

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

In 1886 the Secretary of War was authorized to sell old Fort Brady and purchase a reservation for a new fort on higher ground for better protection of the Soo Locks. Assistant Quartermaster George S. Hoyt received orders in 1891 to confer with authorities in Washington about the plans and specifications for the new fort. By August of 1892 bids were opened for the erection and completion of various buildings. Hoyt's instructions were to build a full four-company post. This would include one single and three double sets of officers quarters, and one gun shed. The barracks on the hill were almost completed by November of 1892. Built for "completeness as to convenience and comfort and for beauty in appearance and finish," the neat brick buildings received high praise from many officials.

In 1944, with the deactivation of the fort, the property was given to the Michigan College of Mining and Technology by the State of Michigan. The buildings received minor alterations, and a branch of the college opened here in 1946. Officers quarters became faculty housing; students moved into the soldiers barracks; other buildings were renovated to meet their new uses.

The eighty-year-old buildings remain in good condition. The old Headquarters building was recently remodeled to house university offices and will later be used as a museum. Other buildings have recently been replaced, but the larger buildings of major importance in Fort Brady's history have remained on the college campus.

Originally the Fort Brady reservation consisted of seventy-three acres of land, with sixty-four buildings. Located in the northwestern corner of the city of Sault Ste. Marie, the Fort was the focus of attention for some fifty years. Of little military importance by the mid-twentieth century, the old reservation today is being used adequately as an educational institution and remains a landmark at the Soo.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The growth of Sault Ste. Marie and the enlargement of the Soo Locks precipitated agitation in Congress for the removal of the garrison at Fort Brady to higher ground to secure a more advantageous position for protection of the locks. Petitions were introduced by Senator Omar D. Conger of Michigan as early as 1884 from the Sault citizens recommending the sale of Old Fort Brady and the subsequent erection of a new fort elsewhere in the city.

In February of 1886 a report was forwarded to the Congressional Committee on Military Affairs from John Newton, Army Chief of Engineers. Newton advocated removal of the old fort and construction of a new installation, citing protection of the canal as the deciding factor. He also mentioned the possibility of increasing the number of personnel due to the strategic position of the Soo Locks. The Secretary of War was authorized in July of 1886 to sell Fort Brady, plat the grounds, and, following these actions, to purchase grounds for new fortifications.


The new fort was completed in the fall of 1892, and Captain J. D. Leitch received orders for removal on November 17, 1892. The inspector general of the army, after reviewing the fort in March of 1893, called it "Superior to anything I have ever seen elsewhere in the army."

Officers and men quickly settled into their new quarters, and military and social activities began with drills and balls in mid-winter. A series of informal dances enlivened the winter months, and the men of the new fort entertained friends and family at social events throughout the year.

The Chicago railway riots in 1894 brought the soldiers from Fort Brady to Illinois. Companies F & B, 104 strong, left for Chicago during the first week of July to help quell the civil disturbances. Similar riots were occurring all over the country, and troops from various military installations were called out for riot duty.

During World War II the strength of the garrison was increased as United States leaders became apprehensive about the strategic position of the Soo Locks. Although never actually threatened, the locks were protected by increased artillery and personnel for the duration of the war. Strict attention was given to the problems of security and protection of this important economic artery, through which passed a large percentage of the world's commerce. (continued)



8.2 Significance (continued)

In 1944 Fort Brady was deactivated, and the question of its disposal was relegated to the Secretary of War, who did not consider the fort to be of vital importance. The property was given to the Michigan College of Mining and Technology at Houghton, which established a branch at Fort Brady in 1946. Many buildings were renovated and altered, and serve today as housing units and office space for Lake Superior State College, the branch opened in 1946. This fine example of the adaptive use of military structures is evident upon first entering the college campus by the main gate, complete with gate house, a reminder of the days of military glory. The old quartermaster building, repainted and repaired, has become the college administration building. Brady Hall, housing 186 students, was once the largest barracks building on the Fort grounds. Other structures, formerly of military use, have been adapted to educational ends. The Fort Brady jail is now used for the Department of Speech and Drama; old mule barns have become college classrooms; and the army headquarters building houses the center for counseling and vocational testing. The former homes of Fort Brady's officers have become the residential district for the college faculty. Part of Fort Brady has disappeared--the artillery site is now covered with the buildings of married student housing and the central heating plant; large army warehouses were razed in the summer of 1971 to accommodate the construction of a new student center; and Fort Brady's parade ground has become the site of a magnificent new library, opened in January of 1971.

The erection of new Fort Brady in 1892-93 had been primarily instigated by the growing concern over protection of the Soo Locks. Following the two World Wars it was found that such protection could, in an emergency, be provided by personnel from another area or by a unit of the National Guard. Fort Brady, as a military installation, was no longer a necessity.

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
