



PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Despite a week long period of tropical monsoon conditions, VMFA-314 flew 617.3 hours and 546 combat sorties. There were 31 non-combat sorties and 24 hours flown for ferry and maintenance check purposes. Aircrew members averaged 32 combat sorties.

Operations supported during the month included Taylor Common, Nevada Eagle, Bold Mariner, Dawson River, Russell Beach, Scotland II, Kentucky, Linn River, Task Forces Yankee and Alpha. Elements of the U. S. Navy, U. S. Army, U. S. Air Force, Republic of Korea and ARVN Forces were supported.

Bomb damage assessment reported by airborne and ground FAC's included 97 structures destroyed, 23 structures damaged, 3 37mm AA positions silenced, 54 bunkers destroyed, 9 bunkers damaged, 2 50 Cal. positions destroyed, 3 NVA KBA, five road cuts, 300 meters of trenchline and 200 meters of trail destroyed, 36 secondary fires and 3 secondary explosions, 13 fighting holes destroyed, 3 trucks destroyed and one cave destroyed.

BARCAES were flown on 2 January and 26-31 January in support of the 7th Fleet totaling 35 sorties and 84.6 hours.

On 12 January 1969, the Commanding Officer of VMFA-314 received the Fiscal Year 1968 CMO Aviation Safety Award from the Commandant of the Marine Corps during a formal squadron formation. During the same formation CMC also presented 1st Air Medals to Capt. J. E. SHARKEY, Capt. B. J. FLOYD, 1stLt. M. C. STILL and 1stLt. W. H. HOLZ.

The Air-to-Ground Hot Pad from 7-14 January flew 62 sorties and 60.6 hours in support of I Corps ground forces.

61.5 hours and 68 sorties were flown from the Air-to-Ground Hot Pad from 28-31 January.

On 24 January Capt. B. J. FLOYD and 1stLt. S. L. DUBA flew the 8000th combat sortie on VMFA-314's present deployment and four days later Capt. S. R. McCOMB and 1stLt. T. R. JOHNSON flew the 9000th combat hour.
