

PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

The company continued support of United States and Korean Marine units in the Danang TAOR with POL products. During the month of December 1969, the company effected improvement in the equipment and supplies on hand and improvement in the readiness of equipment. Three of the fuel systems, amphibious assault, M64, which had been deadlined since April 27, 1969, were removed from deadline by the receipt of sufficient hose, 4" X 50', to support these systems. Nine of the sixteen systems remain deadlined for lack of sufficient hose and/or pumps to support this equipment. Efforts have been made and are continuing to reduce the allowances authorized the company to those of a separate bulk fuel company, versus the allowances of a separate bulk fuel company as augmented by the major end items authorized a bulk fuel company, supply battalion. Until such time as authority is received to reduce these allowances, efforts must continue to obtain equipment and supplies which are not needed and which will only be subjected to deterioration in the environment of Vietnam. During the period indicated, the company issued 262,063 gallons of diesel fuel, 171,351 gallons of mogas and 3041 drums of POL products.
