PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the period 1-7 October 1967, this battalion continued in the occupation and defense of the CON TTIEN Complex (VD 11400) to include the mission of conducting ground surveillances and spoiling attacks throughout assigned OA with assigned forces to detect and destroy infiltrating NVA forces. In addition, this unit maintained security on Route #561 by aggressive patrolling and the providing of security on Route #561 for mine sweep teams.

On 071000Z October 1967 this battalion relieved the OPCON of the CON TTIEN Complex to the 3d Battalion, 9th Marines. This unit returned to DONG HA for the period 7-13 October and resumed the mission of the regimental reserve.

On 100900Z October 1967 this battalion commenced its move from DONG HA to TON SON LAM (XD 982545). At 101800Z October 1967 this battalion relieved the 3d Battalion, 3d Marines and became OPCON to the 3d Marine Regiment. The last elements of this unit closed on TON SON LAM on 11 October 1967. Operation areas were established at TON SON LAM (XD 982545), the "FISUBJAL" (XD 974565), and CAUJ (XD 912455, with CP's on the "ROCKPILE" (XD 971758) and the "R. COB'OW" (XD 965513). Immediately aggressive small unit patrolling and operations were initiated.

In addition, during the period 11-31 October 1967, platoon patrols and company operations were conducted. All activities were directed at accomplishing the missions assigned.

a. Combat missions assigned.

- (1) Occupy and defend the COM THUEN Complex.
- (2) Be prepared on order to provide relief/reinforcement to GIO LINH artillery outpost and CUA VIET Facility in the event of enemy attacks.
- (3) Conduct ground surveillance and spoiling attacks throughout assigned TAOR with assigned forces to detect and destroy infiltrating NVA forces.
- (4) Maintain security of Route #561 in OA by aggressive patrolling along flanks.
- (5) Deny enemy access through "ROCKPILE"/THUON SON LAM area.
- (6) Conduct operations to maintain security of MSR Route #9 in OA.
- (7) Maintain Patrol Base at CA LU in conjunction with RF's to deny enemy access through CA LU and B^ LONG Valley.
- (8) Conduct operations to interdict enemy LOC's and destroy enemy forces in assigned CA.

b. Significant operations conducted. Normal company operations in conjunction with Operation KIL-ESTER

e. New techniques employed. None.

f. Command relations. Command relations with all supporting units continued to be excellent. Coordination and assistance received on all levels of command functions has been excellent. During the period 1-9 October 1967 this battalion functioned under the OPCON of the 9th Marine Regiment and from 10 to 31 October 1967, under OPCON 3d Marine Regiment.

g. Equipment. During this period there were no serious problems with equipment and normal Marine Corps issue was sufficient in all respects.

h. Logistics.

(1) Supply and Redistribution.

(a) During this period all M16E1 rifles had their buffer groups changed. While this buffer lowers the cyclic rate of fire, it reduces stoppages. All missing .32 gear was replaced and soiled and unscrivable utilities were surveyed.

(b) The armory obtained an indoor "hot-locker". This locker is 16'x8'x2' and has a demand heater, two heaters and lights. This should alleviate weapon rust during the monsoon season. It is imperative that all weapons be in some sort of heated locker.

(c) The armory is in the process of checking all weapons in the battalion. When this is accomplished the weapons will be turned to the Company Commanders rather than being held centrally by Battalion Supply.

(d) October began a new quarter. For this quarter this battalion was allocated \$140,000.00. Last quarter the battalion spent \$208,094.13 on SFM items alone.

(e) An inspection team which had previously inspected this battalion's supply system, revisited this unit. The purpose was to check if prior discrepancies were corrected. All corrections had been or are being corrected.

(2) Transportation.

(a) Shop space is presently available for 3d echelon maintenance.

(b) The majority of the MT Section is located with this CP where greater control of vehicles can be maintained.

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## (3) Miscellaneous.

(a) Resupply is now being accomplished by truck convoy. This helps solve the major resupply problems, however, detached company positions have been difficult to reach and will become more so as the monsoon season sets in. Consideration must be given for alternate resupply means to the outlying positions at this time.

(1) There has been considerable difficulty in obtaining and using forklifts for loading vehicles for convoys due to maintenance problems and breakdowns. Every ingenuitive method has been attempted to alleviate this but so far to no avail. This one major defect in the logistics system has resulted in the convoys either being extremely late in departure or not being able to load at all.

## i. Civic Action.

(1) The 3d Battalion, 9th Marines has been assigned Civic Action responsibility for the CA LU area. This area contains only three villages. CHAN RO and L C CAT are both Montagnard and B THUC is Vietnamese. A census is currently being conducted to determine the population and governmental structure of these villages.

(2) The Battalion Civil Affairs Officer has established liaison with the local leaders of all three villages. An initial investigation has been conducted to determine the needs of the area to determine possible methods of assistance and discuss any potential problems that might arise in relations between the resident company and the villagers. MedCap is currently being conducted as an initial step to make contact with people.

(3) A serious problem concerning civil life in this area is a shortage of food. This is related to our inability to move safely to COMUSO to sell local products and purchase necessities. At present they have no ability to protect their villages at night. Because of this they are forced to assist VC/NVA at times and unable to cooperate openly with Allied Forces for fear of reprisal.

j. Administration. There were no administrative difficulties encountered during this period.

k. Personnel. Replacement personnel have not been available in sufficient quantities to fully replace losses due to combat and rotation to COMUS.

## l. Intelligence.

(1) Other,

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(a) Temperature - the mean maximum temperature ranged between 85 to 90 degrees fahrenheit. The mean minimum temperature ranged between 67 to 72 degrees fahrenheit.

(b) Winds - the winds were from the east to northeast at a mean speed of 5 to 8 knots.

(c) Precipitation - the precipitation increased until the middle of the month and then decreased.

(d) Humidity - the relative humidity averaged 87%, but the average is steadily decreasing.

(e) Clouds - cloudiness increased after the first of the month. Clouds were at high altitudes except during rainy periods. The sun shines through 4 days out of ten. Usually clearing occurs between 0200 and 0500.

(f) Visibility - visibility was limited only during rainy period (2 to 3 days) and early morning hours due to fog.

## (2) Terrain.

(a) Rockpile - USMC observation post at (XD 979528) is the most dominant terrain feature in the area and provides the best observation of the TAOR.

(b) Road - the north-south road (XD 999564) to (XD 980436) is an all weather road and accurately marked on the map. (TON DOC KINH, Sheet 6342II and 6342I.)

(c) Villages - all villages except the one around CA LU (XD 013543) are destroyed but can be recognized as such. The villages around CA LU are presently occupied.

(d) Observation and fields of fire - the thick brush and vines which cover the mountains severely hamper observation and fields of fire. Some slopes of the mountains are covered with elephant grass from knee to head high. The low grassy areas offer excellent observation and fields of fire. The low lands are either covered with thick brush which limits observation severely or is marshland or old rice paddies covered with knee high to waist high grass and permits excellent observation and fields of fire.

(e) Cover and concealment - concealment, except in the areas of low grass, is excellent to outstanding. There is excellent cover in the area.

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(f) Obstacles - the major obstacle for foot troops is thick brush, parts of which are almost impenetrable. The streams and rivers during and after rains become obstacles. Trucks and tanks are limited to road travel because of the wet marshy low-lands and steep hillsides.

(g) Landing zones - PL's are limited to low grassy areas and rice paddies.

(h) Mountains - the mountains are mostly covered with thick vegetation, some of which is secondary jungle. This severely hampers movement of troops. The slopes of the mountains are not so steep that troops can not move up them with full combat gear.

(i) Effect on enemy operations - the excellent concealment of the vegetation in the area favors the enemy, but it also hampers his movement. Water is plentiful from the many streams which rain forest and clear.

### (3) Enemy Situation.

(a) Composition - from reports received, it is believed that elements of the 8th Battalion 29th Regiment, 3250 Division are operating in the area. Last known position of this unit was grid square YD 9250 with elements operating along Route #9 between 3d Battalion, 9th Marines CP (YD 982542) and (YD 012452). Estimated personnel strength of the 8th Battalion, 29th Regiment is 370.

### (4) Enemy Activity.

(a) Enemy activity in the area of the "Rockpile" and CA LU, has been considerably light. A total of 10 sightings occurred during the period. In a few instances the enemy usually in groups of 4-5, were moving southeast. One 82mm mortar position was found with 12 firing holes and AD 281541 report was received that VC were recruiting children 10 years and older to poison water and water cans at and military installations.

### m. Communications

(1) General. The main events concerning operational communications for October was the move from CON THIEU to DONG LA, then from DONG LA to THON SON LAI.

(2) Wire Section. The wire section of the communications platoon assisted in all the moves the battalion made this month.

(a) The section coordinated the placement or replacement of telephone and wire gear with the 1st Battalion 9th Marines at the

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from CON TIEN, and with 3d Battalion, 3d Marines in the move to THON SON LAM.

(b) Upon return to the rear all equipment used while at CON THIEU, was cleaned and repaired. The section repaired all OP lines which were not operating when we arrived at THON SON LAM. After the old system of the 3d Battalion, 3d Marines was put into temporary working order, it was replaced by a completely new system. The old system was torn out and disposed of. A battalion directory and Third Marine Division traffic diagram has been prepared. The section has continued to support the battalion in repairing broken lines, and replacing telephones which no longer meet correct operating standards.

(3) Radio Section.

(a) This section provided continuous communications for the moves from CON TIEN to DONG HA, then from DONG HA to THON SON LAM.

(b) Upon arrival at THON SON LAM, the section established four main nets used by this battalion: Regimental TACT, Battalion TACT, and Battalion ADMIN, and a Relay Net. The Admin net has been moved from the COC bunker to the S-1 tent.

(4) Message Center.

(a) An attempt was made with radio relay to set up a teletype circuit to 3d Marines but failed because of technical problems. All message center personnel were instructed on the procedures to set up a successful teletype circuit and on the basic functions of the KY-8 and KYK-12.

(b) This section is now serving as a message center for distribution within the battalion. By using messengers in coordination with the Motor Transport Section, runs are made twice daily at specific times to the 3d Marines.

(5) Tech Shop. During this period the tech shop has accomplished the following:

(a) Major items

1. Repaired 19 items.
2. Evacuated to 3d echelon or beyond 12 items.

(b) Minor items

1. Repaired 21 items.
2. Evacuated to 3d echelon or beyond 12 items.

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n. Fire Support.

(1) Units in direct support of this battalion during the month of October were

(2) During the month of October, direct fire support artillery fired 290 missions. There were 75 unobserved and 215 observed missions. In addition there were 12 illumination missions fired.

(3) During the period a total of 11,680 rounds of WP and 224 rounds of illumination were expended. There were 498 WP concentrations with 6,704 rounds fired during the period.
