PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

The "Black Knights" once again surged forward during the month of August leading the Group in all categories of sorties flown, hours flown, and tons of ordnance expended. This effort was made possible through the outstanding performance and team spirit exhibited by all hands.

A total of 641 sorties were flown of which 620 were combat sorties. Ordnance totaling 1,394.3 tons were expended on enemy targets resulting in 139 bunkers destroyed and 13 damaged, 1,340 meters of treeline, 29 huts destroyed, 120 structures destroyed and 14 damaged, two storage areas destroyed, 1,150 meters of trenches and 83 meters of trails destroyed and 18 tunnel exits destroyed. In addition there were 32 secondary explosions, 71 secondary fires, and 3 50 caliber machine gun/mortar positions destroyed. Enemy KBM for the month totaled 41.

During the month of August, VMFA-314 supported the following Marine Operations; Pipestone Canyon, Durham Peak, Idaho Canyon, Irquorsis Grove, Arlington Canyon, Cumberland Thunder, Nantucket Beach, and Georgia Tar. In support of the Americal Divison the squadron supported Geneva Park, Iron Mountain, Frederick Hill, and Russell Beach. In support of the 101st Airborn the squadron supported Richland Square, Lamer Plain, Kentucky Jumper, and Montgomery Rendezvous. VMFA-314 also supported the ROK Marines in operations Victory Dragon II & III.
