PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

The "Black Knights" continued the Crusade during the month of October, once again leading Marine Aircraft Group 13 in all categories including total sorties flown, total combat sorties flown and tons of ordnance expended. Again, this accomplishment was made possible through the esprit de corps exhibited by all Black Knights.

Flying time for the month was again reduced from the the level of previous months, primarily due to the reduction in enemy activity. A total of 449 sorties were flown of which 404 were combat missions. A total of 788.8 tons of ordnance was accurately delivered on target resulting in the BDA shown in Part III. The most significant item of this is the KBMA for the month, (42) which is the highest since June of this year.

The Black Knights continued their support of Marines in operation Pipestone Canyon. In addition, we also supported the Army's Americal and 101st Airborne Divisions as well as ARVN and ROK forces in operations Frederick Hill, Geneva Park, Iron Mountain, Republic Square, and Victory Dragon XV.

In response to the tasks laid down by the 7th Air Force and 7th Fleet, the Squadron flew 42 sorties and 99.0 hours on MIGCAP and BARCAP missions. Of these, approximately 75% were flown at night.

The Squadron celebrated the completion of 600 combat missions by 1/LT R. C. KINDFATER, which is a new record for combat missions flown during a single thirteen month tour. In addition, the following officers completed the below indicated number of missions during their current tour:
