PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the period 1 January 1972 to 30 June 1972, Headquarters and Maintenance Squadron 36 conducted operations in support of the 3rd Marine Division both on Okinawa and Japan, Camp S. D. BUTLER, 1st Marine Aircraft Wing and Marine Aircraft Group 36. Missions flown consisted of helicopter logistic and administrative support.

Headquarters and Maintenance Squadron 36 continues to support the tactical squadrons of this air group with a high level of IMA Maintenance. March and April were spent assisting HMM-164 in preparation for embarking aboard the USS OKINAWA.

During this period Headquarters and Maintenance Squadron 36 hosted two officers of the Republic of Korea Marine Corps. The officers were briefed on the IMA Maintenance capabilities of the squadron and were given a tour of the shops and spaces in H&MS-36.

Headquarters and Maintenance Squadron 36 hosted MajGen OWENS during a Commanding General's Inspection. VIP support was flown for MajGen FAGEN and BGen MILLER.

During this period Headquarters and Maintenance Squadron 36 conducted a change of command, LtCol E. J. MURPHY relieving LtCol D. A. SPURLOCK on 17 March 1972.

Headquarters and Maintenance Squadron 36, Sub-Unit One was deactivated on 31 March 1972 with the forming of HMA-369.

On 8 Jun 1972 Detachment Delta operationally deployed as part of Task Force Delta.
