

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PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During April 1970, the 9th Engineer Battalion was under the command of Lieutenant Colonel JOHN P. KRAYNAK. The Battalion continued its primary mission of maintenance and upgrading of Vietnam Route #1 from Tam Ky (BT293240) north to the Ly Ly River (BT145457), and haul support for the placement of base material from the end of the present pavement (BT210373), to the Ly Ly River, with deliberate minesweeps from the end of the pavement to Song Ba Ren Bridge (BT102510). The Battalion continued limited engineer support to the Americal Division, USA, MCB-7, USN, and other Free World Forces in the Chu Lai, Tam Ky, and Northern Americal Division Area of Operations. Relocation of the Battalion to the First Marine Division AO has brought forth new projects and assistance to units in the DaNang area.
2. Company "B", located at Hill #10 (BT199389), continued its primary mission of minesweeps, maintenance and upgrading in preparation for asphaltic paving of Vietnam Route #1 from the end of the pavement to the Ly Ly River, a total of 7.8 miles. The company continued construction support to Free World Forces throughout their area of operation. On 11 April 1970 the First Platoon turned the platoon compound at Tam Ky (BT293240) over to elements of the 39th Engineer Battalion, 45th Engineer Group, USA, and then moved to the "B" Company compound at Hill #10 (BT199389) on 11 April 1970. The First Platoon then moved from Hill #10 to Headquarters Battalion, 1st Marine Division (AT955749) on 24 April 1970 for assistance in installation of new defensive wire in Dai La Pass (AT939752), and other emergency support to Headquarters Battalion.
3. Company "C", located at Hill #34 (AT982711) from 1-24 April 1970 relocated to the Battalion Compound at DaNang on 25 April 1970. The First Platoon remained in the Chu Lai Compound as security. Elements of the second and third platoon returned to Chu Lai to dismantle five Butler Buildings during the period 17-27 April. The company's primary mission continued to be the hauling of base rock in preparation for asphaltic paving of Vietnam Route #1 from the end of the present pavement to the Ly Ly River.
4. Company "D", located at Landing Zone Baldy (BT136448), continued the primary mission of daily minesweeps on Vietnam Route #1 from the Ly Ly Bridge, north to the Song Ba Ren Bridge (BT102510) a distance of 4.8 miles, and haul support from the end of the pavement to the Ly Ly Bridge.

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The company also has the responsibility for support to the 10th ARVN Group on Route 535, and continued engineer support to Free World Forces throughout their area of operations.

5. During the month of April 1970, the Battalion continued to stress its primary missions of minesweeps, upgrading, and haul support to Vietnam Route #1.

a. The upgrading and maintenance tasks on QL-1 were concentrated toward support of MCB-7, USN in preparations for paving of the road with asphaltic concrete from the end of the pavement to the Ly Ly Bridge.

b. During the reporting period, the following mineral products were emplaced on QL-1 in accordance with assigned tasks from Tam Ky to the Ba Ren Bridge: 4,916 cubic yards of two inch minus base rock, 1,275 cubic yards of six inch minus base rock, 28 cubic yards of shot rock, 150 cubic yards of laterite, 223 cubic yards of three quarter inch aggregate, 257 cubic yards of sand, 150 gallon's of peneprime/RC 800, and 90 tons of asphaltic concrete.

6. The second Provisional Land Clearing Company continued to conduct operations in the First Armored Brigade, ARVN, area of operations. Other units participating were the 37th and 39th ARVN Ranger Battalions, First Armored Brigade, ARVN; one company of the 196th Light Infantry Brigade, Americal Division, USA; and the 7th Armored Cavalry, ARVN.

c. 04 April 1970

(1) 041430H at AT948754 one M-16 anti-personnel mine found in stack of concertina wire in Battalion compound. Lot No# 28-3, notified EOD, who then removed the mine.

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d. 07 April 1970

(1) 070840H at BT117493 Company "D" Sweep Team found one M-72 LAAW on side of road, negative lot #, destroyed in place.

e. 10 April 1970

(1) 100859 at BT116494 Vietnamese civilian turned in to "D" Company Sweep Team with shrapnel wounds, medevaced by vehicle to Hill 63.

f. 14 April 1970

(1) 140745H at BT219359 Company "B" reported bridge wing wall partly destroyed by enemy activity, road passable, no structural damage to bridge.

(2) 142350H at AT986748 West perimeter of C Sector Bunker #2 reported approximately 10 rounds small arms fire passed over head. 2350, bunker #4 reported approximately 10 rounds passed over that position. Information reported to NSDC.

g. 15 April 1970

(1) 150840H at BT208375 Company "B" Sweep Team found one 4.2 inch mortar round lot No# LCP-105-93.

(2) 150835H at BT206377 Company "B" Sweep Team found two 60mm rounds, negative lot #, destroyed in place.

Used grappling hooks on booby trapped stake, no damage, no casualties, destroyed leaflets, all propaganda material returned to Company "D" cantonment to check intelligence value, negative value reported.

(2) 161515H at BT219359 Company "B" Sweep Team found one 10# nitro-starch anti-personnel mine (booby trapped) approximately 4 meters NW end of bridge 29. Disarmed with grappling hooks and wire cutters, removed from site for destruction.
