CONFIDENTIALPART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY1. Operations

a. Direct Air Support Centers (DASC) operations for the month of February showed a decrease from the previous month. The DASC controlled 3119 missions of which 1033 were fixed wing and 1664 helicopter missions with 422 of the helicopter missions being Medical Evacuations. Included in these figures are 77 helicopter sorties controlled in support of the 26th Marines at Khe Sahn.

b. Operations supported by MASS-2 were as follows: Detachment 1 - operations Kentucky, Fortress Attack, Napoleon, Saline, Lancaster II, Osceola II, Badger Catch, and Scotland; Detachment 2 - operations Hue City and Houston.

c. Air Support Radar Teams (ASRT) conducted 2261 missions, controlled 2335 aircraft, delivering 13,448,020 pounds of bombs on 2389 targets. 53 of these missions were in support of the 26th Marines at Khe Sahn. Three new squadron records were established for aggregate ASRT performance in one month; 2261 missions (old record 2009), aircraft controlled 3335 (old record 2760) and dropped 6724.010 tons of bombs (old record 6006.693). Also, two new individual monthly performance ASRT records were established: ASRT "A" - 789 missions (old record 785) and aircraft controlled 1278 (old record 1085).

2. Supply

a. Supply processed a total of 266 requisitions. Of those processed, 216 were handled by direct issues from stock while the remaining were placed on requisition from outside sources.

b. A supply contact team visited Detachment - 2 at Phu Bai to examine the supply situation there and conduct a complete inventory of detachment equipment.

3. Motor Transport. During the past month there were four (4) quarterly and three (3) annual PM's performed on motor vehicles. Total mileage was 12,491 miles. Total cargo hauled was 96½ short tons and the total passengers carried was 6,302.

4. Utilities. The utilities section continued its program of general repair and improvement in the squadron area.

5. Ground Defense. Since initiation of the "TET" offensive by insurgent (Viet Cong) and North Vietnamese forces, ground defense has been given increasing emphasis at the DaNang Headquarters of this squadron. During the month of February the average man day commitment to ground defense at DaNang increased by 125 percent, from eight (8) to eighteen (18), with up to a Thirty-two (32) man day commitment on certain days.
