PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the period January 1975 to June 1975, H&MS 36 provided intermediate level maintenance support to 7 aircraft squadrons flying 6 different types of aircraft. Also, personnel, maintenance, and supply support were involved in Operations "Eagle Pull" and "Frequent Wind". The squadron totalled 91.2 hours (23.5 hours for CH46D and 67.7 hours for CH53D) in returning aircraft to a full systems capable status and transferring them to the appropriate squadrons. All flight time was directed towards post maintenance inspection flights.

10 January 1975, Major Larry M. COLLINS became the Squadron Commander replacing Major Denis A. McKINNON. The Maintenance Department devoted the majority of their efforts, that month, in support of the deployment of HMH 462. Additionally, 32 support personnel were provided to the USS OKINAWA.

In February, H&MS 36 supported a blood drive for an Okinawan girl requiring open heart surgery. Maintenance sections were involved in support of CH46/UH1E detachment in Korea. Also, in February 1975, the first CH46D (154042) was transferred to HMM 164 after considerable maintenance and post maintenance inspection flights. The first of the CH53D's began inspection flights.

March was a month of considerable flight time (37.6 hours) and the transferring of the second CH46D (153363) to HMM 164. High school registration reached a high of 29 Marines with 3 receiving diplomas from the previous term.

Contingency planning for evacuation operations in Southeast Asia saw the embarkation of large amounts of men and material in April. The Logistics Department staged 24,161 pounds of mount-out gear. Maj. CLAPP, Capt. RITCHIE, and Capt. SCHOENER were sent TAD as augment pilots and staff and ultimately participated in Operations "Eagle Pull" and "Frequent Wind". Through vigorous maintenance efforts a CH46D (153370) and two CH53D's (156674, 157138) were transferred. An additional 35 IMA personnel were provided to the USS HANCOCK. The Squadron human relations efforts experienced a static display/field trip for Mercey Elementary and a track and field meet for the American Council for Exceptional Children.

(C) DURING THIS SIX MONTH PERIOD, SUB UNIT TWO FLEW 196,6 RS, 559 SORTIES, COMPLETED 201 TASKS, CARRIED 1881 PAX, AND MOVED 28,960 LBS OF CARGO IN DIRECT SUPPORT OF CAMP FUJI AND III MAF ATTACHED TRAINING UNITS (1/9, 3RD RECON AND 3/9). TWENTY MEDEVAC MISSIONS WERE COMPLETED, PRIMARILY IN SUPPORT OF CAMP FUJI, A TOTAL OF 49,4 HRS OF VIP FLYING WERE COMPLETED.

SUB UNIT TWO DEPLOYED THREE AIRCRAFT IN SUPPORT OF OPERATIONS EAGLE: PULL AND FREQUENT WIND DURING THE MONTHS OF APRIL AND MAY WHILE ATTACHED TO PROV MAG 39, NUMEROUS LOCAL ADMINISTRATIVE FLIGHTS WERE COMPLETED IN CONJUNCTION WITH LOCAL TRAINING, SUB UNIT TWO PILOTS ALSO FLEW 17 FLIGHTS AND 15,9 FLT HRS IN SUPPORT OF COMFAIRWESTPAC, FAWPRA.
