PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Throughout the month of November the 1st Battalion, 11th Marines continued its assigned mission of Direct Support of the 1st Marine Regiment. During the month the 105mm batteries were positioned as follows: Battery 'A' collocated with 1st Battalion, 1st Marines CP (BT019627); Battery 'B' collocated with 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines CP (BT070656); and Battery 'C' located on Hill 55 (AT963609). The 107mm Mortar Battery remained under the operational control of 1st Battalion, 13th Marines with the Headquarters Section and three (3) tubes located at Hill 10 (AT922693), and three (3) tubes located at Hai Van Pass (AT943916). During the month Mortar Battery fired 1,241 missions and expended 7,802 rounds.

At 1800 on 7 November Operation "Pipestone Canyon" ended. During this 1st Marines operation in the Dodge City and Go Noi Island area which lasted 166 days, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines fired 7,299 missions, expended 126,396 rounds of ammunition, and was credited with 183 KIA's while sustaining no casualties.

Enemy activity in 1st Marines FAOR remained at a low level throughout the month and the battalion provided artillery support for the numerous squad sized patrols and ambushes conducted both day and night. Throughout the month the battalion maintained an extensive program of fires on intelligence targets in order to deny the enemy freedom of movement, to disrupt his lines of communications and destroy his staging areas.

At 0635 on 11 November, five (5) 140mm rocket rounds impacted in the Division CP area and in response to this attack Battery 'C' fired a total of 37 rounds on three (3) suspected rocket launching positions with negative surveillance.

On the 19th of November the battalion fired its first mission for an observer team equipped with the Integrated Observation Device. This team is located on Hill 119 (AT98725081) and part of its zone of observation includes the Go Noi Island area which is within range of Battery 'A' and 'C'. During the remainder of the month this team was able to acquire numerous targets that were engaged by these two batteries. Battery 'A' was credited with 22 KIA's and Battery 'C' was credited with 48 KIA's by this team.

On 25 November an observation team equipped with the IOD was positioned on Hill 55 (AT96656158) and on 29 November observed a group of VC/NVA proceedings north along the berm in the Dodge City area. Battery 'A' and Battery 'B' were massed on this target and each battery was credited with 1 KIA.

The month of November was characterized by a general low level of enemy activity with a few unsuccessful attacks by fire. The downward trend in mine and booby-trap incidents within the 1st Marines TAOR continued. There were 140 incidents during the month as compared with 164 in October and 242 in September.

On 19 November the 51st ARVN Regiment captured a Viet Cong Operations Order which indicated that attacks were to be made on Eich Sac (AT986635), Duc Ky (1) (AT978612), Hill 42 (AT948598), and Hill 55 (AT970620). The document indicated that the first three locations would be subjected to ground attacks, while Hill 55 would be attacked by fire. Appropriate action was taken based on this intelligence but the attacks never materialized and upon reevaluation the document indicated that a reconnaissance of these areas was to be made for possible future attacks.

The target acquisition capability within 1st Marines TAOR was enhanced dramatically during the month by the operations of observer teams equipped with the Integrated Observation Device (IOD). As part of the 1st Marines Artillery Surveillance plan, two (2) of these teams provided surveillance of 1st Marines TAOR, particularly in the Dodge City and Go Noi Island areas. One team was located on Hill 119 (AT98725081) throughout the month and a second team occupied "OP Laugh" (AT96656158) on 25 November. The team located on Hill 119 was particularly successful in locating enemy personnel targets and 1st Battalion, 11th Marines was credited with 70 kills by this team during the month.

c. Maintenance, Equipment and Supply

Throughout the month all batteries continued to improve their positions. Two (2) new sleeping bunkers were built in the Headquarters Battery area, all SEA huts were completed for Battery 'A', several key bunkers at the Battery 'B' position were given a concrete covering, five (5) of the 13 SEA huts planned for Battery 'C' were completed, and Mortar Battery renewed approximately 10,000 sand bags in their position. Enlargement and improvement of the mess hall on Hill 55 was begun by personnel from the Naval Construction Battalion and at the end of the month the mess hall was turned over to the 1st Marines.

The Headquarters Battery Motor Transport Section built another shop space and construction of a new motor transport shop for Battery 'A' was begun. The battalion received a motor transport chief and additional mechanics and the addition of these personnel made it possible to improve the supervision of 1st echelon maintenance and increased the frequency of 2nd echelon maintenance. One TD-13 was repaired by FSN and parts for the other TD-13 have been obtained, thereby improving the battalion's engineer capability.

d. Civic Action/Civil Affairs

The battalion continued its civic action efforts in the village of Le Son (1) (AT985655) during the month of November. In addition to weekly

MEDECAPS to the village, almost daily contact was maintained in order to provide assistance in the construction of a village office. The S-5 Section provided concrete, wood and tin and the villagers fabricated the concrete blocks for the office. By the end of the month the villagers had erected nearly half of the building. A pump was installed in one of the southeast wells of the village on 29 November and another pump will be installed in December. The battalion continued to provide support to the Dieu Dien Orphanage (BT029766) in DaNang City. Food, school kits, shower shoes and cooking bunkers were made available to the orphanage during November.

During the month AIK funds were used to pay for the local labor used in the construction of bunkers for Battery 'B' and a program was initiated for using additional AIK funds to pay the children of Le Son for filling sand bags.

e. Training

The majority of the training accomplished by the battalion during the month was in the form of on the job MOS training as operations against the enemy continued. Each section was able to devote at least an hour a week to formal MOS training and each firing battery conducted formal cannoner's drill for an hour each day. Approximately two hours a week were utilized to provide general military subjects training for all personnel. Subjects covered included personal response, familiarization firing of personal and crew served weapons, drug abuse and field sanitation. All of the planning was completed for a new indoctrination program and for improving the training of fire controlmen assigned to the firing batteries. Both of these programs will begin in the first week of December.

f. Operations

All batteries of the battalion remained in their original position during the month of November. The 107mm Mortar Battery remained under the operational control of 1st Battalion, 13th Marines. There were few ground attacks or attacks by fire in the 1st Marines TAOR and the majority of the battalion's support was rendered on intelligence targets.

Operation "Pipestone Canyon" was completed on 7 November. On 19 November the battalion initially utilized the target acquisition capability of the 11th Marines observer teams equipped with the Integrated Observation Device (IOD). These teams submit target locations in terms of an azimuth, slant range and vertical angle. From this information the target grid is determined; when using the FADAC this is done in a matter of seconds and when using manual fire direction procedures, the conversion to horizontal range for purposes of a polar plot takes less than a minute. The battalion provided support for a second team equipped with the IOD beginning on 25 November. The battalion was credited with 72 enemy KIA's resulting from missions on targets acquired by these two teams.
