2. General Summary. MAG-16 supported operations in all TAOR's. The Group also supported U.S. Army, U.S. Navy, ROK Marine Corps and ARVN units throughout I Corps.

1 December - Operations in the Chu Lai area were normal. In the Danang TAOR one HMM-363 UH-34D was hit by enemy fire at coord. AT 937565, no injuries. Flight operations were greatly hampered by inclement weather.

2 December - Operations in the Chu Lai area and Danang TAOR were greatly hampered by inclement weather.

3 December - Operations in the Chu Lai area were normal. In the Danang TAOR the following aircraft were hit by enemy fire: Two HHM-265 CH-46A aircraft; one at coord. AT 981590, no injuries; one at coord. AT 978562, no injuries.

4 December - In the Chu Lai area two HHM-363 UH-34D aircraft were hit by enemy fire; one at coord. BS 679859, no injuries; one at coord. BT 1846, no injuries. The VMO-2 APD aircraft flew in support of the 1st MAR DIV.

5 December - Operations in the Chu Lai area were normal. In the Danang TAOR two VMO-2 UH-1E aircraft crashed at coord. AT 833587 while IFR resulting in strike damage to both aircraft. There were four fatalities in the lead aircraft. There were two major injuries and two minor injuries in the second aircraft. Responsibility for the coordination and operation of An Hoa Airfield assumed this date; 1stLt George E. IENHART 090052/7002 USMC assigned as resident Officer in Charge.

6 December - Operations in the Chu Lai area and Danang TAOR were normal. In the Dong Ha area one HHM-463 CH-53A dropped an external load which struck a civilian dwelling resulting in one Vietnamese fatality and one Vietnamese civilian injured.

7 December - Operations in the Chu Lai area and Danang TAOR were normal.

8 December - Operations in the Chu Lai area were normal. In the Danang TAOR one HHM-265 CH-46A was hit by enemy fire at coord. BT 040650, no injuries.

9 December - In the Chu Lai area one HHM-265 CH-46A was hit by enemy fire at coord. BS 775832, no injuries. In the Danang TAOR one H&MS-16 O-1G was hit by enemy fire at coord. BT 185568, no injuries.

10 December - Operations in the Chu Lai area were normal. In the Danang TAOR one HHM-363 UH-34D crashed at coord. AT 886863 resulting in several injuries to ground personnel in the LZ. Two HHM-463 CH-53A aircraft were hit by enemy fire: one at coord. AT 8850, no injuries; one at coord. YD 563240, no injuries.

11 December - Operations in the Chu Lai area and Danang TAOR were normal.

AT 840510, no injuries; one at coord. AT 813500, no injuries; one at coord. AT 8755, one minor injury. Flight operations continued in support of Operation Citrus.

4. Civic Action

a. Medical. MAG-16 doctors and corpsmen held 28 sick calls treating a total of 1,619 patients. A total of 20 classes in first aid and sanitation were held for 9 Vietnamese nationals. MAG-16 dental personnel treated a total of 83 patients.

b. Education. MAG-16 held 1 hour of English instruction for 188 students.

c. Projects. The MAG-16 Scholarship Fund continues to support 9 orphan boys through Junior High School and High School. Continuing assistance was given to the Hoa-Long dispensary including the drilling of a well.

d. Giveaway. MAG-16 donated construction materials to the W.E.C. Leprosarium resulting in the construction of five 16 X 32 foot huts. MAG-16 donated 75 pounds of food to the W.E.C. Leprosarium, 11 well rings to Hoi-Long, 16 gallons of paint and fourteen 4 X 8 foot sheets of plywood to the Hoa-Long dispensary. A Christmas party was held for the W.E.C. orphanage during which 25 pounds of food, 100 pounds of clothing, 16 cases of soda and 25 gallons of ice cream were given away.

e. Government. Several conferences were held between the MAG-16 Civic Action Officer and the village chief of Hoa-Long. The attitude of the people continued to be good throughout the month of December.

f. Summary. MAG-16 continued as area coordinator for Civic Action programs and projects. Within this area the following units are represented:

8. Ground Defense. During the month of December at Marble Mountain Air Facility, additional bunkers were built and defense positions were constantly worked on and improved. Perimeter observation towers are in the process of being installed. There was no enemy contact at MMAF.

9. Motor Transport. 12. Base Operations. During the month of December, 1,000 feet of runway was paved with asphalt. Runway shoulders were re-worked and the last 1,000 feet of runway is being prepared for asphalt paving during the month of January.

13. Weather Service. The weather section supported all MAG-16 flight operations in the An Hoa and MMAF areas.

14. Food Services. There were approximately 188,241 meals served at Marble Mountain Air Facility messhall during the month of December. Bakery products utilized approximately 24,000 pounds of flour.

15. Base Development/Utilities.

a. Water Point. The water point personnel processed 1,648,410 gallons of water during the month, 117,500 gallons which were non-potable.

b. Paint Shop. The paint shop personnel completed eighteen projects. A total of one hundred ten signs were painted.

c. Electric Shop. Electric shop personnel completed one hundred fifty work orders.

d. Plumbing Shop. Plumbing shop personnel completed twenty-nine work orders.

e. Refrigeration Shop. Refrigeration shop personnel completed twenty-four work orders.

f. Carpenter Shop. Carpenter shop personnel completed eighty-four work orders.

g. Generator Shop. Generator shop personnel performed all first and second echelon maintenance with a minimum of breakdown.

h. Laundry. During the month, the Base Laundry processed 31,834 pounds of clothing and collected organizational gear to turn over to the civilian laundry service. The Base Laundry continued its individual bundle service to all ranks. Two new laundry units were received this month.

16. Exchange. During the month, exchange sales were \$65,336.95. Sales for James Lee Tailor were \$2,709.45. Sales for Saehan Photo Service were \$2,492.95. Sales for Phung's Laundry were \$4,412.55. Sales for the barber shop were \$735.60.

17. Ordnance. During the month of December the Ordnance section issued 319,792 rounds of small ammunition, 4,393 rounds of 2.75 white phosphorus and high explosives and 2,632 pounds of assorted smoke and chemical agents. In addition, 71,280 rounds of 5.56MM ammunition was issued for FAM firing the M-16 rifle within this command.

19. Communications.

a. Personnel losses exceeded personnel gains during the month. At present there is a critical shortage of message center personnel. As an interim measure, radio operators are being cross-trained as message center personnel.

b. The Wire section installed new cable to replace old, several-times spliced cable, which will greatly improve telephone service in the Supply, Base Operations and Squadron areas.

c. Radio communications were good during the month. A radio net was established between MMAF and An Hoa to provide weather information and a rapid means of communications.

d. Message traffic was reduced by 2,480. Total volume of messages processed was 7,014 with 1,758 originated by MAG-16. 53 hours of down time was experienced due to break down of equipment and lack of spare parts.

e. The following transactions were effected by the repair section:

- (1) 169 items of equipment processed.
- (2) 121 items of equipment returned to users.
- (3) 9 items of equipment evacuated to higher echelons of maintenance.
- (4) 9 items of equipment returned from higher echelons of maintenance.
- (5) 59 requisitions processed by supply section.




