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PART TWO

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the month of August this unit continued to provide support for the 1st MAW as well as organic support of MWSG-17. The Motor Transport Section operated the assigned prime movers a total of 70,073 miles. A total of 3,678 tons of general cargo was transported during the month. There were a total of 1,284 taxi runs carrying 1682 passengers for a total mileage of 7,627 miles.

The 4th Echelon Repair Facility received 572 items for repair and completed 605 of which 90 were beyond economical repair. At the close of the period there were 214 open job orders on hand. Of these 8.40% were in the process of completion, 16.22% awaiting man power and 75.20% awaiting parts.

The TAFDS Section continued the operation of two sites, Khe Sahn and the Danang Marine Air Freight Terminal. The Khe Sahn system issued 61,535 gallons of JP-4 and 29,710 gallons of Av/Gas. The system at the Marine Air Freight Terminal issued 1,055,564 gallons of JP-4 and 326,673 gallons of Av/Gas. Total fuel dispensed was 1,473,482 gallons.

The Engineering Equipment Section continued to provide maximum support within its capability. Electric power was furnished to the Air Terminal area, VMGR 152 area, the TAFDS site and the MWSG-17 Contonment area. The generators now assigned operated a total of 3,739 hours. The heavy equipment assigned operated a total of 1,158 hours.

This squadron maintained a C1 status on personnel during the reporting period. There were a total of 5 personnel joined on the rolls of this command during the month of August. There were a total of 22 personnel who went on R&R and 3 personnel who went on special leave.
