



2. Commanding Officer's Narrative Summary of Significant Events

During the period 1 to 31 August, this battalion continued to support operations of the III MAF. The battalion and its assigned batteries have the following assigned missions:

4th Battalion (Rein)	G/S of 1st Marine Division

3d 8" How Battery (SP)	G/S
Battery "M" Forward	G/S 2d ARVN Division

This battalion continued to man an observation post at coordinates BS 517778 (Nui Tron). On 6 August, Battery "K" with four (4) 155mm Howitzers (towed) and 3d Platoon, 3d 8" How Battery (SP) reported to 2d Battalion, 11th Marines, for OPCON in conjunction with Operation COLORADO. On 17 August the battalion commenced preparation of the new battalion command post and new 3d 8" How Battery (SP) and 3d 155mm Gun Battery (SP) position. On 27 August, Battery "K" reported to 3d Battalion, 11th Marines for OPCON in conjunction with Operation JACKSON. On 28 August, this headquarters displaced the Battalion Command Post to Coordinates BT 441099. During August 1966, this battalion, including Battery "M" Forward, and 3d 8" How Battery (SP), fired 1139 missions as follows:

c. Intelligence

- (1) On the morning of 2 August, 3d8" Howitzer Battery patrol found an aiming arrow pointed toward the Battery Commanders tent and two
- (2) aiming arrows pointed towards 8" Gun positions.

(2) On the evening of 7 August, Company I, 3d Battalion, 7th Marines received several rounds of small arms sniper fire. Battery "M" and Company I returned small arms fire. Enemy broke contact.

(3) On the evening of 15 August, Headquarters, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines received four (4) rounds of small arms sniper fire. Sentries unable to observe movement after illumination of the area by hand flares.

(4) During the day on 23 August, Headquarters, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines (Forward) received three (3) rounds of small arms sniper fire from unknown location.

(5) On the evening of 24 August Headquarters, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines (Forward) received six (6) rounds of small arms sniper fire and three hand grenades. Outposts returned small arms fire and enemy dispersed.

(6) On the morning of 25 August, Headquarters, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines (Forward) patrol found 1 aiming arrow pointed towards outpost #3 and 1 aiming arrow pointed towards an 8" Gun position. Also found drag marks $1\frac{1}{2}$ " deep x 4" wide from possible enemy position to trail leading into village.

(7) During the day of 30 August, a working party at Headquarters, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines old CP area received approximately (30) rds. of small arms at 1030H. Headquarters patrol, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines fired upon (3) Vietnames who jumped up and ran. Two (2) Vietnames males were wounded and were evacuated to 1st Medical Battalion. The other Vietnamese male could not be found.

d. Training. No new concepts were introduced which required special Training.

e. Special Operations

Period 1-6 August

On 1 August Battery "M" fired preparation fires, totaling 57 rounds, in support of Heliborne Operation OI2H6 for Special Forces B-11.

On 5 August Battery "K" displaced two (2) M109 howitzers to Battery "M" (Forward) position, coordinates BS 60607210, azimuth of fire 5400. Battery "M" (Forward) displaced four (4) 155mm howitzers (towed) to Battery "K" position, coordinates BT 44440876, azimuth of fire 5600, to participate in Operation COLORADO. On 5 August 3d Platoon, 3d 8" Howitzer Battery (SP) displaced to coordinates BT 44290861, azimuth of fire 5400 and chopped OPCON to 2d Battalion, 11th Marines, for Operation COLORADO. On 6 August Battery "K" with four (4) 155mm howitzers (towed) chopped OPCON to 2d Battalion, 11th Marines, for Operation COLORADO.

Period 7-13 August

On 12 August 1st and 2d Platoons, 3d 8" Howitzer Battery (SP) located at coordinates BT 56670190 and 56670188 were relaid on azimuth 3900 in order to fire a TOT in support of 3d Battalion, 11th Marines. Upon completion of TOT, the platoons were relaid on their original azimuths of fire, 3300 and 2400 respectively.

Period 14-20 August

On 16 August 3d 8" Howitzer Battery (SP) deployed one (1) howitzer to the Operation COLORADO area to replace a howitzer on maintenance deadline.

On 17 August 2d Platoon, 3d 8" Howitzer Battery (SP) displaced to Coordinates BS 53999442 and laid on azimuth 4000. On 17 August the battalion commenced preparation of the new battalion command post and new 3d 8" How Battery (SP) and 3d 155mm Gun Battery (SP) position.

On 20 August 3d Platoon, 3d 8" Howitzer Battery (SP) returned to OPCON this headquarters and occupied position coordinates BT 44440875, azimuth of fire 5600. Battery "K" with four (4) 155mm howitzers (towed) returned OPCON this headquarters on 20 August, and occupied position, coordinates BT 44440876, azimuth of fire 5600.

Period 21-27 August

On 23 August 3d 8" Howitzer Battery displaced one (1) howitzer to coordinates BS 53999442 to replace howitzer on maintenance deadline. Azimuth of fire 4000. Battery "K" returned four (4) 155mm howitzers (towed) to Battery "M" Forward's position, coordinates BS 60607210. Battery "M" Forward returned two (2) M109 howitzers to Battery "K" position, coordinates BT 44440876.

On 24 August 3d Platoon, 3d 8" Howitzer Battery (SP) displaced to coordinates BT 43890972 and laid on azimuth 4800.

Headquarters Platoon, 3d 8" Howitzer Battery (SP) displaced to the new battery position at coordinates BT 438097 on 26 August. On 26 August 1st Platoon, 3d 8" Howitzer Battery (SP) displaced to coordinates BT 43910964 and laid on azimuth 4800. On 26 August Battery "K" chopped OPCON to 3d Battalion, 11th Marines for Operation JACKSON.

On 27 August 2d Platoon, 3d 8" Howitzer Battery (SP) relaid on azimuth 3200 for support of Operation JACKSON.

Period 28-31 August

On 28 August this headquarters displaced the Battalion Command Post to coordinates BT 441099.

On 29 August Battery "K" returned OPCON this headquarters and occupied position, coordinates BT 44440876 and laid on azimuth 5600.

On 30 August 1st Platoon, 3d 8" Howitzer Battery (SP) relaid on azimuth 4200 to support an observation post located at coordinates BT 328988.

g. Civic Action/Civil Affairs. During the month of August, the three hamlets assigned to 4th Battalion, 11th Marines, Phouc An, Trung An (1) and Trung An (2), were visited once each week by the MedCap Team. The main symptoms treated were: gastric distress, headache, upper respiratory infection, and various skin infections, particularly among the children.

Lieutenant Schmitt and SSGT Williams attended CA meeting at 7th Marines on Monday August the 22nd. Information was received that MedCap supplies are now available at 7th Marines. This Battalion's civic affairs responsibility for its three hamlets was terminated by Division G-5 because of the impending change in CP location.

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Tab 1 (S-1 Journal Entries) to Appendix B (Documentation) to 4th Battalion, 11th Marines Command Chronology of 1 - 31 August 1966.

- 011400HAug Msg rec fr AMRCROSS by BnAdj for Cpl WHIPPLE of Btry M. QUOTE: Unable to locate Ira H or H. WINSLOW from address given. The post office station states Box 2 not in this name. No one employed Southern Pacific Railroad here named WINSLOW. Field Director Vandenburg AFB advised Dr. DUNCAN saw wife Lillian 18 July for minor physical problem. Dr. DUNCAN states nothing unusual and no recommendation. Chapter will follow up if serviceman can furnish address or other clue. UNQUOTE.
- 031100HAug Informed Btry M, CO and 1stSgt to recommend that Cpl J. L. WHIPPLE, 2054730, USMC, initiate the proper documents ASAP requesting Humanitarian Transfer concerning family problems.
- 031200HAug Postal mobile Money Order vehicle serviced personnel of 3rd8"HowBtry, HqBtry, and Btry M this date.
- 031800HAug A helicopter requested a corpsman and officer to accompany them on a check of a body discovered on the beach of coordinates 580033. HM3 D. A. GRAYBILL, 3rd8"HowBtry and 1stLt C.I. ADAMS of HqBtry, 4/11 went with the helicopter. The body was found and determined to be a small Vietnamese male child, approximately 5 yrs old. The pilot of the helicopter refused to evacuate the body and returned 1stLt ADAMS and HM3 GRAYBILL to the 4/11 area. CWO CLOW, Bn S-5, immediately notified 11thMar S-5, who in turn called 1stMarDiv S-5. 11thMar S-5 called at 031950HAug informing CWO CLOW to pick up the body and take it to 1stMedBn. A four man team was dispatched at 031955HAug to pick up the body. At 032055HAug the detail returned stating the body could not be located after a thorough search. At this time, Maj COOK, DivAss't G-5 and Capt HOUSTON, 11thMar S-5 were notified of the negative results of the search. Major COOK stated that no report would be required.
- 040830HAug Bn Adj & MTO departed for Quang Ngai on Civil Affairs matters and morale matters.
- 051200HAug Bn Adj & MTO returned fr Quang Ngai by chopper.
- 051430HAug Cpl D. R. BEAUDIN and LCpl A. F. KLAMMER of 3rd8"HowBtry awarded Purple Heart Medal for injuries received on 210200Jun66.
- 051500HAug SSgt R. R. LAMOUR of 3rd8"HowBtry presented with Certificate of Appointment to SSgt by Bn CO.
- 051630HAug Certificate of Appointment for SSgt W. A. FALLS of Btry L forwarded via Btry L 1stSgt for delivery to FALLS.

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- 051640HAug FROST CALL rec fr Regt S-1 QUOTE: Sardines sold in III MAF exchanges believed to contain botulism. Exchanges removing fr sale. Purchasers return for refund. Fort Clyde select small sardines in soy bean oil packed in 4 ounce flat cans with wire wrapper in red, white, black and blue label. UNQUOTE. Msg passed on to all Btrys.
- 071400HAug Call rec fr Regt concerning CG, 1stMarDiv msg 030826Z which was never received by Regt nor 4/11. Msg regarding Request Mast with CMC. Word passed to all Btrys and results called into S-1, Regt.
- 100900HAug BnAdj CWO-2 CLOW evacuated to 1stMedBn for tests and further possible evacuation. Evacuated fr Bn area at 100800HAug66.
- 111000HAug Dr. SCHWEIZER transferred to HqBtry, 11thMar for duty. Dr. T. M. MORAN assigned as Battalion Surgeon as replacement for Dr. SCHWEIZER.
- 271300HAug BnAdj CWO-2 CLOW returned fr USS REPOSE for duty at 271100HAug66.
- 282000HAug Bn S-1 moved to new Bn CP area completed at 282000HAug66.
- 301030HAug Received information that two Vietnamese males were wounded in 4/11 rear area, coordinates BT 566022. CWO CLOW dispatched to investigate the incident. Backlash report will be submitted.

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Tab 2 (S-2 Journal entries) to Appendix B (Documentation) to 4th Battalion, 11th Marines Command Chronology of 1-31 August 1966

- 020855H 3d 8" Battery reported several S/A rounds being fired when aircraft were passing over their position. Patrol at first light found evidence of personnel being in area, also found one (1) stake pointing to Battery Commander's tent and two (2) stakes pointing to 8" gun positions.
- 052045H I/3/7 reported to Battery "M" 90-100 Hard Core VC within 800 meters of Battery position. Information received from RF and FF forces.
- 071810H Battery "M" reported I/3/7 received several rounds S/A fire. Battery "M" and I/3/7 return 50-60 rounds S/A and A/W fire.
- 092240H Headquarters, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines outpost reported seeing 1 VCS between inner and outer perimeter of wire. Threw two (2) M-26 grenades. Results unknown.
- 152115H Headquarters, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines outpost reported as three (3) aircraft took off they heard S/A fire; 3 rounds, 8 rounds, and 4 rounds. Outpost received 4 rounds sniper fire. Outpost fired flares. Patrol dispatched at first light with negative results.
- 191130H Headquarters, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines (Forward). Bomb racks left at new location overnight had been booby trapped. SSgt McClurg received superficial lacerations when he attempted to move the bomb racks. A small charge went off and some 7.62 ammo and bolts were found in the hole afterwards.
- 232000H Headquarters, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines (Forward) received 2 rounds S/A fire from coordinates 437102 at 231100H and 3 rounds S/A from same coordinates at 231645H.
- 242350H Headquarters, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines (Forward) received 6 rounds S/A fire and 3 hand grenades. Patrol at light found 2 aiming arrows, one pointed toward outpost #3 and one toward 8" gun. Also found drag marks $1\frac{1}{2}$ " deep, 4" wide through sand onto trail leading into village.
- 301030H Working party policing up rear CP area of 4th Battalion, 11th Marines received harassing small arms fire of approximately 30 rounds at 301030H. Lt ADAMS in charge of working party dispatched 2 groups of men to locate the enemy. 2 wounded Viet males and another Viet male jumped up and ran from approximately same position S/A fire came from. Marines opened fire with approximately 30 rounds. 2 Viet males were seriously wounded and evacuated to 1st Medical Battalion. The other Viet male could not be found.

- 010730 Btry "M" commenced Prep Fire, in support of Heliborne Operation OL 2H6 for special Forces B-11.
- 010745 Btry "M" completed Prep Fires and sent Sit Rep.
- 020855 Spot Report to 11th Marines: Aircraft taking off fired on w/small arms north of 8" HQ position. 8" Btry sent patrol out to investigate, with negative results.
- 041825 To Btry "M" Forward: Displace all weapons, equipment and personnel to Btry "K" position tomorrow. Displacement to commence upon arrival M109 from Btry "K". Btry CO to remain in position Quang Ngai. FO to remain on Nui Tron.
- 051055 From 11th Marines: Btry at Quang Ngai will remain Btry "M" Forward. Towed Howitzer coming north designated Btry "K".
- 052045 Received Spot Report from Btry "M" which was reported to Btry "M" by India 3/7: information confirming 80-100 Hard Core VC approximately 800 meters to left front of position. 1 60mm mortar, possible Chi-Com Submachine guns. VN interpreters with friendly patrols reported information. (Negative Incidents)
- 071810 Spot Report from Btry "M": CO "I", 3d Battalion, 7th Marines received small arms fire. India and Btry "M"'s OP's returned S/A and A/W fire. Btry "M" (50-60 rounds). India sending out patrols to search area.
- 072330 Received information from 3d Battalion, 11th Marines that Conc UZ 048Z sunk 1 boat and possible 1 KIA. 2 possible WIA while Btry "M" illuminated.
- 080023 Received from 11th Marines (Relayed from 2d Battalion, 11th Marines) MSR possibly mined between 5th Marines CP and AnTan. Will be cleared at first light. Clearing should take 1½ hr.
- 110930 From Division via 11th Marines: KAC-JL will not be used until possible compromise has been investigated. Will notify.
- 111445 From 11th Marines: KAC-JL has not been compromised. Continue to use.
- 112015 Received from 11th Marines: ARVN are putting additional security with Btry "M" Forward.
- 160230 KAC sheet 792 compromised. Used spare KAC sheet 771 for the date of the 16th.
- 161340 Received from 11th Marines: 4th Battalion, 11th Marines will receive only 1 Met Msg each day in the evening.

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- 170130 Btry "M" heard noises at coordinates 540939 which sounded like mortars. 107mm Molar Battery in position fired a mission. Noises stopped.
- 180800 11th Marines requested FO to be at 11th Marines position by 1300 for assignment with ARVN.
- 180900 Request from 11th Marines for FO was cancelled.
- 181030 Received from 11th Marines: KAC-JL has been compromised. Use 138.
- 181440 Notified Btry "M" Forward CO that a 10 man security party will be removed- 5 on 19th, 5 on 20th. Btry security will be augmented by light section of tanks within next 2 or 3 days.
- 190120 KAC series JL is now valid. Can be used for rest of month. The papers compromised were Comm authentication sheets. Tomorrow, the Battalion will draw from 11th Marines S & C to reissue new sheets to Btrys.
- 191215 From 4th Battalion, 11th Marines Forward CP: 1 man was injured by a booby trap exploding in new CP location. Man returned to 4th Battalion Rear CP.
- 201300 Battery "K" returned OPCON this battalion.
- 211845 Received Msg from 1st Recon Battalion: Tomorrow at approximately 1000, Recon OP will be established in vicinity of AN HOA. Told to contact Btry "M" on M341.
- 221030 3d Battalion, 11th Marines notified us that we had 9 confirmed KIA's and 19 confirmed WIA's on UZ 069. Confirmed by ARVN.
- 232205 Monitored from 1st Recon Battalion to Btry "M" 3. Text of Msg to be sent to Recon CO: No question in my mind that we have 1 and possibly 2 NVA companies in this area. We have the name of one of the company CO's. He has been operating in this area for approximately 15 days according to informants. Informants tell of caves at coordinates 464844. We believe the VC will take refuge there.
- 260725 From 11th Marines: Request 4th Battalion, 11th Marines provide 1 FO Team of one Officer, 1 radio operator to report to Maj RYAN, 7th Marines FSCC by 1300 26 Aug. Expect to stay 5 days in field for Operation JACKSON.
- 261200 FO Team sent to 7th Marines FSCC.
- 261645 Battery "K" chopped OPCON to 3d Battalion, 11th Marines for Operation JACKSON.
- 291800 Battery "K" returned to OPCON this Battalion and occupied position, coordinates 44270866, azimuth of fire 5600.
