Commanders Narrative Summary

1. During the period 1-31 August 1966 the 7th Communication Battalion has augmented the 1st Marine Division, III MAF and the 1st Marine Air Wing with personnel and equipment. The Battalion provided Communications support for Operations Colorado and Jackson.
2. Elements of this Battalion are engaged in the rehabilitation and expansion of the Chu Lai Area Cable System.
3. Communication Support Company is in DaNang with OPCON to III MAF, ADCON remains with 7th Communication Battalion. A team of 1 Officer and 39 Enlisted men with equipment is furnishing Communications for the 1st Military Police Battalion.
4. A team of 1 Officer and 19 Enlisted Marines is providing Communication support for the 2nd Korean Marine Brigade.

1. Communication Support Company is OPCON III MAF at DaNang while ADMINISTRATIVE control is retained by 7th Communication Battalion.

D. TRAINING

1. On 12 August 1966, 19 Officers and men attended a Mine and Booby Trap School presented by the 1st Engineer Battalion.

2. Personnel of this Command are presently undergoing training with the Division Communication Center, working with the model 28 Teletype equipment, Torn Tape Relay, the FSCC, the Combat Operation Center, and the Switchboard MTC-1. Two NCO's attended instruction on the KY-8.

3. Four personnel have been sent to the NAVCOMMSTA., P.I. for instruction on fixed plant procedures, 1 Officer is attending Embarkation School at Camp Butler, Okinawa.

E. SPECIAL OPERATIONS:

1. Radio Relay and Construction Company has had teams consisting of AN/MRC-62 and AN/MRC-63 participating in Operations Colorado and Jackson.

2. This organization has 12 AN/TRC-27, 3 AN/MRC-62 and 1 AN/MRC-63 with personnel operating at DaNang in support of III MAF.

3. Communication Support Company is in DaNang under OPCON of III MAF, providing support to the 1st Military Police Battalion, FLC/FLSG-A, and the Parchment Switchboard (Rear).

4. Personnel from Communication Company are operating Switchboards SB-86 at the 7th Marines and the 11th Marines. Have installed Switchboard SB-22 at the 1st Motor Transport Battalion and the 1st Medical Battalion. A team consisting of a MRC-83 team was in support of Operations Colorado and Jackson.

5. A team of 1 Officer and 19 men with equipment is assigned a mission to operate and maintain an area communications support facility in support of the 2nd Korean Marine Brigade.

6. The Chu Lai Defense Command Wire System is operated and maintained by this organization.

1. The 7th Communication Battalion is under the ADMINISTRATION CONTROL of the 1st Marine Division (Reinforced), FMF.
2. OPERATIONAL CONTROL of 7th Communication Battalion is under the 1st Marine Division. Division has OPERATIONAL CONTROL of Battalion, Battalion has OPERATIONAL CONTROL of Companies.
3. Communication Support Company remains OPERATIONAL CONTROL III MAF.
4. The Commanding Officer of Communication Support Company OPERATIONAL CONTROL III MAF was Medical Evacuated on 23 August 1966. Orders were issued by 3rd Marine Division transferring him to Camp Butler by Service Record while sick on or about 25 August 1966.

I. LOGISTIC:

1. Major damage as a result of hostile action occurred on 20 August 1966 when a truck cargo, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ 6x6 M-35, detonated a mine while on an Administrative mission and sustained \$149.74 damages in the front body area including radiator, hood, lights, and windshield. Vehicle was repaired and returned to service after three hours and twenty minutes.
2. Camp construction has been at a standstill due to material shortages. Priority items not constructed yet include a well, showers, butler buildings and 49 strongback/wooden quarters, shops and Admin structures. Major construction completed during August include a galley and messhall.
3. An Enlisted Club was contracted for and is nearing completion.
4. Supply support has improved considerably with a total of 700 requisitions filled from 1549 submitted. For a fill rate of 45% compared to 30% during July 1966.
5. Maintenance support from FLSG-B in all areas including Electronics, Motor Transport and Engineer has been excellent.
