PART II
NARRATIVE SUMMARY1. PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATION

There were 17 battle casualties during the month of September 1967, 14 WIA's; and 3 KIA's. Personnel losses due to administrative reasons included 38 Marine enlisted, and 3 Marine officers. In return this command received 23 Marine enlisted and 7 Marine officers. During the month of September, 4 Marine officers and 36 Marine enlisted promotions were effected. On 29 Sep 1967, LCol D. A. CLARK assumed command of the 2d Battalion, 11th Marines from LCol R. E. HUNTER Jr at a Change of Command Ceremony held at 2d Battalion, 11th Marines Command Post. Distinguished guests included Col E. W. PAYNE, Commanding Officer of the 11th Marines and Col S. DAVIS, Commanding Officer of the 5th Marines.

2. ORGANIZATION AND OPERATIONS

During the month of September, the Battalion Command Post remained in position in the vicinity of Hill 63 (BT 139446). Battery D remained at QUE SON (BT 027341) during the entire month, providing direct support artillery for the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines. Battery E remained at AN HOA (AT 876476) providing direct support artillery for the 2d Battalion, 5th Marines. The Mortar Battery remained in position at Hill 63, until 10 September. The Mortar Battery displaced to THANG BINH (BT 165415) on 11 September to support Operation SWIFT. They returned to Hill 63 on 15 September. Battery F remained in position at Hill 63 until 11 September at which time they displaced to Hill 29 (BT 230316) to support Operation SWIFT. They returned to Hill 63 on 14 September.

During the month the Battalion supported Operation SWIFT (4-15 September (enclosures 2 and 3)). Battery F and the Mortar Battery were chopped OPCON to 1st Battalion, 11th Marines on 22 September to support Operation SHELBYVILLE. These batteries were chopped OPCON to 2d Battalion, 11th Marines on 28 September.

3. TRAINING

Scheduled training was suspended for the Battalion during the period 4-15 September while the Battalion provided the required support for Operation SWIFT. During the latter portion of the month all batteries accomplished a minimum scheduled amount of formal training. During the entire month, maximum participation was provided the formal school program of higher headquarters.

4. LOGISTICS, EQUIPMENT AND SUPPLIES

The major logistics effort of this organization during the month of September was the resupply of subordinate units by helicopter. Operation SWIFT was supported during this reporting period. The total pounds lifted for the month of September was 1,416,040 pounds. The majority of the supplies lifted were Class V, however, all classes contributed to the total weight. The unit at TIEN PHOUC, QUE SON were provided with "A" rations as they became available.

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. PERSONNEL ADMINISTRATION

LCol HUNTER presented six Purple Heart Awards to members of the 2d Battalion during the month of September.

2. ORGANIZATION AND OPERATIONS

On 6 September, Det Battery F reports 5 confirmed KIA and 9 confirmed WIA. One of the KIA's was the VC chief of PHOUC LOC Hamlet. One of the WIA's was the commander of the 109th VC company.

One 2 1/2 Ton 6x6 truck detonated a mine and was destroyed at BT 137439. Truck was in the vicinity of an operating engineer gravel pit. MedEvac called: 1 friendly KIA, 3 friendly WIA.

FSCC reports that a CH 53 helicopter dropped 100 rounds of 105mm ammunition at grid BT 089469. Artillery mission fired.

On 9 September, the Battalion received 11 rounds of enemy 82mm mortar fire in their position at Hill 63. Only light material damage incurred.

On 11 September, the Mortar Battery displaced to THANG BINH to support Operation SWIFT.

On 12 September, Battery F displaced from Hill 63 to Hill 29 to support Operation SWIFT.

On 14 September, Battery F displaced from Hill 29 to Hill 63.

On 15 September, the Mortar Battery returned to Hill 63.

Operation SWIFT terminated.

On 21 September, the 2d Battalion, 11th Marines Command Post received approximately 25 82mm enemy mortar rounds. No casualties or damage reported.

On 22 September, Battery F and Mortar Battery were chopped OPCON to the 1st Battalion, 11th Marines to support Operation SHELBYVILLE.

On 23 September, Battery D reports a 105mm round detonated in the tube on an unobserved mission. Personnel were routinely med evaced the following day.

On 28 September, Operation SHELBYVILLE terminated.

On 30 September, the Det Mortar Battery displaced to Hill 63.

a. Unit or Section:

- (1) Enter designation of unit if this is a unit journal for regiment, air group, or smaller unit.
- (2) Enter designation of section if this is a section journal maintained by a general staff section.

b. Place: Enter coordinates or name of locality.

c. From: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is opened.

d. To: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is closed.

2. Body:

a. Time In:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time information is received within unit. In most instances this would be TOR at unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time information is received within section.

b. Time Out:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time outgoing information is delivered to addressee. In most instances this would be TOD by unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time outgoing message is delivered to originator's communication center for transmittal, or time information is transmitted by releasing section.

c. Serial No.: Number each entry consecutively as information is received by keeper of journal.

d. DTG: Enter date/time group of radio message.

e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:

(1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.

(2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information, such as what, where, when, how, and who.

(3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.

(4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.

(5) Oral messages are reduced to writing and processed like written messages.

f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as, routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "T", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.

3. Ending:

a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."

b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

4. Journal File:

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.

i. Mission. To provide artillery support to Marine and ARVN Forces operating in the area of operations.

j. Concept of Operations. The 2d Battalion (-)(Rein) was directed to position sufficient artillery to support Task Force X-Ray and ARVN units during their eastward sweep from their initial positions toward Route #1.

k. Execution

(1) At 040500 Sep, all batteries of the 2d Battalion (-)(Rein) were in position to provide close continuous fire support to all participating units. Battery D was initially assigned the mission of Direct Support of the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines; Battery F was in Direct Support of the 3d Battalion, 5th Marines, while Battery F(X) and the Provisional 155mm Howitzer Battery were assigned General Support missions.

(2) In order to provide continuous effective fire support to the infantry units who were sweeping southeastward from their initial contacts towards Route #1, on 111600 Sep the Provisional 155mm Howitzer Battery displaced to THANG BINH (BT 165415) and was assigned the mission of Direct Support of the 3d Battalion, 5th Marines. Battery F reverted to General Support of Task Force X-Ray pending displacement. Battery F subsequently displaced on 121447 Sep to Hill 29 (BT 230316) and was assigned the mission of Direct Support of the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines. Battery D reverted to General Support of Task Force X-Ray.

(3) Following a helicopter displacement of both the 1st and 3d Battalions, 5th Marines the artillery missions were modified. At 132100 Sep the Provisional 155mm Howitzer Battery was assigned the mission of Direct Support of the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines vice Battery F who accepted a Direct Support mission for the 3d Battalion, 5th Marines. At 140730 Sep, Battery D was assigned the mission of Direct Support of the 3d Battalion, 5th Marines vice Battery F who was assigned General Support of Task Force X-Ray. At 141400 Sep, Battery F displaced to Hill 63 (BT 138446). On 150800 Sep, the Provisional 155mm Howitzer Battery was displaced to Hill 63.

(4) The 2d Battalion (-)(Rein) fired a total of 1203 missions on Operation SWIFT, expending 12,389 rounds and accounting for 34 confirmed and 65 probable KIA's as reported by reconnaissance teams and artillery forward observers.

l. Naval Gunfire. Naval gunfire support was not utilized during this operation.

m. Administrative Matters

(1) Supply - The LSA located at Hill 63 stored all classes of supplies and distributed supplies and ammunition principally by helicopter. Additionally, the ASP at DANANG provided a significant amount of ammunition resupply by

helicopter to Batteries D and F(X).

(2) Maintenance - The artillery support load carried by the 2d Battalion (-)(Rein) caused numerous weapons failures. Repair and maintenance of these pieces was hampered by a shortage of spare parts and the non-availability of helicopter transportation.

(3) Transportation - Helicopter resupply when available, was conducted at all times in a highly competent and professional manner. However, due to the heavy number of casualties suffered by the infantry units, a large number of the helicopters were diverted from resupply to evacuation missions. Non-availability of helicopters for resupply caused an acute shortage of ammunition and made emergency resupply missions necessary.

(4) Treatment of Casualties - Evacuation was administered by the & C unit located at Hill 63, and hospitalization was provided by the 1st Hospital Company located at CHU LAI and the NSA Hospital in DANANG.


n. Communications. No communications difficulties were encountered during the operation.

o. Special Equipment and Techniques. None

p. Commander's Analysis. Operation SWIFT showed the necessity to have National Route #1 in useable repair to rapidly deploy artillery by road between Hill 63 and TAM KY. The rapid thrust of operations made it mandatory to conduct helicopter reconnaissance for artillery positions and suitable road trafficability. This requirement was enhanced by unofficially "borrowing" helicopters from Army units operating in the area.

Artillery projectiles containing Riot Control Agent chemicals would have proved invaluable during heavy contacts to assist in controlling the battle field.

A shortage of 155mm howitzer spare parts continues to effect maximum employment of this venerable weapon.
