PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of December 1970, Marine Wing Headquarters Group One and its subordinate units provided administrative and logistical support for the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing Headquarters at Danang Air Base, Republic of Vietnam and provided command administrative communications for the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing Headquarters and air control communications for the Tactical Air Direction Center. Tango Sector Alpha was in Defense Condition III every night during the month of December 1970.

PART III

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- Personnel. The Group continues to be over the approved T/O, but well below the provisional T/O. Because of the size of the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing, the accompanying workload in the Wing Headquarters requires the additional Wing Staff personnel. The lack of the recommended number of personnel is not considered to have deleterious effect on the ability of this Group to carry out assigned missions and tasks.
- Administration. Routine administrative work was performed during December 1970.
- Awards. The following awards were presented during the month of December 1970:

- a. Two Marine Officers were awarded the Meritorious Service Medal
- b. Eight Marine Officers were awarded the Strike/Flight Air Medal
- c. Two Marine Enlisted were awarded the Strike/Flight Air Medal
- d. One Marine Officer was awarded the Navy Commendation Medal

4. Casualties. There was one Marine MedEvaced during the month of December 1970. There were no hostile or non-hostile casualties.

5. Morale and Welfare Programs. Although the officers and men of Marine Wing Headquarters Group One were unable to be with their families and loved ones during the Christmas Holidays, the Christmas Spirit still prevailed on the Marine Wing Headquarters Group One Compound. The Commanding General, Major General A. J. ARMSTRONG, USMC, led a Christmas Tree Lighting Ceremony on 17 December 1970. On 24 December 1970, the Group and Wing Special Services offered entertaining floor shows at all the clubs on the compound. Also, on 24 and 25 December 1970, special Christmas Services were conducted at the Wing Chapel. The Group and Wing Special Services once again supplied floor shows for all the clubs on New Year's Eve. The China Beach, Freedom Hill, and Golden Gate USO's supplemented the aforementioned activities. On 24 December 1970, the Bob Hope Show was presented at the Freedom Hill Recreation Center. Commensurate with security and mission requirements, as many personnel as possible were allowed to attend this performance. Throughout the month of December Wing Special Services provided the Headquarters Group Compound with many off-duty activities including handball, volleyball, tennis, horseshoes, basketball, football, and weightlifting. During the month of December, General Administrative (Health and Comfort) Searches were conducted on two occasions, resulting in some items of contraband being confiscated. Although liberty remains secured in the Danang area, cultural tours sponsored by the Chaplain and Civic Affairs provided informative, interesting substitutes. The China Beach recreation center continued operations for the enjoyment and relaxation of all hands. Also, R&R seat allocations and other RON flights enabled personnel to relax out-of-country for several days.

6. Intelligence and Counter Intelligence. The Intelligence Section performed routine administrative support during the month of December 1970. There were 7 clearances and 21 accesses processed to Group personnel. The Intelligence Section processed 8 war trophies during the month of December. The Intelligence Section also held Intelligence Briefs for the Command Indoctrination Presentations and obtained daily G-2 briefings on significant events in the 1st Military Region.

7. Industrial Relations. Details of the MWHG-1 Industrial Relations Program are outlined in the Industrial Relations Command Chronology.

8. Ground Defense. There were no significant events concerning the Ground Defense Units throughout the month of December 1970, but routine training was conducted to keep the units in a constant state of readiness.

9. Training. General Military Subjects Training for all enlisted Marines is held at the Group level each Wednesday morning and Thursday afternoon. A total of 386 personnel attended General Military Subjects Training during the month of December 1970. A total of 30 Officers and enlisted attended the Command Indoctrination Presentation and FAM Firing. Drug Abuse Indoctrination was attended by 18 Officers and enlisted during the month of December 1970. On 24 December 1970, this Command provided one platoon, consisting of one officer from Group S-1 and thirty-two enlisted men from the Tango Security Section, to participate in the III Marine Amphibious Force Assumption of Command Ceremony conducted at the Force Logistics Command Parade Field, Camp Books, Republic of Vietnam.

10. Maintenance. During the month of December 1970, 119 Work Orders were received by the Utilities Section of which 108 were completed with 11 left pending. The Utilities Section also received 210 Trouble Calls of which all were completed, except for five, which were turned over to Public Works. In addition, the Utilities Section constructed a new sentry booth between M4HG-1 and MAG-11 and assisted the Army in pumping the water out of the old WERS-17 area.

11. Logistics. The Logistics Section carried out routine administrative support for the Group.

12. Supply. The Supply Section conducted normal supply operations in support of the Group and the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing. The Marine Corps Property Section processed 769 requisitions and the Navy Property processed 1,533 requisitions with a net effectiveness of 89% and 97.2% respectively for the month of December 1970.

13. Communications. See Part III, Paragraph 5 of Marine Wing Communications Squadron One Command Chronology.

14. Religious Services. See Marine Wing Headquarters Group One Chaplain's Command Chronology.

15. Typhoon and Disaster Control. There were no Typhoon/Storm Conditions set in the Danang Area throughout the month of December 1970.
