TESTIMONY of CLEMENT V. ROGERS in the matter of the request of WILLIAM P. ROGERS to the Commission to the Five Civilized Tribes to make a discretionary allotment and designation of homestead to himself as shown herein and on attached application form.

CLEMENT V. ROGERS, being first duly sworn by Samuel Foreman, a Notary Public in and for the Northern District of Indian Territory, testified as follows:

Q What is your name? A Clement V. Rogers.

Q What is your age? A 64 last January.

Q What is your post office address? A Claremore.

Q Are you a citizen of the Cherokee Nation? A By blood, yes, sir.

Q About whose allotment and designation of homestead do you desire to give testimony? A For my son, William P. Rogers.

Q Why does your son, William P. Rogers, not appear in person and make this application? A He is in South Africa with a show.

Q Is he familiar with this land that you are applying to the Commission to have allotted to your son? A Yes, sir, he was raised on it.

Q Did he request you to make this application for him? A Yes, sir.

Q You advise the Commission to designate and select the following described land: the SE 9.20 acres of Lot 5, and the W 20 acres of Lot 5, and the SE 10 acres of Lot 3 of Section 19; and the S 9.60 acres of Lot 9, of Section 18, Township 23 N., Range 16 E., containing 48.80 acres and valued at \$205.20, and designate as a homestead: the NE 10 acres of Lot 3, and the W 20.04 acres of Lot 3, of Section 19, Township 23 N., Range 16 E., containing 30.04 acres and valued at \$120.16, for your son, William P. Rogers, is this correct? A Yes, sir.

Q Are there any improvements on this land? A Yes, sir, all of the improvements are on the homestead, outside of the fences.

Q What do the improvements consist of? A A dwelling house, barn, granaries and out buildings.

Q How much is in cultivation? A About thirty acres on the homestead.
Q Is the cultivated land fenced? A Yes, sir.
Q Is there any cultivated land on the allotment? A Yes, sir, it is all cultivated land except about nine acres in pasture.
Q Is this land all fenced? A Yes, sir, except a strip on one side by the river.
Q To whom do these improvements belong? A Belong to me.
Q Your son has your permission to select this land as an allotment which includes your improvements? A Yes, sir.
Q Are there any churches, scholl houses or burial grounds on this land? A There is a family burial ground.
Q Well, it is not public grave yard, is it? A No, sir.
Q Is that portion of the land which you have designated as a homestead for your son, William P. Rogers, suitable for a home for him?
A O, yes, it is a good home.
Q You make this application in good faith in all respects? A Yes, sir.

BY THE COMMISSION:

From an examination of the records of the Commission, it is shown that the land applied for and as an allotment for William P. Rogers, consists of 29.20 acres of land classified as 3(b) and valued at \$5.00 per acre, and 9.60 acres of land classified as 7(b) and valued at \$2.00 per acre.

The improvement plats made under the direction of this Commission show that the land is all in cultivation, and that the improvements belong to C. V. Rogers.

The homestead consists of 30.04 acres of land classified as 4(b) and valued at \$4.00 per acres, and the improvement plats show that it is all in cultivation and that it belongs to C. V. Rogers.

S. A., with power of substitution to be my true and lawful attorney and agent for me and in my name, place and stead, in due and customary form to receive for me and in my name a certain allotment of land in the Cherokee Nation, U. S. A., whereby the parties interested therein can receive a defined portion as his separate and exclusive property and on my behalf to sign, execute and make all documents and deeds necessary for that purpose.

And generally for effecting the purposes aforesaid, to do whatsoever may be requisite and necessary, as fully, amply and effectually, to all intents and purposes as I might or could do if personally present and acting therein; - hereby ratifying, allowing and confirming, and promising and agreeing to ratify, allow and confirm all and whatsoever my said attorney and agent shall lawfully do or cause to be done by virtue of these presents.

It is reported that you are holding in possession more land in the Cherokee Nation than you are entitled to hold or possess under the provisions of the Cherokee Agreement approved July 1, 1902, and as such practice retards the allotment of the lands of the Cherokee Nation, you are hereby notified and required to appear at the Cherokee Land Office of this Commission, at Tahlequah, Indian Territory, during the official hours of the Commission, within thirty days from July 18, 1903, and select allotments and designate homesteads for yourself and family, in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the Commission; or, in default of your compliance with this notice, the Commission will proceed to select allotments and designate homesteads for you and your family under the authority granted to it in Section 16 of the Cherokee Agreement before referred to.

You are desired upon your appearance at the Land Office, to present this letter; and upon making yourself known for the purpose required by this notice, you will be permitted to apply promptly and out of the regular order of holders of tickets of admission.
