DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Sawyer House is an excellent example of a fashionable Italian Villa Style residence. Its basic unit is square with a hipped roof topped by a glazed belvedere. The projecting overhang is supported by evenly spaced brackets with elaborate paired brackets at the corners. The main (north) facade is divided into three bays. Paired windows in each bay are framed with a flat architrave spanning both apertures. The double front door opening is similarly framed with a flat architrave. A one story veranda extends across the front of the house, supported by elaborately detailed, paired, square columns and topped with a wrought iron balustrade. The north roof eave line is broken by a half-round arch which rises above a pair of round-headed windows, while molded brick chimneys flank gabled dormers on the east and west roof planes.

An L shaped wing extends to the south of the main unit. This wing has a gabled roof with a steep pitch and the overhang is supported by simple paired brackets. The building is constructed of red brick laid in common bond with rusticated quoins. The east elevation of the main unit supports a characteristic bay window. The overall effect is one of stately elegance.

## STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Sawyer House in Monroe, Michigan is significant as an outstanding example of Italian Villa Style architecture and as the residence of a leader in the field of modern medicine.

This house was built by Dr. Alfred Issac Sawyer, one of the pioneers in the development and popularization of homeopathy. Dr. Sawyer moved to Monroe, Michigan in 1857. He established a medical practice and was active in the Masons. He attempted in 1866 to establish a chair of homeopathy in the medical department at the University of Michigan. After lobbying with the legislature and fighting with the University's trustees for ten years, he finally succeeded in creating a department of homeopathy at the University. Eventually a homeopathic hospital was added to the facilities. Homeopathy was only one of many theories of medicine being debated during the nineteenth century. By 1900, however, homeopathy had won many adherents and developed as the foundation of modern medical science. Dr. Sawyer was an American delegate to the International Homeopathic Congress in London in 1881 and was elected president of the National Institute of Homeopathy in 1889.

In addition to his medical work, Dr. Sawyer played an active role in community affairs, serving as mayor of Monroe in 1869, 1870, and 1878; he also served on the school board for nine years. Dr. Sawyer and his family originally lived in the Navarre House, a two story, five bay, log structure erected by Francois Navarre, the first white settler in Monroe County. In 1870, Dr. Sawyer demolished the Navarre House to make room for a new house he wanted to build on the site. In October, 1873 he moved his family into the beautiful Italian Villa that had been erected on the site of the earliest settlement in the county.

His daughter, Jennie Sawyer lived in the house until her death in 1948. She had, however, ten years previously, sold the house to the City of Monroe for a monthly pension on the condition that she be allowed to live in the rear apartment. The Monroe Chapter of the Red Cross utilized other portions of the house as a headquarters. The house continued to be used by the Red Cross, the Camp Fire Girls, and the Monroe County Historical Society Museum until 1973. The City of Monroe is restoring the house for use as a community facility.

Architecturally the house is significant as the finest example of the Italian Villa Style architecture in Monroe County and one of the best in Michigan.




