PART II. NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the period 1-30 September 1967, VMFA-542 conducted operations in the support of the III Marine Amphibious Force. The area of operations ranged from the southern Panhandle of North Vietnam, through the DMZ and to the southern boundaries of I Corps. This squadron flew in support of operations Kingfisher, Cumberland, Fremont, Yazoo, Ardmore, Swift, Cook, Dragon Fire, Ashau, Neutralize, Wheeler, Ashau Barrier, Ballistic Charge, Shelby and Shelbyville. The following crew members surpassed three hundred total combat missions during this month; Captain's J. P. FAULKNER, V. M. RUSSILLO and First Lieutenant P. A. GEIGER. Crew members surpassing two hundred total missions this month was Captain J. A. MARSHALL. Crew members surpassing 100 missions during this month was First Lieutenant D. B. OLSEN.

PART III. SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. Personnel. 7 Officer and 4 enlisted personnel were joined and 6 officer and 46 enlisted personnel were transferred.
2. Administrative. The following promotions were made: Private First Class to Lance Corporal - 18; Lance Corporal to Corporal - 51; Corporal to Sergeant - 36.
3. Awards.
 - A. 67 Air Medals were earned during the month of September 1967.
 - B. 18 Meritorious Masts were awarded.
4. Casualties. One squadron aircraft was lost due to enemy action while conducting a Tally Ho mission against an automatic weapons position. The pilot, Major Paul M. COLE, obtained back injuries and RIO Lt Harold J. MOE was killed.
