## PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During January 1969, the 11th Marines continued to provide supporting fires for the 1st Marine Division in its defense of the Danang vital area and in operations in the Quang Nam and southern Thua Thien Provinces. In addition, continued support was provided to Division Reconnaissance Teams, Combined Action Platoons, USA, USN, CIDG, KTC and ARVN forces.

Artillery fires accounted for 257 of the 802 enemy killed within the Division Area of Operations. A total of 178,280 rounds were expended on 22,485 missions during the month.

Operation Linn River was initiated on 27 January and continued during the month. The operation is supported by the 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines in support of the 7th Marines. Operation Taylor Common also continued during the month of January. The operation is supported by the 1st Field Artillery Group in support of Task Force Yankee.

Improved conventional munitions (FIRECRACKER) continued to be employed throughout the 1st Marine Division TAOR. The Regiment fired 21 FIRECRACKER missions during the month accounting for 78 VC/NVA KIA. All surveillances represent confirmed KIA's and do not include additional probable KIA's. Total FIRECRACKER expenditures for the month were 904 rounds.

On 25 January at 0015, Battery T, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines fired on 20 NVA at grid AT 965515, resulting in 20 KIA. The mission was observed by an observer with the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines. On 29 January at 2130, Battery K, 4th Battalion, 13th Marines; Battery T, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines; Platoon A, 3rd 155mm Gun Battery; 1st Platoon, 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery, 3rd Platoon, 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery; Battery K, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines and Battery L, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines fired on VC crossing a river at grid AT 982539, resulting in 72 KIA. The mission was observed by an observer from the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines.

Counter-rocket drills continued during the month. Chart drills were conducted unannounced each night and counter-rocket firing drills were conducted nightly on possible rocket positions.

The enemy initiated two rocket attacks during the month. The targets included the Marble Mountain Air Facility and Danang airfield (1st Marine Air Wing). The average artillery reaction time for counter-fire during these attacks was approximately three minutes.

On 15 January 1969, the Commanding Officer of 1st Battalion, 12th Marines, LtCol E.L. WHISMAN, was killed in action when the helicopter in which he was riding was shot down by enemy ground fire during Operation Taylor Common.

2. Intelligence

a. During the month of January enemy attacks against artillery units increased from the previous reporting period. A total of 7 small arms fire incidents were recorded during the month.

b. The following significant incidents took place during the month of January 1969:

- (1) 010855H: 11th Marines AO (BT 075685) sighted 7 slit trenches and 1 open grave.
- (2) 012030H: 11th Marines NSDC (AT 974774) found cache where 2 AK-47's, 1 .45 Pistol and 1 B-40 Rocket Launcher were hidden.
- (3) 020900H: 11th Marines Rocket Inspection Team (BT 049647) found 1 122mm rocket site with 2 launch positions. Launchers had been used; estimated 6 rounds fired.
- (4) 021500H: K/4/11 (AT 879579) paid 5,450 VN\$ to VN boys for delivery of 3 60mm mortar rounds, 1 81mm mortar round, 2 105mm rounds, 1 155mm WP round and 67 7.62mm rounds.
- (5) 031655H: 11th Marines AO (AT 862673) located an automatic weapons position and numerous fighting holes.

- (6) 090710H: 11th Marines AO (BT 074626) received small arms fire and returned fire resulting in 2 NVA KIA.
- (7) 091800H: 11th Marines AO (BT 074626) received small arms fire from an estimated company.
- (8) 101000H: 11th Marines AO (BT 059632) sighted 4 NVA in bunker, fired resulting in 1 NVA KIA.
- (9) 110800H: 11th Marines AO (BT 063643) received small arms fire.
- (10) 121700H: 11th Marines AO (BT 033602) received ground fire.
- (11) 021400H: 1/11 (AT 965718) paid VN boys 280 VN\$ for 2 M-16 magazines and 30 rounds.
- (12) 081000H: 1/11 (AT 965718) paid 2 VN boys 200 VN\$ for 35 M-16 rounds.
- (13) 101430H: 1/11 (AT 985720) paid children at gate 470 VN\$ for 1 .50 caliber round, 2 7.62mm rounds and 84 M-16 rounds.
- (14) 121600H: 1/11 (AT 985720) paid children 180 VN\$ for 30 M-16 rounds.
- (15) 141600H: 1/11 (AT 985720) paid VN children 100 VN\$ for 25 M-16 rounds and 2 radio batteries.
- (16) 181700H: 11th Marines AO (AT 939597) received small arms fire.
- (17) 221000H: 11th Marines Rocket Inspection Team (AT 961679) found 36 mud ramps and one control pit. Estimated 36 140mm rockets had been launched from site.

3. Organization and Operations. Units of the Regiment participated in two operations in the Danang area during the month of January 1969. These were:

- a. Operation TAYLOR COMMON, 1-31 Jan 1969. APPENDIX 5 to ANNEX C.
- b. Operation LINN RIVER, 27-31 Jan 1969. APPENDIX 6 to ANNEX C.

4. Training

a. Forward observer training of non-artillery personnel was again conducted this month. Recipients of this training were personnel from the 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th Combined Action Groups, 1st Reconnaissance Battalion, Division Scout Snipers School, 5th, 7th and 26th Marines and Headquarters Battalion, 1st Marine Division. A total of 265 students received two hours of classroom instruction and from four to six hours of practical application.

b. During the month sixty officers and staff noncommissioned officers of the 1st MP Battalion were given a two hour period of instruction on the artillery's role in the defense of the Danang area and also the mission of the artillery in the counter-rocket program.

c. In the month of January a contact team from FMFPAC conducted a class in multi-fuel engines for motor transport supervisors; a total of 70 students from the 11th Marines attended this two-day class.

d. Four officers and ninety enlisted Marines attended in-country Division level schools and seven officers and twenty enlisted Marines attended out-of-country schools.

5. Logistics

a. During the period 1-31 January 69, this Regiment was augmented with fifty-seven tractor-trailers for the transportation of artillery ammunition. In addition, augmentation was received for movement of seven TD-15/EIMCO tractors within battalion areas and/or to and from Force Service Regiment.

b. Fifteen new TD-18 tractors were received as replacements for TD-15 tractors held by 1/11, 2/11, 3/11 and 4/11. Limited Technical Inspections and acceptance checks are in progress and the new tractors will be placed in an operational status upon completion of Operators Maintenance School to be conducted by the 1st Engineer Battalion.

6. Civic Action Report for Headquarters Battery, 11th Marines

MedCaps and emergency medical aid were offered in the hamlet of Da Son (AF 960765). Emergency medical care was maintained on an on-call status. During the month, twenty-six MedCaps were conducted with an average of 32 patients treated on each occasion. Four rabies cases were referred to the

USOM hospital by the Regimental Surgeon and fourteen local civilians were treated at the 11th Marines Dental unit.

General WALT scholarships were presented to two Da Son elementary school students.

Headquarters Battery has continued to provide waste foods for supporting the pig project in Da Son. A U.S. Army Veterinarian made two visits to Da Son hamlet to administer immunization and antibiotics to a sick sow.

Headquarters Battery provided barbed wire and sandbags to the hamlet during the month to improve Popular Forces fortifications.

#### 7. Air Observation

The 11th Marines A.O. Unit flew 164 sorties during the month of January in support of the 11th Marines and other 1st Marine Division units, for a total of 396.6 hours of aircraft time with 292.8 hours of A.O. on-station time.

During the month of January, the 11th Marines Regimental A.O. Unit was partially supported by aircraft from VMO-1 and MAG-16, which are based at Marble Mountain Air Facility. The unit also had light observation helicopters attached from the 11th Light Infantry Brigade, 196th Light Infantry Brigade, and the 198th Light Infantry Brigade, Americal Division, USA. In addition, the A.O. Unit received support from the 21st Reconnaissance Airplane Company.

Missions flown by the 11th Marine Regiment are as follows:

Mission 6 - which is an artillery spot mission flown in an OV-10 from VMO-2 based at Marble Mountain Air Facility; further defined as 6A for morning, 6B for noon time and 6C for evening.

Mission 6 Augment - is flown 3 times daily from 11th Marines Regimental CP, supported by above listed Army aviation units.

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR KEEPING JOURNAL

### 1. Heading:

#### a. Unit or Section:

- (1) Enter designation of unit if this is a unit journal for regiment, air group, or smaller unit.
- (2) Enter designation of section if this is a section journal maintained by a general staff section.

#### b. Place: Enter coordinates or name of locality.

#### c. From: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is opened.

#### d. To: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is closed.

### 2. Body:

#### a. Time In:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time information is received within unit. In most instances this would be TOR at unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time information is received within section.

#### b. Time Out:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time outgoing information is delivered to addressee. In most instances this would be TOD by unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time outgoing message is delivered to originator's communication center for transmittal, or time information is transmitted by releasing section.

#### c. Serial No.: Number each entry consecutively as information is received by keeper of journal.

#### d. DTG: Enter date/time group of radio message.

#### e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:

(1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.

(2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information, such as what, where, when, how, and who.

(3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.

(4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.

(5) Oral messages are reduced to writing and processed like written messages.

f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as, routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "T", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.

### 3. Ending:

a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."

b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

### 4. Journal File:

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR KEEPING JOURNAL

### 1. Heading:

#### a. Unit or Section:

- (1) Enter designation of unit if this is a unit journal for regiment, air group, or smaller unit.
- (2) Enter designation of section if this is a section journal maintained by a general staff section.

#### b. Place: Enter coordinates or name of locality.

#### c. From: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is opened.

#### d. To: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is closed.

### 2. Body:

#### a. Time In:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time information is received within unit. In most instances this would be TOR at unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time information is received within section.

#### b. Time Out:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time outgoing information is delivered to addressee. In most instances this would be TOD by unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time outgoing message is delivered to originator's communication center for transmittal, or time information is transmitted by releasing section.

#### c. Serial No.: Number each entry consecutively as information is received by keeper of journal.

#### d. DTG: Enter date/time group of radio message.

#### e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:

(1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.

(2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information, such as what, where, when, how, and who.

(3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.

(4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.

(5) Oral messages are reduced to writing and processed like written messages.

f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as, routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "T", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.

### 3. Ending:

a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."

b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

### 4. Journal File:

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.
