

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During June 1969 the 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines was in direct support of the 7th Marines in its assigned area of the DaNang AO.

With the exception of participation by Battery I-3-11 in Operation Bessyth Grove, no units of this Command were involved in any named operations. The month was marked by a relatively low level of enemy-initiated activity. Members of this Command took advantage of this period to build and improve defenses and living and working facilities.

b. Intelligence. Other than the launching of 2.75 aircraft rockets at Hill 55 by local enemy units in one incident, the enemy's basic tactics in this TAOR have not changed. Recent operations have forced him out of rear service areas and have denied him the initiative on the battlefield.

c. Organization and Operations. Battery I-3/11 was assigned OpCon to 2nd Bn 11th Marines at 301800H June 1969 for participation in Operation Forsyth Grove, an operation conducted by the 5th Marine Regiment.

d. Training. New members of this Battalion attended a three-day orientation program. Other training included GMST/MOS training, Personal Response, defense of the battery positions from sapper attacks, fan-firing of individual weapons and Drug Abuse. Special demonstrations were conducted using an NVA prisoner on how defensive wire is pen-

etrated by sappers preparing to attack a position.

e. Logistics, Equipment and Supply. Logistics, equipment and supply have been provided on a timely basis with no significant problems encountered. Overall logistics posture continues to be good.

f. Civic Action/Civil Affairs. MEDCAPS resumed weekly visits to Hoa Binh Hamlet. Eight (8) new piglets were born to a hamlet sow in this command's crossbreeding project. Material was provided for additional pens. Midwife supplies were distributed through the Battalion S-5.

g. PSYOPS. Nothing significant to report.

h. Combined Action Company Program. Nothing significant to report.

i. Medical. Treated 156 Marines and 9 Vietnamese on Hill 55.



NARRATIVE SUMMARY (Cont.)

The major concern for the S-4 during the month of April was logistics support for operation Oklahoma Hills. Planning for both operations and logistics commenced about mid-march and was marked by a great deal of staff liaison visits to the units to be involved in the operation. The S-4 section was tasked with the responsibility of logistics support for all of the artillery units. The following units were supported logistically by this Battalion's S-4 section:

Battery G-3/11
 Battery H-3/11
 Battery I-3/11
 Battery C-1/13
 Mortar Battery 1/13
 Battery K-4/11
 Platoon A, 1st Armored Amphibian Company
 2nd Platoon, 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery

To support the scheme of maneuver it was necessary to deploy units to remote fire support bases. The FSB's were RATTLESNAKE (Z123651), BUCKSKIN (AT835659), and MUSTANG (AT787551). In addition, firing positions at Hill 65 (AT883580) and Hill 10 (AT923691) were utilized during the operation. Logistical support was provided by 2 modes. FSB's Buckskin and Rattlesnake were supplied via helicopter. FSB Mustang and Hills 10 and 65 were supplied overland by motor vehicles.

To centralize and exercise effective control over logistics support a logistics operation center was established at the 7th Marines CP at Hill 55 (AT964611). This permitted all of the helicopter assets to be closely controlled and utilized. The LOC was manned on a 24 hours a day basis by a logistics representative from all the battalions involved in the operation. As a whole the operation was run very smoothly and efficiently. Adequate supplies were maintained on all the FSB's at all times. This insured the infantry continuous and adequate artillery support.

In addition to coordinating helicopter resupply to the FSB's, the facilities of the 11th Marines S-4 were utilized to coordinate the overland movement of supplies to FSB Mustang and Hill's 10 and 65.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY (Cont.)

A special logistics center was established by this battalion at FSB Mustang. It consisted of 1 officer and 4 enlisted men to handle and coordinate all of the supplies for that FSB. This enabled the battalion to make maximum utilization of all available classes of supply and it consequently took a big burden off of the individual units.

During the first 30 day period of this operation the artillery units at FSB Buckskin and Rattlesnake were supported with more than 1,090,000 pounds of supplies from the LSA at Hill 55. The other units at FSB Mustang and Hill's 10 and 65 received at least as much, if not more. The following is a breakdown of supplies helilifted from the LSA at Hill 55 and does not include any passengers or organic equipment which was lifted:

In all, the logistics support for Oklahoma Hills during April was considered to be efficient, well organized, and sufficient in all classes and it made possible continuous, close artillery support for the infantry scheme of maneuver.

b. Intelligence.

On 252225H April 69, observation posts manned by 3rd battalion, 26th Marines on Finger 3 of Hill 55 observed 6 to 8 enemy moving near the hill. 60mm mortar and two (2) hand illumination flares were fired. At 2230H, one (1) 250 lb bomb was catapulted on to Finger 3 from a position approximately 400 meters SSE of the hill. Impacting within the 3/26 position, the explosion caused 12 USMC WIA (E), all from 26th Marines. Crater analysis revealed a launch crater 5½ ft deep and 8-10 ft in diameter. The impact crater was 2½ ft by 4 ft and contained most of the shrapnel.

On 280925H April 69, one (1) 8-inch round impacted near the main gate of Hill 55, causing negative casualties or damage. A launch site could not be found, but analysis of the impact crater suggested that the round may have been catapulted in a manner similar to that used on 25 April 69.

Construction of a MedCap shelter proceeded in Hoa Binh Hamlet. Speed brakes were built on the road on the north end of Hoa Binh Hamlet. Pig project and similar plans temporarily postponed because of other manpower commitments.

Sanitation leaflets were distributed in Hoa Binh Hamlet. Plans were made to fire NVA-audience leaflets in the Operation Oklahoma Hills TAOR via artillery.
