CONFIDENTIALPART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY1. Operations

a. Direct Air Support Center (DASC) operations for the month of December showed an increase over the previous month. Total missions controlled by the DASC were 4098 of which 2126 were fixed wing and 1972 were helicopter missions with 414 of the helicopter missions being Medical Evacuations. MASS-2 detachments supported the following operations: Detachment 1 - operations Head Shed, Kentucky, Landcaster, Neosho, Scotland, Napoleon, Fortress Ridge, Osceola, and Newton/Kentucky 5; Detachment 2 - operations Kentucky, Landcaster, Neosho, Scotland, Napoleon, Badger Tooth and Highrise. In addition Detachment 2 supported seven (7) ARVN operations: Lam Son 157, 158, 168, 169, 170, Hnong Dien and Thoung Dien.

b. Air Support Radar Teams (ASRT) conducted 2000 missions, controlled 2436 aircraft, delivering 10,562,150 pounds of bombs on 2272 targets. Two new squadron records were established for aggregate ASRT performance in one month: 2000 missions (old record 1655) and aircraft controlled 2436 (old record 2287). Also, three new individual monthly performance ASRT records were established: ASRT "A" - 1085 missions (old record 785), aircraft controlled 1392 (old record 1014) and dropped 6,288,040 pounds of bombs (old record 5,308,000).

2. Civic Action. During the month of December the squadron Med Cap program was halted awaiting assignment of a new village.

3. Supply. Ten (10) supply personnel completed group MCI course 30.15b, Field Warehousing Procedures. Two (2) warehousemen, were assigned to the squadron detachments.

4. Motor Transport. Two (2) generator mechanics and one (1) motor vehicle driver, were assigned to squadron detachments during the month. Three (3) vehicles were painted and the grease rack was rebuilt.

5. Utilities. The Utilities Section continued its program of camp repair and improvement.
