## PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

(C) With a "Cease Fire" for Southeast Asia imminent as the month of November began, the "Silver Eagles" entire combat team demonstrated its professional attitude as a Marine Corps unit and personal pride in their squadron, by having its finest operational month since returning to combat.

(U) On 12 November 1972, VMFA-115 received a message from Major General L. E. BROWN Jr., Commanding General, 1st Marine Aircraft Wing, for showing a sharp improvement in aircraft availability and maintaining complete weapons systems capability.

(C) VMFA-115 flew 650.3 combat hours and delivered 1092 tons of ordnance while flying Close Air Support and Direct Air Support missions in support of the South Vietnamese forces of Military Regions I and II. Combat missions were also flown in the "Steel Tiger" and "Barrel Roll" areas of Laos in support of friendly government forces.

(C) The Northeast monsoons became a significant factor in November. With typical monsoon clouds and rain in most of the target areas of South Vietnam, the "Silver Eagles" teamed with Air Force and Navy tactical aircraft to make several LORAN, TACAN, and radar bomb drops.

(U) Even with the continued effort to meet the demands of the war, the men of VMFA-115 were able to celebrate the Marine Corps 197th Birthday in fine fashion, with a Birthday Ceremony on the flight line, excellent food, and an evening celebration with entertainment.
