PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Marine Heavy Helicopter Squadron 462 logged 901.3 hours during the month of August 1969. Once again the heaviest commitment was in the Northern I Corps area. Operations Georgia Tar and Idaho Canyon demanded the majority of the 4,038 sorties, and 2,394 tasks were completed in their support. The squadron also had light commitments in the Southern I Corps area, where it flew 541 sorties to complete 365 tasks in support of Operation Durham Peak.

During August, HMH-462's civic action program included two visits to the local orphanages in the Hue-Phu Bai area. On August 23, a visit was made to the Kim Loung orphanage in Hue. This was to enable the new civic action officer 1/LT FAGERSTROM to meet with the Sisters at the orphanage and to see what problems they had on hand. On August 30, several squadron personnel visited the Protestant orphanage in Phu Loung. Several items of clothing, canned juices and salt were delivered. Also, a load of scrap wood to be used for the benches in the school, was delivered.

On the 8th of August the Commandant of the Marine Corps, General Leonard F. CHAPMAN, accompanied by Lieutenant General NICKERSON, CG III MAF, and Major General THRASH, CG 1st MAW, visited MAG-36. HMH-462 was privileged to share in the Commandant's visit with a static display of a CH-53A. Lieutenant Colonel WOOD, CO HMH-462 gave the Commandant a recapitulation of the CH-53A's tasks and problems in Vietnam and introduced him to a representative from each maintenance shop required to keep the CH-53A flying. The representative answered the Commandant's questions concerning their phase of work, within the complex of HMH-462, and all were pleased to receive General CHAPMAN's compliments.

PART III

SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. PERSONNEL: HMH-462 increased its squadron strength by 10% over the previous month.
2. ADMINISTRATION: No significant events.
3. CIVIC ACTION: During the month of August 1969, HMH-462's Civic Action program included two visits to the local orphanages in the Hue-Phu Bai area. On August 23, a visit was made to the Kim Loung Orphanage in Hue. This was to enable the new civic action officer, 1/LT FAGERSTROM, to meet with the Sisters at the orphanage and to see what problems they had on hand. On August 30, several squadron personnel visited the Protestant orphanage in Phu Loung. Several items of clothing, canned juices and salt were delivered. Also, a load of scrap wood to be used for the benches in the school, was delivered.

6. HMH-462 logged 901.3 flight hours, comprising 4,038 sorties to complete 3,049 tasks. A total of 5,529.3 tons of cargo and 8,411 troops were transported. A breakdown of air operations consists of:

8. LOGISTICS: No significant events.

9. MAINTENANCE: During the month of August, HMM-462 had substantial increases in documented NOR Scheduled Maintenance, Unscheduled Maintenance, and NOR Supply time. NORS 'G' items increased to approximately 33.6 items per day.
