with minor discrepancies" grade.
