1. The mission of air defense, air control, and participation in the exchange of digital data via Link II with NTDS/ATDS was continued.
2. The successful completion of the Southeast Asia Interface Evaluation during the month of July 1969 has resulted in the continuous exchange of digital data between the 7th Air Force and CTF 77 utilizing the AN/TYQ-3 to provide compatibility between the BUIC II and NTDS systems.
