1 June: Six missions flown in support of recon operations, 68 sorties in support of "MAMELUKE THRUST", 4 sorties in support of Operation "HOUSTON".

Sorties/Tasks: 124/51

2 June: Two missions flown in support of recon operations, 38 sorties in support of "MAMELUKE THRUST", 25 sorties in support of Operation "HOUSTON", and 12 sorties while augmenting VMO-6. Sorties/Tasks: 95/46

3 June: Two missions flown in support of recon operations, 10 sorties in support of Operation "HOUSTON", 34 sorties in support of Task Force X-RAY, and 16 missions in support of "MAMELUKE THRUST". Sorties/Tasks: 81/34

4 June: Six missions flown in support of recon operations, 20 sorties in support of "SCOTLAND II", and 6 sorties in support of Operation "HOUSTON". 5 suspected VC were spotted and 26 2.75 rockets and 4,000 7.62 rounds were expended in the area with unknown results. Sorties/Tasks: 94/37

5 June: Five missions were flown in support of recon operations, 10 sorties in support of Operation "HOUSTON", and 36 sorties in support of Operations "LANCASTER" and "SCOTLAND II". Sorties/Tasks: 54/30

PART III

1. PERSONNEL:

a. Promotions - 1 to Lance Corporal, 2 to Corporal, 1 to Sergeant, and 1 enlisted man received a Meritorious Combat Promotion to Sergeant.
